Twenty Events Surrounding the Crucifixion of Jesus Christ

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| 1. Jesus arrived at Golgotha at 9:00 a.m. | Mark 15:22 |
| 2. He refused the offer of wine mixed with myrrh. | Mark 15:23 |
| 3. He was nailed to the cross between two thieves. | Mark 15:24-28 |
| 4. He spoke his first words from the cross, "Father forgive them..." | Luke 23:34 |
| 5. The soldiers took Jesus' garments, leaving him naked on the cross. | Mark 15:24 |
| 6. The religious leaders and others mocked Jesus. | Mark 15:29-32 |
| 7. The two thieves addressed Jesus. | Luke 23:39-43 |
| 8. Jesus spoke to one of the thieves, "...today you will be with me in paradise..." | Luke 23:43 |
| 9. He spoke to his mother and the apostle John. | John 19:26-27 |
| 10. Darkness covered Golgotha from noon to 3:00. | Mark 15:33 |
| 11. Jesus spoke His fourth cry "My God, my God why have you forsaken me?" | Mark 15:34-36 |
| 12. Jesus spoke for the fifth time "I thirst." | John 19:28 |

Seven Sayings of Jesus from the Cross

| 6. Victory | John 19:30 |

When you combine the accounts in the Gospels, you arrive at the following probable order of Resurrection appearances on that first day of the week: (1) to Mary Magdalene (John 20:11-18 and Mark 16:9-11), (2) to the other women (Matt. 28:9-10), (3) to Peter (Luke 24:34 and 1 Cor. 15:5), (4) to the two men going to Emmaus (Mark 16:12 and Luke 24:13-32), and (5) to ten of the disciples in the Upper Room (Mark 16:14 and John 20:19-25). Mark 16 Now when the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, that they might come and anoint Him. ² Very early in the morning, on the first day of the week, they came to the tomb when the sun had risen. ³ And they said among themselves, "Who will roll away the stone from the door of the tomb for us?" ⁴ But when they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled away—for it was very large. ⁵ And entering the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a long white robe sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. ⁶ But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed. **You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is _____!** He is not here. See the place where they laid Him. But go, tell His disciples—and Peter—that He is going before you into Galilee; there you will see Him, as He said to you." So they went out quickly and fled from the tomb, for they trembled and were amazed. And they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid. ⁹ Now when He rose early on the first day of the week, He appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom He had cast seven demons. ¹⁰ She went and told those who had been with Him, as they mourned and wept. ¹¹ And when they heard that He was alive and had been seen by her, they did not believe. After that, He appeared in another form to two of them as they walked and went into the country. ¹³ And they went and told it to the rest, but they did not believe them either. Later He appeared to the eleven as they sat at the table; and He rebuked their unbelief and hardness of heart, because they did not believe those who had seen Him after He had risen. ¹⁵ And He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature. ¹⁶ He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned. And these signs will follow those who believe: In My name they will cast out demons; they will speak with new tongues; ¹⁸ they will take up serpents; and if they drink anything deadly, it will by no means hurt them; they will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover." So then, after the Lord had spoken to them, He was received up into heaven, and sat down at the right hand of God. ²⁰ And they went out and **preached** everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word through the accompanying signs. Amen.

Three Basic Steps to Bible Study

1. Observation (like a Bible detective looking for clues)
2. Interpretation (looking for the original writer's intended meaning to the original reader)
3. Application (the "so what" of the passage; what does Jesus want me to do?)

Hermeneutics is the art and science of Bible interpretation.

Eisegesis is to read into the text what you want it to say.

Exegesis is to read out of the text the author's intended meaning.

- **Acts 28** – Paul on island of Malta
- **James 3** – Bible teachers held to a high standard of judgment

The Four Questions Bible Discovery Method

1. What does this passage teach me about God?
2. What does this passage teach me about humanity?
3. What does God want me to know about this passage?
4. What does God want me to do about this passage?
