

PEACE on EARTH Week 30 | December 23, 2024

It's no coincidence that the day we celebrate the arrival of the **prince of peace** has become one of the most *anxiety-filled* and *stress-inducing* times of the year. It's no wonder, either, that <u>the world</u> sees a spike in levels of **depression**, domestic **disputes**, and mental **breakdowns** during this season. This time in which the angels first heralded "*peace on earth*" has been under intense attack by the enemy <u>from day one</u>. Satan and his forces seek to **steal**, **kill**, and **destroy** our *peace* by <u>any means</u> necessary, for they know **how powerful** this *gift from God* truly is. (Isaiah 9:6; Luke 2:14; Rev. 12:3-4)

As we fight this week for our families, churches, and communities we must <u>pray specifically</u> for the **protection** and **enhancement** of peace. The key to seeing this happen comes from *resting in God*, for with Him as <u>our center</u> nothing can shake us. (<u>Matthew 11:28-30</u>; <u>John 15:5</u>; <u>Luke 6:48</u>) When we find **our foundation** in Him, our peace will be *strengthened* as we obtain His:

1. PRIORITIES (Matthew 6:33-34)

- a. **NOTE:** It's truly amazing how having **Godly priorities** can *simplify life* and <u>eliminate</u> much of the **stress** and **anxiety** that *the enemy* seeks to <u>lay on us</u>. The opposite effect can also be seen. When we have **worldly priorities** our worries seem *to compound* and double. Life gets <u>hectic</u> and <u>out of control</u> easily and what's **most important** often gets sacrificed for what's *more urgent*. God's priorities also <u>provide clarity</u> and allow for the setting of **biblical boundaries** with others, to *protect our hearts* and to <u>allow for love</u> to be expressed. (Psalm 119:37; Luke 10:38-42)
 - i. For Ex. "Father God, thank You for the gift of peace, for sending Your son as a means to <u>purchase and secure</u> it for sinners like us. In order to <u>protect</u> and <u>strengthen</u> this <u>peace in our hearts</u>, give us this day <u>Your priorities</u>. Break our hearts over what <u>breaks Yours</u>. Enrage our spirits over what <u>enrages Yours</u>. Captivate our minds over what <u>captivates Yours</u>. Might we love <u>what You love</u> and hate <u>what You hate</u>, caring most about that which is <u>important to You</u>."
 - REMEMBER: Proper priorities come from having and living out of the heart of God. (Ezekiel 36:26-27)

2. PERSPECTIVE (Matthew 6:22; Isaiah 26:3)

a. **NOTE:** It's incredible the difference that a **bird's eye view** can make in a situation. Oftentimes *our perspective* is the <u>deciding factor</u> in how we **react** and **respond** to different circumstances. Seeing things from *heaven's vantage point*, from <u>God's point of view</u> that is, **allows** and **enables** us to respond according to *His will and way*, acting out of true and <u>genuine love</u>. When instead we **limit ourselves** to our *frame of reference*, we are cultivating an <u>attitude of selfishness</u> that will quickly **rob us** and others of the *precious peace* we have been gifted. (2 Corinth. 4:18; Col. 3:1-2,12; 2 Corinth. 5:16)

- i. For Ex. "Lord Jesus, our *Prince of Peace*, thank You for Your <u>perfect perspective</u>. You alone can see things from **every angle** and point of view, for You alone know the *past*, *present*, and *future* and can see into the <u>hearts and minds</u> of all. Help us as Your followers to see things in the **light of eternity**, glimpsing our life from *Your vantage point*. Cut away our <u>selfish perspective</u>, and enable us to see **ourselves** and **others** as You do through a lens of *love*, *truth*, and *peace*."
 - REMEMBER: A heavenly perspective comes from having and seeing from the mind of God. (1 Corinthians 2:16)

3. PATIENCE (Romans 15:5)

- a. **NOTE:** God has shown us all **tremendous patience** throughout our lives. His willingness to wait and endure in <u>love and kindness</u> is remarkable when you consider how **stubborn** and **foolish** we can be as humans. This same attitude serves to *protect* and *preserve* our peace in <u>times of stress</u>. The ability to **wait on others** as God has waited on us reveals *our gratitude* for <u>the mercy</u> He has poured out and our willingness to trust in **God's timing** even when it conflicts with *our agenda* reveals <u>our faith</u> in His **goodness**. *Impatience*, on the other hand, is a <u>fruit of</u> and <u>fuel for</u> our **pride** and is a surefire way to kill any *semblance of peace* in our life. (Ephesians 4:2; 2 Peter 3:15)
 - i. For Ex. "Holy Spirit, thank You for Your overwhelming kindness and patience with us over the years. Thank You also for all of the fruit that comes from Your indwelling presence. Fill us today with Your peace and with the patience that protects it. Remind us of how You have waited on us, giving us an attitude of gratitude and faith in Your timing. Kill all of our arrogant impatience, blessing us instead with the humility it takes to wait on You and others."
 - REMEMBER: Perfect patience comes from having and expressing the love of God. (1 Corinthians 13:4)

Questions for Reflection:

- How much of your **worry** and **stress** comes from *misaligned priorities*?
 - Ask God to show you what matters most to Him, then reorient yourself accordingly.
- From whose perspective have you been seeing things from?
 - o God's vision is *perfect* while yours is *partial*. Turn to Him to see the full picture.
- Has your **prideful impatience** robbed you of peace?
 - When tempted to *lose your tempter*, pause to remember all <u>God has done</u> for you.
 Thank Him and then show that same kindness to others.

Special Note: The peace of God is *only available* to those who have <u>peace with God</u>. Our first prayer for the lost is always for **their salvation**, even if that comes from a *season of distress*.
