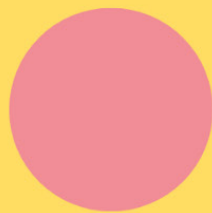

## ♥ What are Heart Holds?

Heart Holds are specific and basic teachings that all Christians should be able to refer to at any moment. They may be items to memorize, Scriptures to read, or concepts to understand and put into practice. Each month will be a different type of something for you to “hold on to” to help you stay firm in your faith.

## ♥ Who can participate?

We want all of our Alameda family members to continue growing in their faith. Too often, believers of all ages become discouraged by their circumstances and turn away from God. We don’t want this for any of our church family. We want you to be faithful to the end!

For our children and youth, our hope is that these Heart Holds will encourage them to begin developing a habit of learning God’s Word and His plan for their lives. We desire each generation to stay strong in the Lord and pass on their faith to the next generation.

## Memorize the Old & New Testament Books of the Bible

For February's Heart Hold, memorize all 39 books in the Old Testament and all 27 books in the New Testament that you see listed below.

Knowing all the books in the Old and New Testaments will allow you to easily find that book in your Bible whenever you need it!

To help make memorizing easier, you can sing the list in a song. Search the internet to find songs and videos to assist in learning both the old and new testaments.

## Read the book of Matthew in the New Testament

Read through the Gospel of Matthew this month! The book of Matthew is the first book in the New Testament and is one of the four Gospels. It tells about the life of Jesus, from his genealogy and his birth to his teachings and to his death and resurrection. In Matthew, we see that Jesus is the Messiah from the line of David. He is Immanuel, which means "God with us."

There are 28 chapters in Matthew, so read one chapter per day. Your reading plan will look like this:

**March 1: Matthew 1**  
**March 2: Matthew 2**  
**March 3: Matthew 3**  
**March 4: Matthew 4**  
**March 5: Matthew 5... and so on,**  
**until March 28 when you finish**  
**the book of Matthew!**

Try to stay on track and read a chapter each day, but if you get behind, you will have March 29-31 to finish reading the book.

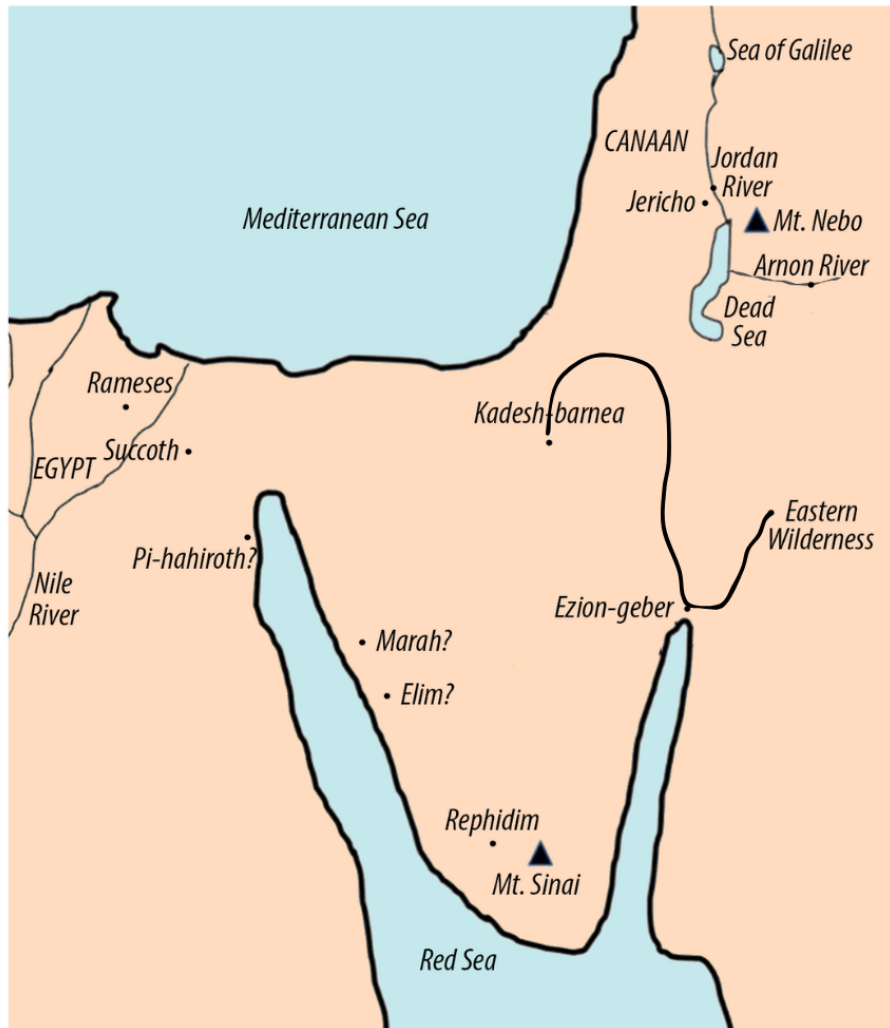

MAY 2026

Read one of passages listed below on each Monday, Wednesday, and Friday this month. After reading each Scripture, draw a line on the map to the next place where the Israelites traveled in that day's passage.

### **Exodus 12:37 & 13:17-22**

Israel was sent out of Egypt.

### **Exodus 14 & Numbers 33:8**

Israel crossed the Red Sea

### **Exodus 15:23-26**

The Lord made bitter waters sweet

### **Exodus 15:27**

Israelites camped by twelve springs of water

### **Exodus 17:8-16**

Israel fought with Amalek

### **Exodus 19-20**

The Lord revealed the Ten Commandments

### **Numbers 33:35, Deuteronomy 2:1-7**

The Israelites moved through the land of Esau

## Make a Plan and Practice Sharing the Gospel

For August's Heart Hold, learn how to share the Gospel with someone. The Gospel is the good news of Jesus Christ!

Each week this month, make a plan and practice it, so that whenever you have an opportunity to share the Gospel, you are prepared.

Two examples are provided. These are simple illustrations and exercises to help you explain the Gospel and why it's good news for all of us!

### Share the Gospel in 1 Minute

**God:** God is Creator of the earth and everything in it. He is holy and just and righteous. He created us to be in relationship with Him, to love Him, serve Him, and glorify Him in all we do.

**Sin:** We are all sinners, and therefore, we cannot be with God. Our sin separates us from his holy presence. This is a problem we cannot fix on our own.

**Jesus:** Through Jesus Christ, we can be reconciled to God. Because Jesus died for our sins, our debt is paid and our sins are forgiven.

**Our Response:** We are faithful and place our hope in Jesus Christ, our Savior, repenting of our sins and being baptized as we follow Him.

### Sidewalk Chalk Gospel

Find a spot to draw on the sidewalk. Go through the steps below, saying each part aloud as you draw.

God created the world...  
{Genesis 1:1}

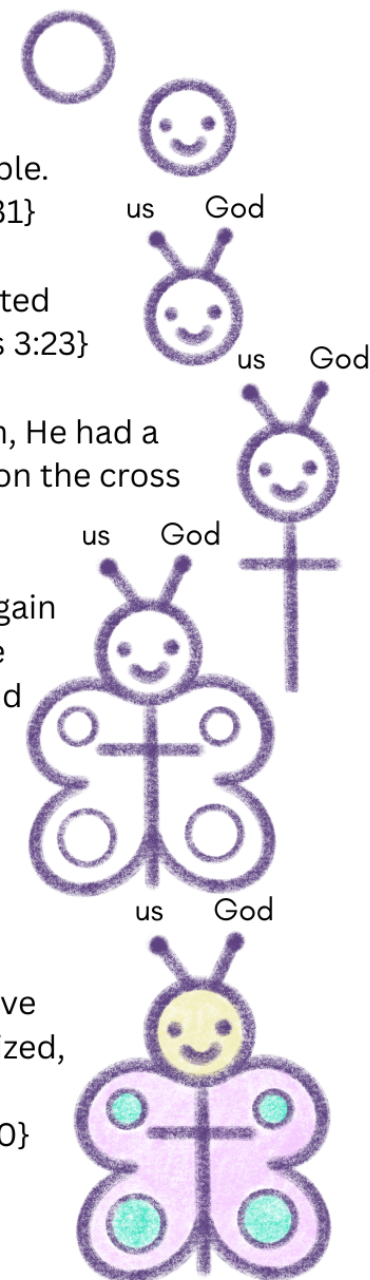
and everything in it, including people.  
He said it was good! {Genesis 1:27,31}

People sinned and we were separated  
from our perfect Creator! {Romans 3:23}

But because God loved us so much, He had a plan!  
He sent His son Jesus to die on the cross for our sins! {Matthew 20:28}

Jesus did not stay dead. He rose again 3 days later, just as He said! People even saw the holes in His hands and knew it was really Jesus!  
{John 20:25-29; Matthew 2 & 6}

This gave us a way to be made whole again! Jesus gives us hope and color in our lives! All we have to do is admit we are sinners, believe Jesus rose from the dead, be baptized, and give Him control of our lives!  
{1 Corinthians 5:17; Romans 10:9-10}



## Memorize the Ten Commandments

- 1 You shall have no other gods before Me.
- 2 You shall not make idols.
- 3 You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain.
- 4 Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy.
- 5 Honor your father and your mother.
- 6 You shall not murder.
- 7 You shall not commit adultery.
- 8 You shall not steal.
- 9 You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.
- 10 You shall not covet.

Before you start memorizing the summarized list above, read the full passages of Scripture in Exodus 20 and Deuteronomy 5:6-21.

### Tips for Memorizing Scripture

- Pray that God will help you remember this Scripture at times in your life when you need it most.
- Recite the Scripture daily. Recite it alone or with a friend or family member. Choose the same time of day to recite it so that you don't forget.
- Write out the Scripture and place it where you will see it and read it often.
- Put the words to a rhythm or melody that you can sing each day.

### Tips for Planning a Devotional

Do what works best for your family.

Be consistent.

Commit.

### READ SCRIPTURE TOGETHER

Verbalizing Scripture (regardless of age, reading capability, or difficulty of some words) is not only glorifying God but edifying for people to work together to connect to our God!

### SING

Talk about your favorite songs. Talk about songs you want to learn and sing (then sing them)! It may feel awkward at first, but singing to God as a family brings a deep connection to where our minds should be.

### PRAY

Find ways for everyone in the family to pray. Think of creative ways to talk to God together—write out a prayer or practice saying The Lord's Prayer from Matthew 6 throughout the day. Prayer is a crucial connection that is needed for a family to work together. Think about who and what you're praying for, and whom you're praying to.

### TALK

Discuss what you've been learning in church recently or where you've seen God work in your life in the last week. What is hard right now- & how can God show up there? Give space for the Holy Spirit to guide your conversations.

### ALL OF THE ABOVE!

Reading, singing, and praying can all be considered devotional time, but put those together and you can create a holistic experience of worship and connection as a family.
