10 "Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. ² The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. ³ The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. ⁴ When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. ⁵ They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers." ⁶ Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them.

⁷ So again Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. ⁸ All who came before me are thieves and bandits, but the sheep did not listen to them. ⁹ I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved and will come in and go out and find pasture. ¹⁰ The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly.

Nominations Needed for Church Boards: Our annual Church Council meeting is coming up on November 9th and we need nominations for the Boards of Elders and Trustees and a delegate to represent Ardmore at the 2026 Southern Province Synod. If you are interested in serving as a member of either board or as Synod delegate, please contact Pastor Joe and he will share your interest with the Nominating Committee.

Nominations needed for Delegate to 2026 Southern Province Synod. Every four years, pastors and representatives from the congregations gather together for Synod: "to discern God's call to mission and service, to consider our response to God in faith, love and hope, and to give attention to matters of governance." Delegates to the Synod vote for the Provincial leadership, including the President and members of the Provincial Elders' Conference, Board of World Mission, Moravian Mission Society, School of Theology at Moravian University Board of Trustees, and Provincial Women's Board. Delegates also consider ideas and plans to help set the direction and focus for the ministry of the Moravian Church for the next four years.

Ardmore Moravian is entitled to 1 delegate to the Synod, in addition to the Pastor. The 2026 Synod will take place June 3-6 at New Philadelphia Moravian Church. If you are interested in being our delegate to Synod or would like to learn more about it as you consider serving as a delegate, please contact Pastor Joe. We need to elect 1 delegate and 1 alternate at our November 9 Church Council meeting.

At our November 9 Church Council meeting, we will be voting on the following:

Changes to Rules and Regulations of Ardmore Moravian Church Approved by the Joint Board on October 19, 2025

Article III Section 8 Manner of Elections

Current Version:

"Retiring Board members are not eligible for re-election or appointment to either Board for one year."

Change to:

"Upon completion of their term, Board members are eligible to be re-elected or appointed to either board for an additional 3 year term."

Article IV Section 1 Composition of Church Boards

Current Version:

Each board shall consist of 9 members.

Change to:

Each board shall consist of 6 members.

Article IV Section 1 Composition of Church Boards

Current Version:

"No members serving a full term shall be eligible for reelection to either Board until after an intermission of at least one (1) year."


