

THOSE WHO WANDER Week 36 | February 3, 2025

The Enemy loves to attack **veterans** of the faith, seeking to cause those who *walk closely* with the Lord and <u>lead others</u> in doing so to **stumble** and **fall**, for he knows the havoc this can wreak among the flock. Even more so, though, he aspires to take out *new believers* while they are still young and <u>ill-equipped</u> for the **spiritual warfare** that quickly comes their way, seeking to *cut short their growth* before they <u>fully realize</u> how to **access the power** that now *resides within*. Likewise, our Enemy also revels in attacking those <u>going through</u> or **coming out of trauma**, for much like the young believer they are <u>most vulnerable</u> to his **schemes** and *susceptible* to his <u>deception</u>. (<u>Luke 8:4-15</u>)

It is both **heartbreaking** and **infuriating** to witness these assaults, for they are much like that of *a predator* who targets the <u>weakest</u> and <u>most vulnerable</u> of the herd. Satan and his forces show **no mercy** in their hunt, though, and many are *led astray* before <u>fully developing</u> into **the warriors** they were meant to be. With so many having *wandered off course* as a result of these <u>cowardly ambushes</u> it can be easy to **grow discouraged**. We are not *without hope*, however, for we serve a God who <u>fights ferociously</u> for the **runaway child** and who *chases down* the <u>wayward sheep!</u> Let us join Him in this **battle** and **pursuit** today, *waging war* <u>in the Spirit</u> against all who would seek to **distract** and **divide** God's children from their *loving Father*, asking Him to:

1. Deepen the ROOTS. (Luke 8:13)

- a. **NOTE:** The leading cause of drift among Christians is a **lack of depth**. While their *zeal* and *passion for development* is <u>admirable</u> and to be <u>desired</u>, those who attempt to **grow higher** without first *going deeper* are quickly <u>blown apart</u> when the **storms of life** come through. We live in a culture that prioritizes *speedy and rapid* results, but what we <u>truly need</u> now is men and women of God with **deep** and **firmly established** foundations *built on the word of God*. Let us ask the Lord to give His children a <u>desire to grow</u> in ways that may not be **obvious** or **flashy**, but which *lay the groundwork* for <u>long-term **faithfulness** and **fruitfulness**. (Colossians 2:7; Ephesians 3:17; Prov. 12:3)</u>
 - i. For Ex. "Lord God, thank You for planting Your seeds of truth into our hearts. Thank You for speaking to us, revealing Yourself powerfully and personally through Your word. Please continue to water and nurture the seeds that were planted so their roots might grow deep into our being, that we might produce much fruit in the days to come and not be shaken by the storms of life. Give Your children a longing to deepen their relationship with You and the discipline to invest the time required to know You more intimately."
 - 1. **REMEMBER:** Depth is often **invisible** from *the surface*, but <u>its results</u> are **undeniable** in the end. (Jeremiah 17:7-8)

2. Strengthen the <u>FELLOWSHIP</u>. (Ecclesiastes 4:12)

- a. NOTE: We are weakest when isolated and strongest when united. The Enemy knows this and works tirelessly to separate God's children from one another, intentionally attacking those relationships in our lives that have been most influential in pointing us to the Father. As we fight for those prone to wandering, we must pray specifically for the reinforcement of the bonds of fellowship with other believers who are committed to love and truth, for that is where great power is found. (Matthew 18:20; Hebrews 10:25)
 - i. For Ex. "Father God, thank You for the spiritual family You have blessed us with. Thank You for those in our lives that You have sent to speak Your truth in love and point us to Yourself. Protect these relationships of Your children, strengthening the bonds of those who bring life and destroying that of those who bring death. Make the attacks of the Enemy on these relationships so obvious and apparent that they gain no ground, and unite Your people in love and truth."
 - 1. **REMEMBER: Oneness with God** leads to *unity with others*. (John 17:21)

3. Send out the SHEEPDOGS. (Isaiah 62:6)

a. NOTE: The wolves may be vicious, but we are not defenseless. God has placed in our lives men and women of strong spiritual stature who have humbled themselves in prayer for our sakes for years without our knowledge or asking. As the battle grows fiercer and the end draws near, our need for prayer warriors grows even more evident. We need God to raise up additional soldiers to fight the good fight on their knees for those unable or ill-equipped to do so themselves. We all have a warrior living within us, His name is Jesus and by His strength we will surely see the victory.

(Matthew 9:37-38; 1 Timothy 6:12; Ephesians 6:10&18; 1 John 5:4)

- i. For Ex. "Jesus, thank You for serving as our Good Shepherd, for leading, guiding, and protecting us each and every day. Thank You also for the men and women of God, the sheepdogs and watchmen, that You have raised up in prayer and intercession for us over the years. We need more though, Father, for the fighting is fierce and we have lost ground. Raise up within us and others a warrior Spirit of prayer that compels us to hit our knees in battle, warring for weary, wounded, and wayward people of this world."
 - REMEMBER: The potency of our prayer is not found in our amount of faith or our tenure as a Christian. Instead, its power is found in the object of our faith and our willingness to exercise it through trust. (Mark 11:22-23)

Questions for Reflection:

- Is your priority to grow in **superficial maturity** or in *lasting depth*?
 - Focus on deepening your <u>relationship with God</u>, everything else **will follow**.
- What **relationship** have you allowed the Enemy to gain a toehold, foothold, or stronghold in?
 - Pray for the <u>revival</u>, <u>restoration</u>, and <u>recovery</u> of all **ground that was lost** and fight to protect those relationships that push you <u>towards God</u>.
- Do you ever feel **unqualified** or **unprepared** to *fight for others* in prayer?
 - Remember that God often <u>calls the unqualified</u>, but He always **qualifies the called**. He
 is the one that gives You the *desire and power* to do that which <u>pleases Him</u>.
