

HUNGER & THIRST (Pt. 4) Week 22 | October 28, 2024

Humanity's **prideful pursuit** of *power* has led to so much <u>horror and devastation</u> throughout history. From the **fall of man** in Genesis to the *conquests of world powers* over the centuries, we have always sought after greater degrees of <u>influence and control</u>. Yes, we were **created to rule**—to *govern over creation* as <u>stewards of our Creator</u>. Somewhere along the way, though, we lost sight of where our **true power** is derived from. Instead of pursuing the *Source of strength*, we began to seek after <u>strength itself</u>. Instead of striving for oneness with **the Maker**, we have sought to produce power of *our own making*. (Genesis 1:28; Acts 1:8)

Believe it or not, even the desire for power and influence **is not wicked** in and of itself. God is *powerful*, in fact He is <u>power itself</u>. Our longing for this attribute is really just **a reflection** of our *heart's cry for Christ*. Like every other desire, though, this one too <u>has been corrupted</u>. As we pray this week for the **people**, **churches**, and **communities** we are blessed to be a part of, ask God to give us a *pure and undefiled* hunger and thirst for <u>His power</u> that gives us:

1. Strength in Our WEAKNESS (Isaiah 40:29)

- a. **NOTE:** A Christian's **true power** is found in *our weakest moments*. In the times that we are <u>utterly broken</u> and **helpless**, when we've finally *hit our knees* out of <u>desperation</u>, that is when **the glory of God** is most purely *revealed* and *experienced*. He created us for <u>dependence on Him</u>, for a life built on the strength of **our relationship** and characterized by *His strength* flowing <u>through us</u>. Pray, then, that in our weakness we would **seek Him**, for *disaster strikes* when we look *anywhere else*. (Isaiah 31:1)
 - i. For Ex. "Lord God, I thank You for Your strength. Thank You for being so wonderfully *perfect* and *powerful*. I thank You also for <u>our weakness</u> and for how You continually work **on**, **in**, and **through** the *frail vessels* we are. In our <u>failures</u> and <u>shortfalls</u>, Lord, I ask that You **draw us to Yourself** and please *cut away* and completely destroy everything else that we **depend on** besides You."
 - REMEMBER: Hidden weaknesses help no one. Acknowledge and embrace your shortcomings so that He might overcome them! (2 Corinthians 12:9-10)

2. Protection in The STORMS (Psalm 91:1-2)

a. NOTE: Since the time of Noah, the storms of life have often been catalysts that cause people to seek God's powerful protection. The Lord is sovereign, having absolute power and control over the entire universe. It is entirely within His means to quiet the winds and still the waves of any situation that we face. It is also often within His perfect will to choose not to, and instead to bless those who rest in Him with peace amidst the chaos. Ask God to use the turbulent times we often face to draw us to Himself, pulling us under His mighty covering that we might find rest and refuge. (Matthew 8:24-27)

- i. For Ex. "Father God, You are King of kings and Lord of lords and are completely sovereign over all creation and created beings. Thank You for the privilege of serving such a great and awesome God and for the honor of being called Your child. I ask today, God, that You would give us a longing to take shelter in Your shade that You might serve as our shield from all the rains of this life. May we rest in You, Lord, abiding in You as You abide in us and when we drift from You or wander from Your presence, send the storms. Deliver the painful downpours that push us to You, for that is where true power and deliverance is found."
 - 1. **REMEMBER:** Instead of *questioning why* the rain is falling, **seek shelter** in the One whom it obeys. (Psalm 107:28-30)

3. Victory in His **BATTLES** (1 Samuel 17:45-47)

- a. **NOTE:** The power of God is not merely *defensive*. In fact, God's **true might** is best displayed through <u>forward movement</u>. Christ is not simply seeking **to maintain** the territory already won, but instead His aim is *to advance* the Kingdom of God by <u>forcefully taking</u> the ground previously belonging to **the Enemy**. We live in a *world at war*, and battles rage <u>all around us</u>. Too often though, even when we realize we are under attack, we end up **foolishly** attempting to fight back *on our own*. In prayer this week, ask God to <u>pull us</u> to Himself **through the attacks** we face so that we might *partner* in, *experience* fully, and *live* out <u>His victory!</u> (Matthew 11:12; Proverbs 21:31)
 - i. For Ex. "Dear Lord, thank You for fighting our battles with us and for us. Thank You for the overwhelming victory that is Yours and that You have given to us as Your children. Remind us, God, that every conflict we face is already within Your hands and train us to seek You as the blows begin to fly. In You alone lies our victory, Lord. Pull us to Yourself so that we might live in it this day. I lift up to You also, Father, those who are still fighting on the losing side. May they come to You and receive eternal victory through their surrender."
 - 1. **REMEMBER:** Fighting spiritual opponents *apart from God* is a sure way to end up **beaten**, **broken**, and **bare**. (Acts 19:13-16)

Questions for Reflection:

- What weakness have you been hiding, ignoring, or excusing?
 - Confession invites healing and allows for <u>redemption</u>. Turn to God in your failing so that He can reveal His power through your <u>frailty</u>.
- Have your "why's" kept you from the "who" that truly matters?
 - Stop standing angrily <u>in the rain</u>, shaking your fist at God. Instead, come *under His wing* and embrace His **love** and **comfort**.
- Have you been **knocked down** because you *pridefully* tried to win on your own?
 - Remember who the battle **belongs to** and stop trying to take it on *by yourself*. When you are by God's side <u>every giant</u> will fall.
