

# THE BREASTPLATE OF RIGHTEOUSNESS

Week 53 | June 3, 2025

"Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the **breastplate of righteousness** in place..."

### **Ephesians 6:14**

I find it **too fitting** to be *coincidence* that the piece of armor <u>guarding our hearts</u> is that of **righteousness**. Defined as possessing a *goodness of character* and a <u>right standing</u> with God, righteousness is what **many seek** but few truly find (<u>Matthew 7:14</u>). *Impossible* by our <u>own efforts</u>, only **by grace** through *faith in Christ* can we hope to receive <u>the free gift</u> that is **justification** with God and *a new heart* which mirrors His own (<u>Isaiah 64:6</u>; <u>Ephesians 2:8-9</u>; <u>Ezekiel 36:26</u>).

But even <u>a gift received</u> is only beneficial when **opened**, **used**, and subsequently **protected**. The Enemy knows this and seeks to *deceive* and *distort* the now <u>righteous hearts</u> of God's people through various schemes of **condemnation**, **conceit**, and **corruption**. We are *not defenseless* though. God has given us His very own <u>body armor</u> to serve as **our covering** from the *attacks of Satan*. This week, let us pray for the <u>righteousness of God</u> to shield us from every assault, asking specifically that He would help us to **access**, **live in**, and **protect** this *amazing gift* by:

### 1. REMINDING Us (2 Corinthians 5:21)

- a. **NOTE:** The Enemy is described as the "accuser of the brethren" and is often seen throughout scripture aiming to **attack** and **condemn** God's children. These attacks can be <u>especially potent</u> when we fail to live up to **God's standards** and fall *flat on our face* again and again. In times like these we need <u>a holy reminder</u> from heaven, speaking **God's truth** about *who we are* in Him into our <u>hearts and minds</u>, drowning out the voice of **accusation** coming from the Enemy. (Rev. 12:10; Rom. 3:22; 1 Cor. 1:30; Eph. 2:19)
  - i. For Ex. "Lord God, thank You for all of the work You did in order to secure us in the *righteousness of Christ*. Thank You for making us whole and holy by the blood of Jesus. It can be so easy to forget, though, when we *fail and fall short* of who we are meant to be. Remind us, Father, in that moment, who You say we are. Remind us, Lord, of our *adoption*, *perfection*, and *permanent right standing* before Your eyes. Silence the lies of the Enemy, open our ears to Your truth."
    - REMEMBER: You will stumble, you will fall. But you don't have to stay down any longer! (<u>Proverbs 25:16</u>)

### 2. HUMBLING Us (<u>James 4:6</u>)

a. **NOTE:** When the Enemy fails to **discourage us** through *accusations*, He will often turn to <u>subtler tactics</u>. Backing off of the **frontal assaults**, he instead seeks to sow *seeds of arrogance* in our <u>hearts and minds</u>, shrewdly planting the notion that some small part of our goodness or righteousness is of **our own doing**. This *toehold of pride* quickly becomes a <u>mountainous obstacle</u> to receiving the **grace of God** that is <u>the very key</u> to the righteousness we seek! (<u>Prov. 29:23; Philip. 3:9; Gal. 2:16; 1 Pet. 5:5</u>)

- i. For Ex. "Father God, You are the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end of all things, including my life. This is all about You, and not about me. Thank You for granting to us a righteousness that is based entirely on what You've done, that none may boast. Remind us of this fact, Lord, when the temptation to pride arises. Expose our entitlement, reveal our arrogance, uncover our conceit. Humble us, Father, so that we might continue to receive Your grace and live out the righteousness You have instilled within us."
  - 1. **REMEMBER:** We all *may stumble*, but the **prideful** have a <u>much further</u> fall and a *much harder* landing than **the humble**. (<u>Proverbs 16:18</u>)

## 3. CLEANSING Us (<u>1 John 1:9</u>)

- a. NOTE: Though we have been **made righteous** and given a new *heart* and *life*, we don't always <u>act rightly</u>. Why is that? In part it is based on a **corruption** of our *God-given desires*, which we all have at <u>the core</u> of who we are. God **gave us** the desire for *food, drink, sex, companionship,* and *intimacy*; these are <u>not wrong or evil</u> in and of themselves. The Enemy, however, has sought to **twist**, **pervert**, and **distort** these desires in order to bring about *death* and *destruction* in our lives. These <u>corrupted cravings</u> inside of us are what is commonly known as "**The Flesh**" and it must be *cleansed* and *crucified* in order for the <u>righteousness of Christ</u> to be **protected**, **nurtured**, and **fruitful** in our lives. (<u>Gen. 1:27</u>; <u>John 10:10</u>; <u>Gal. 5:24</u>; <u>Psalm 51:10</u>)
  - i. For Ex. "Lord Jesus, thank You for making us in Your own image, for placing within us desires that *mirror Your own*. Thank You also for coming to Earth and dying on the cross in order to mend that which <u>had been broken</u>, offering us healing and restoration, *holiness* and *righteousness*. Send Your Spirit now to search us and examine our hearts, *cleansing them* of all unrighteousness by the power of <u>Your blood</u>. Purify our every motive, thought, and action Lord, so that we might *live out* the <u>undefiled righteousness</u> You have placed within us."
    - 1. **REMEMBER:** All of *our desires* find their <u>true fulfillment</u> in and **through Christ**. (<u>Ephesians 1:23</u>; <u>Colossians 2:10</u>)

#### **Questions for Reflection:**

- Have you ever fallen and forgotten who God says you are?
  - Pick up <u>His word</u>, He wrote it to **remind you** of *the truth* even when you're <u>surrounded by lies</u>.
- Do you take pride in being a good person? Find personal satisfaction in the good that you do?
  - There's nothing wrong with feeling good about doing good, but be on guard. There's no faster way to fall farther than attempting to steal God's glory for what He's done.
- What God-given desire of your heart has been twisted or corrupted?
  - Seek its fulfillment in God alone, and let Him cleanse it of every evil influence.
