

THE SHOES OF PEACE

Week 54 | June 10, 2025

"For shoes, put on the **peace** that comes from the Good News so that you will be fully prepared."

Ephesians 6:15

For any **soldier** to be *truly effective* they must do battle from <u>a firm foundation</u>. The landscape of our warfare might shift and **change daily**, but we can *remain steadfast* with the <u>proper footwear</u>. The **solid rock** of God's *Good News* serves as our <u>sure footing</u> and in it we find **a gift** that surpasses *all understanding* (<u>Philippians 4:7</u>).

The Gospel offers us a **peace** unlike anything this world has *ever known*. It is one of the <u>many gifts</u> that Christ left with His followers and is one of the most powerful **fruits** of *the Spirit's work* in our lives (<u>John 14:27</u>; <u>Galatians 5:22</u>). It is also a form of <u>protection</u>, used by God to guard our **hearts** and **minds** and serving as another *fundamental piece* to our daily armament. Like <u>any gift</u>, though, the peace of God must be **opened**. Like every *piece of armor*, it must be <u>put on</u>. In order to do so, to "**live in Christ**" as Philippians 4 describes it, requires that we:

1. TRUST (<u>Isaiah 26:3</u>)

- a. **NOTE:** The Enemy does everything in their power to **derail** our faith, seeking to *distract* or *discourage* us whenever our prayers <u>seem unanswered</u>. Many times this is because when we pray for **peace** we expect things to settle down *outwardly*, but that's often not the case. Instead, <u>the peace of God</u> offers us a **calm** in the midst of *chaos*, **serenity** in the midst of *storms*, and **confidence** in the midst of *uncertainty*. All of this comes as we <u>choose to trust</u> in God **regardless** of our *circumstances*, placing <u>all of our faith</u> in **who He is** in spite of what we might be *seeing*, *hearing*, or *feeling*. (Rom. 15:13; Mark 4:38)
 - i. For Ex. "Lord God, thank You for granting us perfect peace as we trust in You, as our thoughts are fixed on You. Be with us today, Lord, as the chaos rages all around, and remind us to choose. Remind us to choose to trust You, to exercise our will and place our faith in You no matter what we might feel, hear, or see. Silence all the voices of doubt and unbelief, strengthening instead our confident assurance in Your character, nature, and promises."
 - 1. **REMEMBER:** Faith fades when **our focus** falters. (Matthew 14:30)

2. SUBMIT (<u>Isaiah 48:18</u>)

a. NOTE: Satan is a rebel at heart, *unable* and *unwilling* to <u>submit himself</u> to Christ's authority. Likewise, **our flesh** is *incapable of obedience* to God's ways, constantly striving to fulfill its own <u>twisted desires</u> at the expense of all else. Here lies the problem: you cannot have the **peace of God** until you have *peace with God*. Only under <u>Christ's lordship</u>, living in **obedience** to His will, does the peace that we crave become *a reality*. Like the furthest reaches of <u>the ocean's depths</u>, which are <u>unbothered</u> by the *storms* at the surface, once <u>the war within</u> has been settled the conflicts that <u>rage externally</u> can do little to <u>disrupt the peace</u> at our center. (Rev. 12:1-9; Rom. 8:7; Col. 3:15)

- i. For Ex. "Lord Jesus, thank You for offering us 'peace like a river' in all situations and in every season. Thank You for coming to win and claim victory over sin, death, and the Evil One; for setting us free from our wicked nature and granting us citizenship in Your kingdom. Please destroy every toehold, foothold, and stronghold of sin and rebellion planted by the Enemy and nurtured by our flesh, giving us instead the desire, power, strength, and humility to submit to Your will and way, acting in obedience to all You have called us to do so that we might experience the peace that comes as a result."
 - 1. **REMEMBER:** Peace and **rebellion** cannot coexist. (2 Kings 9:22)

3. COMMUNICATE (Philippians 4:6-7)

- a. NOTE: The ability to **talk to** and **hear from** our *God in heaven* is one of the greatest and yet <u>most underutilized</u> abilities that Christians have at our disposal. **God's word** is the *ultimate source* of our <u>firm foundation</u> and the practice of making our **requests**, **receiving** His response, and **responding** in turn to God our Father is essential to *lasting peace* in the <u>midst of storms</u>. It's no wonder then that the Enemy constantly strives to **interfere** with or **interrupt** this conversation, for they know that *one word* from above can quiet the <u>raging sea</u> within. (<u>Psalm 119:165</u>; <u>Matthew 7:24</u>; <u>Mark 4:39</u>)
 - i. For Ex. "Father God, thank You for the ability and opportunity You have given us to talk to and hear from You. Thank You for seeking out conversation with us, for continuing to speak even when we're too stubborn to listen and remaining available even when we neglect to reach out. Remind us today, Lord, to come to You with every burden, humbly laying them at Your feet in prayer and listening for Your response. Compel us, Father, to remain in constant communication with You so that the voice of the Enemy has no room to maneuver."
 - 1. **REMEMBER:** *Talking with God* often involves **quietness**. (<u>Job 40:4-5</u>)

Questions for Reflection:

- When **storms hit**, where do you *turn*? If there's a lull in the rain, what do you **run back to**?
 - Check your gaze, oftentimes our lack of peace comes from a faulty focus.
- What area of your life is not **completely** under *Christ's control*?
 - Peace comes on <u>the other side</u> of <u>victory</u>. Partner with God to <u>defeat your desires</u> and <u>submit</u> every aspect of your being unto Him.
- Do you struggle to **slow down**, be still, and <u>practice silence</u> before God?
 - It's not easy, it will be inconvenient and awkward. But God's most intimate counsel is
 often reserved for those times of quiet solitude with Him.
