

#### A note about "First Sunday CONNECTIONS"

For the past year, we have occasionally hosted these times (on "first Sundays" of the month, obviously) for people simply to make connections with others - to bolster existing relationships and/or perhaps to establish new ones. Due to the schedule over recent months, it's been awhile since we've had one of these. That continues to be the case into August - with the post-VBS donuts/coffee fellowship time at 9:30am on Sunday, 8/3. We will, however, resume our "First Sunday CONNECTIONS" on September 7.



### A Note about Southland Leadership



Each Summer, we go through a process designed to help us identify potential new elders. As with any group (e.g. a company/organization, family, sports team, etc.), the leadership of a church family certainly matters, and the role of elder is a key part of God's design. Every church has its own method for choosing leadership. You can check out previous editions of "The Vine" for more details about how

we do it here at Southland. Ultimately, we want this to be an opportunity for us to be in step with the Holy Spirit's leading as we seek His guidance in this process. We use this space in "The Vine" to communicate information about how it works and to provide updates re: our progress.

Earlier this Summer, we provided an opportunity for Southland members to recommend names for consideration. Of the five names originally submitted, three have chosen to continue on in this process at this point, including an "interview" with the current elders. At some point in August, we'll share the list of elders moving forward; this is not done for a "yes" or "no" vote, but to give the congregation an opportunity to raise any <u>Biblical</u> concerns re: those being recommended for this role. From there, new elders will be "ordained" at our annual FLOURISH gathering in late August to begin serving in this role as we start a new ministry year in September. We'll continue to keep you updated on how all of this unfolds.

As a reminder, this overall process is designed to help us - both those recommended for this role and the existing leadership - discern God's direction in this matter. Throughout it all, we are trying to align ourselves with Him as we strive to recognize those men that *He* is calling to serve in this vital role of leadership in the Southland family. Underneath any such human process in place for a local congregation, ultimately, it's about those He appoints (see Acts 20:28). Of course, as we seek the Spirit's leading on this matter, prayer is a necessary part of this process too. In the midst of it all, we do ask the Southland family to be praying along with us.

Elders currently serving:

Ernie Emmerton, Ben Jennings, Pat Little, Terry Ochs and Bob Wood. In September, Pat will begin a "sabbatical" (a required year-off after serving 6 consecutive years).

As Lead Pastor, Matt is also considered a part of the elder team.

In the last two editions of "The Vine," we've shared the elder portion of our "Leadership Covenant" as well as those commitments made by elders and staff. In this edition, we have highlighted the commitments made specifically by staff (see the "WE DO!" section on page 7).

#### **Scholarship Update:**

This is now the fifth year we have offered a scholarship in memory of Warren Burros, a long-time elder at Southland who passed away in April of 2020. His company decided to honor and reflect his legacy by contributing toward a scholarship fund that we would run. It's exclusively designed to bless and benefit high school graduates from within our Southland family.

This year, we had five applicants/recipients. We take a picture of them to send to Warren's former employers. (They'll also be updating the plaque for the foyer as well.) We thought it appropriate to share with you as well.

#### Some Technology Tools for the Southland Family



<u>CHURCH CENTER by Planning Center</u> ... This tool provides an online directory that those who have signed-up can access through a secure log-in and password (<a href="https://people.planningcenteronline.com/">https://people.planningcenteronline.com/</a>). This is also an app - "Church Center." It's a great tool for us to maintain connections with others in the Southland

family. It also allows each individual person with access to manage their own contact information as that needs to be updated. We also use the e-mail platform within the "PEOPLE" portion - for sharing both general information and prayer requests. Let us know if you're not receiving these.

FACEBOOK, including "The Southland Scoop" ... We have a general Facebook page that is public/visible for sharing some basic information about us more broadly (e.g. this is what we use for putting out our weekly live stream as well - see page 14). We also have a page called "The Southland Scoop." We use this more "internal" page to



share more specific church family-related information: pictures from recent events (like Move, the Guatemala mission trip and VBS), reminders, announcements, updates, etc. If you're on Facebook and not a part of "The Scoop" already, we encourage you to get connected in this way.

## OTHER GENERAL REMINDERS & INFO

We use an online platform called "Tithe.ly" as a giving option. It can be accessed at <a href="https://tithe.ly/give?c=1302996">https://tithe.ly/give?c=1302996</a> or through the app. Either way, you can find a page designed for Southland where you can give. In addition to regular giving, this can be used for other purposes like payment of fees. Especially when using this platform to make such a payment, we do ask that you cover any charges. There is certainly no requirement to use this tool, but we are grateful to have it available for those who choose to use it.

#### FINANCIAL UPDATE ... For July 2025

We provide this basic info to keep you updated about what's happening with giving at Southland. In each edition of "The Vine," we share a monthly snapshot with a ministry year total as well.

INCOME: June monthly tithe =  $$30,372^{\frac{00}{10}}$  (4 Sundays) Average weekly tithe =  $$7,593^{\frac{60}{10}}$ 

At this point in our fiscal/ministry year (September 2024 onward), our tithe is \$437,006 for an average of around \$9,100/week ... that <u>projects</u> at this point to around \$482,000 for the year.

Our budget for this ministry year puts us needing in the \$470,000 range - a slight increase over our previous ministry year's total. At this point (factoring-in where we are and what Summer has traditionally looked like), it is reasonable to project right around there, even with a conservative projection for August, the last month. Added to that, we started this ministry year in a good spot ... with some levels of reserves. It all puts us in a good financial position for now. Thank you for your ongoing faithful giving to Southland! Still, we encourage you to keep pressing on in your financial participation with our ministry - as 2 Corinthians 8 puts it, "to excel in this grace of giving."

Regardless of where exactly we are relative to our projected budget, Southland's leadership continues to work to manage our overall situation with wise stewardship - balancing our responsibility to be realistic while still prioritizing effective ministry and necessary expenses that arise along the way ... of course, with appropriate faith in His provision factored-in as well!

### **Weekly ministry happenings - Southland FAMILY-wide:**

Sunday mornings at 9:15am ... ministry programming for all ages including back to regular CONNECT Groups for adults - Sunday School classes for all kids and youth as well. See pages 14-15 for more specifics (not meeting on Sundays, August 3 and 31).





Sunday mornings at 10:30am ... our ENCOUNTER service - the time when we gather as a church FAMILY to meet with God; you can join us "in person" or online via the live stream. See page 14 for specifics.

Weekly ministries on a break over the Summer: Group Huddle for middle school/high school youth + Wednesday evening CULTIVATE + Thursday AM WSA/Ladies' Bible Study. These will be resuming later this August and into September; see below for more details on when exactly that will be happening for each one.

#### **Specific Events to Highlight (listed by date):**

We try to consolidate into one list the dates you need to be aware of for the weeks ahead.

Sunday, August 3 ... here's how we'll wrap-up VBS week: a time of fellowship at 9:30 (donuts, etc. will be served); then, after singing a couple of VBS songs in our ENCOUNTER service at 10:30, kids will go through day #5 of the VBS curriculum during their Kid ENCOUNTER time (ages 4 and up all together - see page 9 for more).

Sunday, August 3 ... starting this week, you can RSVP for our annual FLOURISH event.

Wednesday, August 20 at 6pm ... a meeting for D-Group facilitators as we prepare for a new semester/year of CULTIVATE.

Sunday, August 24 ... our 2025 FLOURISH gathering; see pages 2-3 for details.

Wednesday, August 27 ... the first night of CULTIVATE with ministry programming for all ages. We'll make available a flyer with more details sometime in mid-August.

Thursday, August 28 ... the first meeting of WSA/Ladies' Bible Study for the Fall session (see p. 13 for more on this).

Sunday, September 7 ... after several months without one, we'll have another "First Sunday CONNECTION" at 10am (9:15am groups/classes still meet, just with an earlier end time).

Sunday, September 7 after our ENCOUNTER time ... our student ministries will be having an informational meeting for parents (for students of all ages, K through high school - see p. 9).

Sunday, September 7 at 4:30pm ... Group Huddle kick-off event for the new year (done at 8).

Saturday, September 13 ... The Pregnancy Care Center's annual "Walk for Life" event; see page 18 for a link to more details.

Saturday, September 13 ... CCH's annual golf tournament to support their mission trips; see page 18 for a link to more details.

Sunday, September 14 at 6pm ... normal Group Huddle resumes.

By the next edition of "The Vine," we will have much more set in stone calendar-wise as we move toward the rest of 2025. We want you to have those dates as early as possible.









## REMEMBERING OUR COVENANT COMMITMENTS

One of the great privileges and joys of following Jesus is being joined together with other believers as His church. Here at Southland, we express that vital connection in part through our "Membership Covenant." It provides the basic parameters for belonging to the church family here — the commitments we have made to Christ and one another as His people. This covenant is our attempt to communicate the teaching of God's Word when it comes to His Church. Just what is required of us to belong to one another here?

As with any other area, we believe that leadership should set the pace – it's to be a higher level of responsibility. That's why a significant part of our covenant deals with the commitments made by SCC leaders. In conjunction with our annual process of considering new elders (see pp. 3-4 for the most recent update), this is a good time of year overall to share these. In the June edition, we identified the specific commitments made by SCC elders in their unique leadership role. In the July edition, we highlighted those commitments made by elders and staff together. So, it seems fitting for us to use this space in this edition to share the staff commitments – what have SCC staff members committed themselves to as part of the leadership here? We have provided a list in the space below. Again, as a reminder, these are in addition to the commitments made by both elders and staff in the "general commitments" section.

#### Staff COMMITMENTS - made by ministry staff as part of the leadership team:

- We covenant to embrace the direction and priorities established by the elders, affirming the unique place of leadership God has entrusted to them.
- We covenant to seek the Holy Spirit's guidance for how we creatively implement His plans in our specific areas of ministry.
- We covenant to partner with other staff members, functioning as a unified team for both greater effectiveness and, more importantly, God's glory.
- We covenant to work with volunteer ministry leaders and other staff in designing and effectively implementing the work of ministry here.
- We covenant to set the pace for ministry at Southland, being out on the front lines as servant– leaders carrying-out the special work He has given and gifted each of us to do.
- We covenant to demonstrate the effort appropriate for servants of Christ investing ourselves in eternally significant work (e.g. the right heart, commitment, humility, etc.).
- We covenant to be "workers worth our keep" (see Matthew 10:10) so that through our faithful, diligent service we earn the financial compensation we receive.
- We covenant to be faithful in how we handle the day-to-day operations of Southland Christian Church, living out Kingdom values such as integrity and excellence.



### CHECK-IN Process for our Kids' Ministries



We use a check-in process on Sunday mornings for those who are participating in our ministries for kids (birth through 5<sup>th</sup> grade).

This is for those coming for the first time (it takes a little longer to provide some basic registration information) and for regulars.

**REMINDER:** We use this process for both time slots on Sundays so please check your kids in when you first arrive.

### Sunday School Classes for kids (9:15am on Sundays)

We have kids' Sunday School classes as part of our regular weekly schedule. In addition to nursery for our youngest ones, we have classes for all ages. For the Summer months, we are combining our grade school ages  $(K-5^{th}$  grade) during this time slot.



We have an adjusted 9:15am schedule for the following days coming up: August 3 (a fellowship time with donuts/coffee to wrap-up our 2025 VBS week at 9:30am) and August 31 (nothing at 9:15am, part of Labor Day weekend); otherwise, classes are meeting as normal during August and will be moving forward into September.

## Kids' Programming during ENCOUNTER (10:30am on Sundays)

Here's what happens for kids 5<sup>th</sup> grade and younger during this time slot.

A Reminder: As mentioned last month, we are excited about an adjustment in this area. We've added a section for 2&3 year-olds (no longer just in the nursery) in addition to allowing more flexibility as students (especially 1<sup>st</sup> graders) transition from "Li'l Kid ENCOUNTER" to regular "Kid ENCOUNTER."

Nursery, "Wee Kid ENCOUNTER" (for 2 & 3 year-olds!) and "Li'l Kid ENCOUNTER" (for kids up through Kindergarten/ $1^{st}$  graders - those in  $1^{st}$  grade have the option here or in "Kid ENCOUNTER") are both available throughout our ENCOUNTER time each Sunday.

KINCOUNTER (1st through 5th graders) meets during the sermon portion of service. Kids start with their families and then are dismissed at the appropriate time. Kid ENCOUNTER is meeting as normal throughout AUGUST



Kid ENCOUNTER is now using newer material from Answers in Genesis (we used their VBS curriculum for the past few years). Each Sunday, students divein to God's Word, put Scripture in their hearts and learn how it applies to their everyday lives. This includes a memory verse each week as well. As is typical for AIG, there is even an "apologetics" emphasis attached to the content.

A note specifically about August 3: Kid Encounter will be extended - joined with the younger kids as well - as we wrap-up our VBS curriculum with Day #5. All kids will start in the auditorium to sing a couple of songs from the week before heading down the hall.

#### Our 2025 VBS is now behind us - a Look Back



VBS 2025 was another great week as kids had fun while learning about Jesus - being filled with WONDER because of Him! The kids discovered God's creation, made crafts, experienced science, learned through lessons (with a nightly memory verse), heard about missions, played games, enjoyed snacks and even rode a small train. It was another great week for those who participated - an average of over 70 kids total!

One of the highlights of the week was our offering for our partners in North Africa. We raised over \$1,250 during the week; way to go, kids (and parents + others too)!

A reminder about Sunday, August 3 as we wrap-up and celebrate VBS - three specifics: (1) a fellowship time with donuts and coffee, etc. at 9:30am (no normal 9:15am classes/groups this day) ... (2) kids are singing a couple of VBS songs toward the beginning of service at 10:30am ... (3) they will then be dismissed to the Great Room for VBS day #5 (kids ages 4 through  $5^{th}$  grade are combined for this time).

### FALL 2025 Wednesday evening CULTIVATE Plans for Kids

During the Fall Cultivate session (re-launches on August 27), our kids ages 4 and up participate in "Children of Praise." They'll be spending Wednesday evenings rehearsing songs, practicing drama and more, all in preparation for their annual Christmas performance (the program date is not yet set). We are grateful for Jessica and her team of volunteers (including some new ones!) who have stepped-up to lead our kids for this. We'll share more details on this year's program - called "Angel Alert!" - in the future; for now, we hope your kids plan on being a part of this.

## An Upcoming Event for kids 4th through 6th grades:

C.I.Y. has moved up its "Super Start" even in Tulsa for next year - to <u>January 30-31</u>, <u>2026</u> (it's typically been in March). This has become a fun event inn our kids' ministry. Because of the change in timing, <u>Jessica</u> will need to know by October 12 who wants to go - both kids and parents interested in going as sponsors. We'll share more in the months to come.

This year, the group went to a new location - Kansas University (in Lawrence). In addition to the picture of the group to the right, we've shared some reflections from a couple of our students who attended. It's a great way to follow-up on this great experience!















#### From Libbey Baadsgaard (graduated high school senior)

MOVE is a 5-day church camp for high school students on a college campus. It's a week filled with powerful worship, sermons, crazy costumes, laughter, and tears. I've been blessed to spend the past 5 years at this camp, and God has used it to work on growing my faith. This year's theme was "In Between" which represents the life we have between the time we are born and through our life with God in eternity. Our life on earth is only a small portion of forever with God, and we choose how we will live it. Where will we look when life gets difficult? Who am I called to be? As we live our lives in the "In Between," God gives us our identity in Him and tells us to keep our eyes fixed on Him.

Throughout the week, we walked through the book of Hebrews. This book is a call to remain faithful to God and have endurance. Every day, the speakers had compelling messages, and my favorite was from Night 3. Beth DeFazio shared from Hebrews 10, which is about Christ's sacrifice for us. He is the one sacrifice for all time, and He tore the veil to make the old new. Something that stuck with me in her message was when she talked about how there are those of us who think we can earn our salvation. She said, "If you try to enter the holy place without the blood of Jesus, you are cooked." I fall into that trap sometimes, and it's a great reminder that it's not about us, it's about HIM. That night, we had the chance to dedicate our lives to Christ for the first time or rededicate them. I chose to rededicate my life to Him and to represent that, I tore a piece of fabric in two. One piece was tied on the rope to be left behind to symbolize the old life, and I tied the other on my wrist to represent the new.

The worship at MOVE is incredibly touching. The songs were different this year, but by the end of the week, they held such a special place in my heart during my time in the presence of the Lord. There is nothing like praising God in a place with hundreds of people and declaring his name for who He is. One night in particular, I was so moved I had to stop singing and bask in his glory. I imagined how wonderful heaven would be with everyone crying out, "Holy." I couldn't help but lift my hands in the air and dance when it was time to worship. Praise God, I am saved. Death has been defeated, and I've been born again.

MOVE wouldn't be the same without such incredible leaders and friends. Zoey and I twinned one day as cowgirls, and we tricked some people because we looked so similar. Kale's van was an adventure, that's for sure. Every time we got done with small groups, he would step on the gas and circle the parking lot. I



feared for my life every time while everyone else was hollering. Levi "infracted" Les one day for being an amazing youth leader, which was the only infraction for something good during the week. He is the best youth Pastor, and I don't know how he manages this event every year, making the activities a blast and being there to talk about our struggles and faith. All the leaders were so incredible, setting a great example.

MOVE has been so valuable in my life. MOVE is a place where you come with burdens and you leave feeling lighter. God demonstrated that He is greater than my doubt, my anxiety, my sin, and my brokenness. He took that weight off my shoulders and helped me encounter Him for who He is.













#### From Zoey Smith (incoming high school senior)

Nothing could have prepared me for what was going to happen at Move. My life was going to change forever, and I wouldn't have it any other way. There is nothing better than getting away from life, and being with like-minded people. At Move, the people want the best for you, and most of all they want you to grow in your walk with Christ. So if you are struggling, lost, broken, and want to have a relationship with Jesus come to Move.

My experience at Move starts in the vehicle. There was nothing special about it. I talked with old and new friends, and we played many games. This was a great time to laugh, and get to know others. It helped me create bonds that I hope will last a lifetime. Once we arrived on the KU campus, I quickly noticed it's beauty - the hills, the trees, and the sky. Although the campus had some flaws I just wanted to focus on the beauty of it all.

The first main session was amazing. The worship and speaker communicated everything that I needed to hear. Little did I know that each night it would continue to get even better. Every day we would watch "Kingdom Worker" videos. The people highlighted in these productions shared their stories, and how God changed their lives. This was inspiring and made me feel less alone in my struggles. Just like the people in the "Kingdom Worker" videos, God gave me the courage to share my story with others. It has brought me closer to those people.

After each main session there was always a decision to make, and I loved seeing all the people in the room being brave and making those bold decisions. My first time at Move I made the decision to dedicate my life to God. I was lost, broken, and ashamed, but God met me at that summer Move Conference and made me feel redeemed. Now I want to help others grow in their faith, and show them that there is hope. I want people to feel welcomed, and know that they are not alone. I want to show them God's great love, and help them understand how deeply He cares for them. I never want anyone to go through what I went through, but when I hear that they are hurting my heart hurts for them. This brought me to make the biggest decision of my life.

On Thursday night the president of Christ In Youth shared a passionate message. He stressed the need for more vocational ministry workers. This was the push I needed to dedicate my life to working for the church. That night my friends shared their stories with me, and I shared mine with them. They were struggling like me, and I loved being able to help them through their woes. Finding the lost, broken, helping them through their hurt is what God has called me to do, and this is what I want to do. Not for my glory, but for His.
