The Book of Acts continues the Big God Story after Jesus' resurrection. Jesus told his followers that they were to reach out to their neighbors in ever increasing circles beginning right on their street in Jerusalem as well as engaging neighbors in the vicinity—Judea. From there out to Samaria and even to the remotest part of the earth (Acts 1:8).
