

CHURCH OF WITH NAZARENE

"The South Carolina District exists to facilitate the making of Christlike disciples in the nations by developing missional pastors, strengthening existing churches, and starting new churches."



Dr. T. Scott Daniels was elected general superintendent in the Church of the Nazarene at the 30th General Assembly held in Indianapolis, Indiana, USA, in June 2023. At the time of his election, he was serving as senior pastor at Nampa College Church of the Nazarene in Nampa, Idaho.

Born in Detroit, Michigan, USA, Scott was ordained in 1992 by Dr. Raymond Hurn. After being an associate pastor in Washington, California, and Oklahoma, he served as senior pastor for three Churches of the Nazarene: Richardson (Richardson, Texas), Pasadena First (Pasadena, California), and Nampa College. Scott also served on theology faculties at Southern Nazarene and Northwest Nazarene Universities and served as the Dean of the School of Theology and Seminary at Azusa Pacific University.

Dr. Daniels received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Northwest Nazarene University in 1988 and a Master of Divinity degree from Fuller Theological Seminary in 1992. He earned a PhD in Theology and Ethics from Fuller

Theological Seminary in 2000.
Scott's ministry has bridged the gap between the church and the academy, often teaching and pastoring simultaneously. In addition to his faculty positions at SNU, NNU, and APU, Scott has taught for Nazarene Theological Séminary, Trevecca Nazaréne University, Africa Nazarene University, and Fuller Theological Seminary. This background proved useful during his lengthy service on the Nazarene Publishing Board and as a long-term member and chair of the Covenant of Christian Conduct Committee. He served as the chair of the Christian Action Committee at four General Assemblies.

Dr. Daniels has published numerous articles and book chapters, and delivered several academic papers and presentations. He has authored six books including Embracing Exile: Living Faithfully as God's Unique People in the World; The First 100 Days: A Pastor's Guide; and Seven Deadly Spirits: The Message of Revelation's Letters for Today's Church. His preaching is widely respected throughout the church, making him a sought-after speaker and frequent homiletics teacher and advisor. He has created and maintained a successful podcast -New Creation Conversations - building bridges between the local church and the Christian academy. Dr. Daniels and his wife, Debbie, live in Nampa, Idaho. They have four adult children (Caleb, Noah, Jonah, and Sophia) and three daughters-in-law.

El Dr. T. Scott Daniels fue elegido superintendente general de la Iglesia del Nazareno en la 30.ª Asamblea General celebrada en Indianápolis, Indiana, EE. UU., en junio de 2023. En el momento de su elección, servía como pastor titular en Nampa College Church of the Nazarene en Nampa, Idaho. Nacido en Detroit, Michigan, EE. UU., Scott fue ordenado en 1992 por el Dr. Raymond Hurn. Después de ser pastor asociado en Washington, California y Oklahoma, fue pastor titular de tres Iglesias del Nazareno: Richardson (Richardson, Texas), Pasadena First (Pasadena, California) y Nampa College. Scott también formó parte del cuerpo docente de teología de Southern Nazarene University (SNU) y Northwest Nazarene University (NNU) y fue decano de la facultad de Teología y Ministerio de Azusa Pacific University

El Dr. Daniels obtuvo una licenciatura en Teología en Northwest Nazarene University en 1988 y obtuvo una maestría en Divinidad en Fuller Theological Seminary en 1992. El sacó un doctorado en Teología y Ética en Fuller

Theological Seminary en 2000. El ministerio de Scott ha tendido un puente entre la iglesia y la docencia, a menudo enseñando y pastoreando simultáneamente. Además de sus puestos docentes en SNU, NNU y APU, Scott ha enseñado en el Nazarene Theological Seminary, Trevecca Nazarene University, Africa Nazarene University y Fuller Theological Seminary. Este trasfondo académico probó ser útil durante su largo servicio en la junta directiva de Publicaciones Nazarenas y por varios años, como miembro y presidente del Comité del Pacto de Conducta Cristiana. Él sirvió como el presidente del Comité de Acción Cristiana en cuatro

Asambleas Generales. El Dr. Daniels ha publicado numerosos artículos y capítulos de libros, y ha publicado varios discursos y ponencias académicas. Es autor de seis libros, entre ellos Embracing Exile: Living Faithfully as God's Unique People in the World (Abrazando el exilio: vivir fielmente como el único pueblo de Dios en el mundo); The First 100 Days: A Pastor's Guide (Los 100 primeros días: guía del pastor); y Seven Deadly Spirits: The Message of Revelation's Letters for Today's Church (Siete espíritus mortales: El mensaje de las cartas del Apocalipsis para la Iglesia actual). Sus prédicas son muy respetadas en toda la Iglesia, lo que le convierte en un conferencista muy solicitado y un profesor y asesor frecuente de homilética. Ha creado y mantiene un exitoso podcast -Néw Creation Conversations (Conversaciones sobre la nueva creación)- que extiende puentes entre la iglesia local y la educación cristiana. El Dr. Daniels y su esposa, Debbie, viven en Nampa, Idaho. Tienen cuatro hijos

adultos (Caleb, Noah, Jonah y Sophia) y tres nueras.

Rev. Samuel Flores was elected District Superintendent of the South Carolina District in July 2018. Prior to that he served as Assistant District Superintendent for the South Texas District, District Missionary (where he was responsible for the coordination of New Church Development and the Multicultural Ministries), and pastoral assignments in Austin Grace, Austin First, San Antonio Central, Houston Southwest and New Vision Community. Sam was influential in the development of 70 new churches in South Texas.

Sam has also served as a Board of Trustees member of Southern Nazarene University and currently at Trevecca Nazarene University.

Sam also currently serves the denominational church as a New Church Task Force member, Director of Assessments for New Church Pastors, and has been a workshop presenter at the PALCON, Mid quadrennial conferences, as well as General Assembly.

Sam and Candy have four daughters, a son in law, two granddaughters and two grandsons. They enjoy spending time with family and love to travel and go sightseeing.

DISTRICT ADVISORY BOARD REPORT

The District Advisory Board of the South Carolina District Church of the Nazarene met in regular meetings throughout the 2024-2025 fiscal year. Jeremy Reese, Assistant District Superintendent; monthly financial summaries and treasurer's reports for the SC District and the Gunter Camp & Conference Center from Jessica Rojas, District Finance Officer; and regular reports from Candy Flores, the Gunter Camp & Conference Center Manager.

INSTRUCTION TO STUDENTS

For comprehensive information to guide you through the Course of Study, please refer to the Guide for Ministerial Preparation & Ordination.

ELIGIBILITY

The District Studies Board serves only the persons who are properly enrolled. Consult *Manual* Paragraphs 521-521.7 – "Education of Clergy."

COURSES

There are four general courses administered by the District Studies Board: Ministerial leading to Elder; Christian Education, Compassionate Ministries and Music Ministries leading to Deacon. These may not be ordained without having completed their respective course of study.

Annual renewal of the Commission as a Minister of Music is subject either to having completed the course in the Deacon Track or showing evidence of pursuing it.

MODES OF STUDY

The recommended mode of preparation for full-time Christian service is by attending a Nazarene liberal arts college or Nazarene Bible College and, if possible, the Nazarene Theological Seminary. Other modes are the Ministerial Preparation Program at Nazarene Bible College and Northwest Nazarene University. The Modular Course of Study is under the immediate supervision of the SC District Studies Board. ENTE Online is an available online Spanish Language program.

General curriculum areas for ministerial preparation are in *Manual* Section 521.3. Modular courses are in the Guide to Ministerial Development & Ordination.

STUDY REGULATIONS

- 1. Each student is instructed to download the Guide to Ministerial Development & Ordination in order to become familiar with the details of the entire program.
- 2. All course work and transcripts must be submitted and credited by June 30 in order to apply to current assembly year. Work filed thereafter will be applied to the following year. Course work must be submitted annually prior to the Board of Ministry interview.
- 3. Approval for consideration for a course may be requested at any time prior to taking the course by contacting the Studies Director.
- 4. Lifelong Learning classes are permitted aids to study, but not a means of courses.
- 5. Candidates should be prepared to appear for an interview as called by the Board of Ministry Assessment.

COLLEGE / SEMINARY STUDENTS

College and Seminary students are responsible to submit evidence of academic standing in harmony with Manual section 521. At graduation, the final transcript will be evaluated by the District Studies Board, and no requirements stated in the *Manual* will be waived.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

We, the District Finance Committee: Rev. Samuel Flores (ex officio), Mark Alison (chair-person), LaNora Jensen (Finance Committee secretary), Jessica Rojas (District treasurer/finance officer), Nate Barefield (NYI president), Tony Lupton (NDI president), Elizabeth Newman (NMI president), Rev. Jeremy Reese (recording secretary), Gregory A. Pressley (District secretary); ministers – Roland Evans, David Gallimore, Will Harvey, Tom McCrea, and Isa Wojtkowski; laypersons – Tina Morse, Wendel Nixon, Laura Virden, Elaine Wengerd, and Justin Willis, submit the following report for your consideration:

The Church of the Nazarene is comprised of local congregations throughout the world. By the uniting of our efforts and resources we are able to accomplish that which our local churches cannot do by themselves. Necessary to these cooperative ministries is financial support from the local churches. Furthermore, we are dependent upon the integrity of pastors and local church financial officers in developing and maintaining a means to this ministry that is equitable and healthy.

We recommend the following:

1. That for the 2025-26 fiscal year local churches participate in the District Missional Fund (DMF). The DMF shall be conducted in this manner: each local church shall contribute 6.75% of its weekly tithes and offerings (including its Sunday School offering) for the support of the following South Carolina District Ministries: District Operations, New Church Fund, Camp, District Nazarene Discipleship International (NDI), District Nazarene Youth International (NYI), District Nazarene Missions International (NMI). Send to South Carolina District Church of the Nazarene, 150 McSwain Drive, West Columbia, SC 29169 or by electronic payment (www.fundingthemission.org). Exempt from inclusion in the DMF offerings is money given by the local church to the World Evangelism Fund and approved mission specials.

The DMF allotments are to be sent each week at least monthly to the South Carolina District Office by U.S. mail or through online giving. The district treasurer will disburse the funds proportionately in the following manner, up to \$530,000 \$583,000:

District Missional Growth – **4.00%** Camp – **9.00%** NDI – **4.00%** NMI – **4.00%** NYI – **4.00%**

After \$530,000 \$583,000 of the district budget (DMF) has been received and there is an excess over expenditures, the balance of monies will be appropriated according to

the executive finance committee recommendations with approval of the District Advisory Board.

- That the World Evangelism Fund shall be 5.5% of all monies raised, minus all money given by the local church to the World Evangelism Fund and approved mission specials. Send to General Treasurer, P.O. Box 843116, Kansas City, MO 64184 or by electronic payment (www.fundingthemission.org).
- 3. That South Carolina's Nazarene Benefits USA (formerly Pensions & Benefits) shall be 2% of all monies raised minus all money given by the local church to the World Evangelism Fund and approved mission specials; and that Trevecca's allotment shall be 2.5% of all monies raised minus all money given by the local church to the World Evangelism Fund and approved mission specials. Please understand that it is the local church's responsibility to send the Nazarene Benefits USA allotment to the General Treasurer and Trevecca's allotment to TNU.
- The District Budget shall be as follows:

Proposed District Budget Expenditures **2025-26** See Addendum 1.

Proposed 2025-26 District Missional Growth Investments - \$22,000 \$23,320.

Proposed Camp Operating Budget **2025-26** See Addendum 2.

- That the District NYI, District NDI, District NMI councils provide monthly treasurer reports to the district superintendent.
- 6. That the District NDI, NMI, NYI, Missional Growth, and Camp councils/boards present a proposed annual budget to the District Finance Committee.
- That the district treasurer and all department treasurers be bonded at district expense.
- 8. That all district salaries and benefits and general assembly delegate allocations be preferred claims; and that all other district expenses not specified, including office equipment, be paid as ordered by the Advisory Board; that travel expenses for the district board and committee meetings be set at one half of the current IRS standards.
- 9. That the district superintendent be given 5 weeks' vacation with pay.
- 10. That the local church be responsible for the pastor's and any associate pastors' health insurance premiums.
- 11. That all district treasurers' books be audited by a qualified accountant.

12. For South Carolina Nazarene churches that have paid their Education Budget in full, TNU will match 2-to-1 any amount the local church sends in for their students up to \$500. (TNU will add \$1000 to make it a \$1500 Church Match Scholarship.)

For South Carolina Nazarene churches that have <u>not</u> paid their Education Budget, TNU will match 1-to-1 any amount the local church sends in for their students up to \$500. (TNU will add \$500 to make it a \$1000 Church Match Scholarship.)

Guidelines for Local Church Boards

- 1. That church boards assume responsibility to see that 6.75% of the local church's offering is sent to the district treasurer each week at least monthly.
- 2. That our churches and departments have their treasurer's books audited or reviewed at the end of the statistical church year preferably by a qualified accountant, or by a competent committee, and that a letter is sent to the district office verifying this audit or review by October 1. Requests for permission to sell property, buy property, construct facilities, or borrow money may not be considered until the letter is received. This audit or review is to be verified on the annual pastor's report. (Manual paragraph 139.23)
- 3. That all church records are filed at the end of each statistical church year under the supervision of the church board, and that confidentiality be properly maintained.
- That our churches pay full-time evangelists approximately twice their pastor's salary.
 Travel expenses and Social Security taxes should be in addition to the compensation provided.
- 5. That our people be encouraged to exercise the stewardship of possessions and estates on behalf of the church. We further recommend that the pastors use every means to conduct an active bequest program through the local congregation. Visit www.NazareneFoundation.org or call 866-273-2549 for more information.
- 6. That each church observe Nazarene Bible College Day and Nazarene Theological Seminary Day during the dates designated by the respective institutions, by distributing publicity materials and receiving an offering.

Pastoral Care

Care for our pastors is a biblical concept and practice that needs to be carefully considered by our church boards. Realizing that staffing and financing resources of the churches can vary, we urge the appropriate committees to study and recommend action

annually in each of the areas below. Churches receiving district support must comply with existing district policy regarding local church finance.

A. Salaries

- 1. Each church, where appropriate and possible, should endeavor to employ its pastor on a full-time basis.
- 2. The pastor's and paid associate pastors' salaries are to be carefully reviewed annually as a minimum. It should be recognized that a salary increase is not an actual increase unless it is above the current cost-of-living index. When a pastor leads a church in growth that is reflected in increased finances, let this be a factor in determining the amount of increase in his/her salary and benefits.
- 3. A study should be made of the pastor's and associates' compensation to determine means of limiting tax liability. Professional assistance is available through the office of Nazarene Benefits USA (NBUSA). We recommend local churches seek assistance relating to the tax laws and their impact on tax liability of pastors and associates.
- 4. The pastor's and associates' salaries are to be considered a preferred claim.
- That the pastor and associates be given at least one week's salary as a Christmas gift.

B. Housing

- In housing matters, churches should carefully consider the options of the pastor purchasing his own home versus retaining a church-owned parsonage to best meet the pastor's need.
- 2. When a pastor or associate purchases his own home, a housing allowance should be established commensurate with current housing and utility costs, in line with current IRS standards and consistent with NBUSA guidance.
- 3. If a parsonage is owned by the local church, the appropriate committee or board should be aware of and responsible for needed repairs and maintenance.

C. Insurance

- 1. Church boards should work with pastors to obtain optimum insurance coverage.
- Consideration should be given to provide the supplemental term life insurance and the long-term disability insurance for the pastor and associates that is offered by the general church.

D. Local Church Expense

- The church should provide a pastor's auto expense reimbursement, continually considering the increase in church-related auto costs. Consideration should be given to operating costs, maintenance, depreciation, insurance, and registration. Some churches may choose to provide a car for their pastor.
- Each church should make provisions for a comfortable and well-equipped office for its pastors. This provision should include supplies, postage, telephone, and secretarial help when needed.
- 3. Recognizing that entertainment is a local church expense, consideration should be given to establishing an expense account to reimburse pastors for expenses

- incurred in professional responsibilities.
- Each church should assist their pastor(s) with Work & Witness trip expenses, whenever possible. These ministry experiences should not be considered as vacation.

E. Retirement Benefits

- The church should reimburse the pastor(s) the full amount of Social Security tax based on the total of his/her salary and housing allowance or parsonage rental value (where possible, including utilities).
- NBUSA now offers a Ministers Match pension program. NBUSA will match contributions by eligible ministers and/or their church (local effort) to their Nazarene 403(b) account when the church also pays at least 50% of their NBUSA Fund allocation. The greatest benefit to the local minister occurs when the church pays 100%. For more information visit the NBUSA website. (https://www.nbusa.org/)
- 3. There is no longer an automatic contribution to the minister's retirement account, unless the minister and the church participate in this new pension program.
- 4. Once the church has fulfilled their NBUSA Fund allocation (2%) and if financially possible, the local church should also give consideration to establishing a matching TSA (tax sheltered annuity) plan for the pastor(s) through the TSA programs offered by the general church or other such institutions.
- The local church should remit their NBUSA payment in order for the pastor(s) to receive retirement benefits. Here are the percentages for the Ministers Match Program:

Well-Being

A. Physical

 The pastor and full-time staff should be given an annual paid vacation. As a guideline, we suggest the following schedule for total years of service, not just the tenure of service at the current assignment:

> 0-4 years 2 weeks (including 2 Sundays) 5-9 years 3 weeks (including 3 Sundays) 10-19 years 4 weeks (including 4 Sundays) 20 or more years 5 weeks (including 5 Sundays)

 The pastor is urged to give careful consideration to following the biblical call to weekly Sabbath in taking one day off per week. He or she should also lead the congregation in understanding the words of Jesus that the Sabbath has been made for our well-being. God does in Sabbath what can only be done in Sabbath. Working on one's Sabbath should be rare. (Mark 2:27)

B. Spiritual

- Realizing that pastors face stress, pressure, and exhaustion, consideration should be given to granting extended time away (week or month) for rest, renewal, prayer, and spiritual growth.
- We affirm the biblical call (Leviticus 25) to follow the rhythms established by God for His people. During each fifth consecutive year, we recommend a paid sabbatical leave for rest, renewal, prayer and spiritual deepening, with district approval.
 - a. We recommend not less than 4 weeks of sabbatical time.
 - b. Recognizing the unique challenges of our bi-vocational pastors, the pastor / board are encouraged to invite the staff of nearby congregations and retired elders to help with the preaching duties. We encourage those ministers to consider their assistance as a gift to the local church in helping our bivocational pastors.
 - c. When a pastor has been in the ministry for 12 years, has not ever taken a sabbatical, and has been in his or her current assignment for at least four years, we recommend the congregation consider granting the pastor a sabbatical, in consultation with the district superintendent.
 - d. Church board/congregations should not consider the sabbatical as vacation nor should the compensation of the pastor be reduced.
 - e. In financially healthy settings, the church board/congregation should consider helping the full-time/senior pastor with the costs associated with the sabbatical. See *Manual* paragraph 139.10.
- 3. We urge that members of the local church uphold their pastor(s) daily in prayer.

C. Emotional

Understanding the emotional burden that pastors carry in caring for others and the high rate of burnout experienced by clergy, we recommend that the pastor give careful consideration to his or her own emotional health. We recommend that the local church encourage and provide the opportunity for each pastor to engage in counseling that would be consistent with Christian values, including, but not limited to, the Pastoral Care Center at Trevecca Nazarene University, with which the district has a contracted relationship.

D. Educational

That each church encourage all of its pastoral staff to enrich their ministry at
the local church by providing funds and time for Lifelong Learning as outlined
in the most recent Church of the Nazarene Manual paragraphs. This may
include ministerial conventions, seminars, directed studies, and special
college and seminary courses. This provision may also include the purchase

- of professional development materials (books and periodical allowances) and the payment of professional dues.
- That each church, especially those without the funds to help with Lifelong Learning requirements, encourage their pastor to participate in the South Carolina School of Pastoral Leadership.

E. Inspirational

That each local church assist their pastor and associates in attending District Assembly, Family Camp Meeting, conventions, and the annual retreat for pastors and their spouses and that these meetings not be considered vacations.

Family

Special Recognition

- Each church is encouraged to recognize all members of the parsonage families at appropriate times of the year: Pastor Appreciation Month, birthdays, anniversaries, Christmas, etc. Special attempts should be made to show appreciation and express love to the pastors and families at all times.
- That our churches remember the retired ministers, missionaries, and evangelists within their membership with special acts of love and kindness.

To Whom It May Concern,

I have completed my audit of the South Carolina District Church of the Nazarene's cash receipts and disbursements for the fiscal year ending May 31, 2025. The accounts included in the audit are the District Operating Fund, Camp Fund, NYI Fund, NDI Fund, and NMI Fund. I have reviewed randomly selected items as laid out in the Agreed Upon Procedures for the district, and inspected the backup files and bank statements accordingly.

It is my professional opinion that the accounts listed are in good order and of sufficient integrity. Although I originally had two fail items, we were able to reconcile those. I have no consideration to fail this audit in the slightest, but some accounts do need a little bit of attention. This is the seventh subsequent year that I have completed the audit, and it was the best one yet. Jessica has obviously made an impact in her role with record keeping and financial coaching at the district. All major issues or concerns that I had were addressed and cleared up by Jessica Rojas and members within the district. There were zero fail items and the largest funds had the best reports. All concerning items remaining were minor and most were recurring in nature. As a result, the district passed the audit. I will follow up this report with recommendations to the district for next year's audit, in an attempt to increase efficiency and compliancy. Those will not affect the pass/fail tests in the audit, only improve record keeping and overall controls. Much of what has been noted was already discussed in person with Jessica Rojas, the Financial Officer of the district.



Committee on Standards and Goals 2025-2026

We, your Committee on Standards and Goals, urge that each local NMI plan to meet all requirements for Mission Priority One, World Evangelism Church of Excellence, and the Exemplary Award.

- I. We recommend that each local NMI council meet promptly following the district convention and make plans to receive all awards: Mission Priority One, World Evangelism Church of Excellence, and Exemplary NMI by participating in all of the following:
 - MISSION PRIORITY ONE
 The NMI President shall attest that the NMI at the designated church has participated in each of the emphases of NMI:
 - (1) **PRAY –** Pray for missions and missionaries.
 - (2) Engage Children and Youth Help children and youth learn about missions and support those who feel called to missions service.
 - (3) **World Evangelism Fund (WEF)** The church will give 5.5% of current income for WEF.
 - (4) Alabaster Participate in Alabaster offering.
 - (5) **Care and Concern–** Participate in Links, connecting and supporting a Nazarene missionary through communication and prayer.
 - 2. **WORLD EVANGELISM CHURCH OF EXCELLENCE** This designation requires that your church give at least 5.7% (or overpay by \$1,500, whichever is less) to World Evangelism Fund to invest in new world areas and new works in the U.S.A. and Canada. This is SOLELY based on the giving amount.
 - EXEMPLARY AWARD This commendation requires that your church meet all the goals of Mission Priority One, Award of Excellence, AND meets all of the goals listed below:
 - (1) Pay District NMI Budget in full by participating fully with the District Missional Fund. This enables all District Budgets to be paid in full.
 - (2) **Participate in World Mission Broadcast** by receiving an offering. There is no assigned goal set.

- (3) Participate in the District Work & Witness Program offering by mailing a separate offering to the District NMI Treasurer. There is no assigned goal set.
- (4) Participate in the Missionary Health Care Plan by presenting the following (a minimum of one is required to receive the award but more than one is suggested):
 - Memorial Roll Certificate for an adult or child
 - Distinguished Service Award
 - "Gifts from the Heart"
 - Receive an Offering for the Medical Plan.
- (5) Give a Deputation offering for a visiting Nazarene Missionary. Offerings may be given at your church, at the Children's Mission Fair, and/or in another Church of the Nazarene deputation service. You may give your money electronically to the missionary's GTS deputation account. Make sure you mark it for that particular missionary.

It is recommended that each pastor and NMI president plan for and publicize the missionary deputation service scheduled by the District Deputation Coordinator. A healthy involvement in the total mission program, by both the local church and the district, is partially dependent on a yearly visit from a missionary. The missionary is the liaison with the world mission areas where the Church of the Nazarene is at work. At the deputation service, a deputation check written out to the General Treasurer Church of the Nazarene, should be given to the missionary. Suggested deputation check amounts:

Sunday A.M. Service - \$400 to \$500 minimum Sunday P.M. Service - \$250 to \$350 minimum Weekday Service - \$225 to \$325 minimum

After the missionary speaks, a love offering should be received, in addition to the deputation check.

(6) Participate in the Compassionate Ministries Offering as well as be involved in a project or child sponsorship. There is no goal set.

- II. An Exemplary Certificate will be given at the District NMI Convention to the churches that meet all the above goals qualifying them for the **Exemplary Award.**
- III. We recommend that the local NMI council members, when possible, be considered as nominees for election as delegates to the district NMI convention.
- IV. We recommend that local NMI presidents send their annual reports to the district NMI secretary to be received no later than the established deadline.
- V. We recommend that each local NMI council be provided with a Nazarene Missions International Handbook, or copies of the member's particular responsibilities.
- VI. We recommend that each local NMI council encourage and assist their pastor(s) with Work & Witness expenses.
- VII. We recommend that each local NMI council encourage and assist lay person(s) including youth, with Work & Witness expenses.
- VIII. We recommend that each church endeavor to meet all the requirements for the South Carolina District **Exemplary Award.**

Ezekial and Susy Ramirez

Susy and Ezequiel were born into Christian homes and from a very young age they were involved in the service of God and people with their families.

At the age of 14 God called Ezekiel to missions, while Susy was called to the missions at the age of 18. They met while studying at the Nazarene Theological Seminary of the Southern Cone in 2003. They got married on January 17th, and have been married for 20 years with two beautiful children: Francisco and Antonella. As a family, they love to serve the Lord together.

They were appointed pastors at the age of 21 in 2005 and served for almost 7 years in church planting in what is now the Buenos Aires West district alongside great servants from whom they learned a lot.

In 2012 they moved to serve in Paraguay, where they served as pastors, as well as in the country's

Theological Education, Evangelism and Jesus Film, Church planting, and as Superintendent of the Paraguay Central District for two years.

In 2016 to 2021 they served as pastors of the Church of the Nazarene in Victoria Buenos Aires, also as professors of Theology, and in 2020 Ezequiel was appointed Director of the Nazarene Seminary of Buenos Aires and coordinator of Education in the Central Argentine District.
