

Some Technology Tools for the Southland Family



CHURCH CENTER by Planning Center ... This tool provides an online directory that those who have signed-up can access through a secure log-in and password (https://people.planningcenteronline.com/). This is also an app - "Church Center." It's a great tool for us to maintain connections with others in the Southland family. It also allows each individual person with access to

manage their own contact information as that needs to be updated. We also use the e-mail platform within the "PEOPLE" portion - for sharing both general information and prayer requests. Let us know if you're not receiving these.

FACEBOOK, including "The Southland Scoop" ... We have a general Facebook page that is public/visible for sharing some basic information about us more broadly (e.g. this is what we use for putting out our weekly live stream as well - see page 15 for more on that). We also have a page called "The Southland Scoop." We use this more "internal" page to share more specific church family-related information:

OTHER GENERAL REMINDERS & INFO



We use an online platform called "Tithe.ly" as a giving option. It can be **ITHE LY** accessed at https://tithe.ly/give?c=1302996 or through the app. Either way, you can find a page designed for Southland where you can give. In

addition to regular giving, this can be used for other purposes like payment of fees. Especially when using this platform to make such a payment, we do ask that you cover any charges. There is certainly no requirement to use this tool, but we are grateful to have it available for those who choose to use it.

FINANCIAL UPDATE ... For September 2025

We provide this basic info to keep you updated about what's happening with giving at Southland. In each edition of "The Vine," we share a monthly snapshot with a ministry year total as well.

September monthly tithe = $$31,564^{\frac{00}{}}$ (4 Sundays) Average weekly tithe = $$7,891^{\frac{00}{100}}$ **INCOME:**

This is the first month in our new fiscal year. If you're curious, as a weekly average, that puts us in the \$420,000 range; while it's well below our need, it's not an unexpected start given past years.

We did finish the last ministry year right where we need to be with our giving - even with some growth overall (annual tithe total of \$477,533). Thank you for your ongoing faithful giving to **Southland!** Added to that, we started in a good spot *last* September ... with some levels of reserves which were strengthened this past year; even more, our mortgage has been reduced to the mid-\$80,000 range (our only debt). It all puts us in a good financial position as we move into this new ministry year. At the same time, our budgeted tithe need does increase a bit so that we need in the \$480,000 range. Accordingly, we continue to encourage you to keep pressing on in your financial participation with our ministry - as 2 Corinthians 8 puts it, "to excel in this grace of giving."

Weekly ministry happenings - Southland FAMILY-wide:

Sunday mornings at 9:15am ... ministry programming for all ages including back to regular CONNECT Groups for adults - Sunday School classes for all kids and youth as well. Sunday mornings at 10:30am ... our ENCOUNTER service - the time when we gather as a church FAMILY to meet with God; you can join us "in person" or online via the live stream. See pages 14 and 15 for more information.

Sunday evenings (normally 6-8pm) ... Group Huddle for middle school and high school youth (see pp. 9-10). We're now at the point in the year where this is meeting each week - albeit with an adjustment on October 26 for our annual Fall Family Fun event.



Wednesday evening CULTIVATE, a "GROW DEEP" ministry ... 5:30 for dinner, 6:30 for ministry programming each week, including another new round of D-Groups. See page 16 for more details.



Thursday mornings (10am start time) ... WSA - Ladies' Bible Study (see p. 13) - for this semester, WSA is operating as a D-Group, just on Thursdays instead of during CULTIVATE.

Tuesday, October 21 at 6:30pm ... another worship night opportunity - this time, acoustic and outdoors around a fire; see page 14 for more information.

Sunday, October 26 ... the deadline for letting Jessica know who wants to attend the 2026 Super-Start event in Tulsa on January 30-31 - includes both kids and parents (see p. 8).

Sunday, November 2 ... "Daylight Savings Time" ends for 2025. Make sure to set your clocks back an hour Saturday into Sunday.

It's hard to believe that we're already down to the last quarter of 2025. We've shard the December dates to make sure these events are already on your calendar.

What MATTers to me ...

A name matters. It's why I always felt a lot of pressure when it came to naming our kids. When you have 5 kids, it means you have 5 opportunities to get it right and choose a name well. I specifically took on the task of coming up with all the ways that junior high boys might make fun of the ones we were pondering. (For example, Harmony's has been short-hand written as H-\$, even to the point that she's called "H-money" by some; I didn't see that one coming at all, but it's fine because I think she likes it.) As parents, you're choosing a name that becomes so intertwined with that person's identity - not just as a child, but for their whole earthly life. We landed on each one for a specific reason, even hoping that each name would be reflected through a desired identity and character from each child. It matters what names get chosen.

A name matters. There's something special about how we are addressed by people around us. It's true of titles, I suppose, but even more so with a name. I was insistent as a child at being called Matthew, even to the point of correcting others who shortened it to Matt. Yet, now, it's weird if anyone outside of my parents calls me by the full Matthew. I'm not entirely sure what's changed, but I've preferred Matt ever since high school days. I never thought of myself in this way, but being called a pet name like "Honey" by Kristie has always meant something special - an expression of our relationship, even. Of course, "Daddy" (upgraded by at least Simeon to "Pops") has always held a special place in my heart. Likewise, I've never loved titles for my vocation, but somehow, I can appreciate being called "Pastor Matt" when it comes with a sense of respect, but also a certain kind of relationship. It matters what we wear as a name in life.

A name matters. Recent events have me thinking about a new name that I'll start using before long. If you haven't heard yet, Kristie and I will be welcoming our first grandchild - a girl, we found out in late September - in March of 2026. We are so excited for Anna and Carson ... and for ourselves, too! It's led to this consideration of what I want to be called. After all, moving forward in life, it's a name that will have great significance for the rest of my journey. It will start with this little one who arrives in March who, hopefully, will be followed by many more along the way. Choosing the right name feels important!

Back in my childhood, I knew Grandpa and Grandma Martin plus Grandpa and Grandma Rudkin - I know, real unique, right?! Since then, it seems, people have been far more creative and intentional about a specific name they wear as a grandparent. For ladies, it's everything from Granny, to Gram, to Mimi, to Gigi, to Grammy, to Nana, etc. For men, it's a range from Papoo, to Pepaw, to Pop, to Papa, to Pops, to G-pa, to Papaw, etc. So, so many options. As this stage of life nears, I like that there are more fun and personalized names that are available, it seems to capture the significance of the relationship - not just a generic one, but one that represents the specific connection that you share with these special little people. (I'm so excited about so many aspects of this role!) I know that there is likely to be some change as grandchildren come to express whatever you pick in their own unique ways; yet, there has to be a starting point. That's what I've been mulling over.

Kristie's already settled on hers: Grammie (yes, with an -ie, just like her name); I like it and cannot wait to hear it uttered by a little one that belongs to one of our little ones. I still cannot decide. At one point, I started joking that if she's going by Grammie, then maybe I should be Oscar - you know, like the Grammy Awards for music and its counterpart for movies. Even though someone immediately connected it with a grouch who lived in a trash can, I still kind of like it. After all, it's unique, it's creative. Even as I process it all, though, here's what I know, my guess is that whatever this precious little girl ends up calling me, I'll proudly wear this new name, even if it changes somewhat along the way with her eventual sibling(s) and cousins whom we hope arrive. Why? Because when someone you care about gives and calls you by a name, it matters!

Twice in Revelation (in 2:17 and 3:12), Jesus promises to give "a new name" to those who overcome and remain faithful as this people. It's part of the eternal reward the offers. Amidst all the promises, why a new name? In the end, this is the point: because it's a reminder of the intimacy and relationship we share with thim - we belong to thim and the personally, specifically calls each of us this own for all eternity. Names matter; and this too is one we'll each wear proudly forever because it's what the the Lord of all has lovingly chosen for us.



CHECK-IN Process for our Kids' Ministries



We use a check-in process on Sunday mornings for those who are participating in our ministries for kids (birth through 5^{th} grade).

This is for those coming for the first time (it takes a little longer to provide some basic registration information) and for regulars.

REMINDER: We use this process for both time slots on Sundays so please check your kids in when you first arrive.

Sunday School Classes for kids (9:15am on Sundays)

We have kids' Sunday School classes as part of our regular weekly schedule. In addition to nursery for our youngest ones, we have classes for all ages of kids. These are meeting as normal during October - no "First Sunday CONNECTION" this month either.



Kids' Programming during ENCOUNTER (10:30am on Sundays)

Based on some changes we made earlier this Summer, here's what happens for kids 5^{th} grade and younger during this time slot.

Nursery, "Wee Kid ENCOUNTER" (newer - for two and three year-olds) and "Li'l Kid ENCOUNTER" (kids up through Kindergarten/1st graders - those in 1st grade have the option: here or in "Kid ENCOUNTER") are all available throughout our ENCOUNTER time.

ENCOUNTER (1st through 5th graders) meets <u>during the sermon portion of service</u>. Kids start with their families and then are dismissed at the appropriate time. Kid ENCOUNTER is meeting as normal throughout September.



Kid ENCOUNTER uses material from Answers in Genesis (we've used their VBS curriculum for the past few years). Each Sunday, students dive-in to God's Word, put Scripture in their hearts and learn how it applies to their everyday lives. This includes a memory verse each week as well. As is typical for AIG, there is even an "apologetics" emphasis attached to the content. During October, the lessons focus on Paul's third missionary journey.

FALL 2025 Wednesday evening CULTIVATE Plans for Kids

During the Fall Cultivate session. our kids ages 4 and through 6th grade participate in "Children of Praise." They spend their time on Wednesday evenings rehearsing songs, practicing drama and more, all in preparation for their annual Christmas performance (set for Sunday, December 14 during our 10:30am ENCOUNTER time). We are also making available some time on Sunday mornings - the last portion of our Sunday School class time - for kids to learn some of the songs then as well so they can be involved.



This year's program is called "Angel Alert!" It's the story of God's messengers waiting to be told when they could go to earth to make the grand announcement re: the Savior's birth Along the way, these angels review God's faithfulness as they anticipate His promises and prophecies coming true. Of course, they also celebrate His love being shown through the coming of the Messiah.

LES' LATEST



Fall is in the air and leaves are beginning to show some color. This ushers in a season of football games and homecoming festivities. **HOMECOMING** - it's an interesting word. Some schools will compete for originating the concept on their campuses, but here's an interesting historical event. In 1911, Mizzou's Athletic Director, Chester Brewer, asked alumni of the university to help

inaugurate the new location of their football field by "coming home" to attend the annual game against the University of Kansas. Brewer planned a celebration with parades, parties, a pep rally and then, of course, the football game. More than 10,000 alumni and fans attended the events, making Mizzou's homecoming an example for this special event across the country.

Homecomings are great times of remembrance and reconnecting, of sharing stories and seeing old friends. In Luke chapter 15, Jesus shares a homecoming story that lives in the hearts of His listeners. The story focuses on a rebellious son wanting to make his mark on the world with his dad's inheritance. Along the way, though, circumstances change when he irresponsibly squanders his resources and his situation becomes destitute.

When he finally came to his senses, he said to himself, "At home even the hired servants have food enough to spare, and here I am dying of hunger! I will go home to my father and say, 'Father, I have sinned against both heaven and you, and I am no longer worthy of being called your son. Please take me on as a hired servant." So he returned home to his father. And while he was still a long way off, his father saw him coming, filled with love and compassion, he ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him.

This familiar parable is a heartwarming illustration of reconciliation. It teaches us a very profound truth about forgiveness and repentance. Sometimes we think that our repentance somehow earns us God's forgiveness - if I do my part, God does His part. It is not quite like that. Our repentance simply allows God's prior offer of forgiveness to have practical effect. My repentance doesn't change God's desire to forgive, it just makes reconciliation possible. The father in this parable didn't stop loving his son. He didn't decide to be merciful as soon as he saw him from a distance. He had already chosen to be merciful; he had always wanted to act in love towards his wayward son.

The son's homecoming meant that mercy, forgiveness and love could be showered on him. My repentance is not the means by which I get God to forgive me. Repentance is not my attempt to persuade God to welcome me. It is a decision to receive that welcome which always awaits me. Repentance is homecoming and God's forgiveness is waiting for us there.

GROUP HUDDLE NEWS

"GROUP HUDDLE" is a weekly time (6-8pm on Sundays) for middle school and high school students who strive to love Christ and demonstrate His love to others. It offers a place for students to connect and dive into God's Word as they participate in meaningful small groups, worship and fellowship.

GROUP HUDDLE Focus for this semester: "No Other Name"

When you set up a password, there are usually a few sentences that explain what the password should contain (like at least one capital letter and a number). However, there are also websites that caution you against using important personal information as a password. Most often they explicitly tell you not to use your name as the password.



It says a lot about human nature that we have to be cautioned against using our own name as a way to unlock our social media, bank accounts and other important information. This semester, we are going to explore how Jesus' Name is the only name that brings salvation. We find ourselves "locked out" of eternal life because of our sin; and His is the only name that can save us. Join us Sunday nights as we embark on a new series entitled, "No Other Name."

GROUP HUDDLE MEALS:



<u>Each semester</u>, we ask parents to help defray the expense of feeding several hungry teens at Group Huddle. **We ask parents to send \$25 for each student** (that covers this semester, through December). Make checks payable to Southland. *You can also do this through Tithe.ly by*

choosing the "Group Huddle meals" option ... please also cover the fee for this if you are using this option (see p. 4 for more on using Tithe.ly).

Parent volunteers are also welcome/needed to help with meals; there is a sign-up sheet where you can sign-up to take a turn or you can simply talk to Les.

GROUP HUDDLE and CHILDREN'S MISSIONS:

Each semester, we identify a missionary or mission's organization we can support through the school year. This year, our mission partners are **Andy & Lisa (Husted) Nunn** who are part of a broader ministry called **"Discipleship Global."**

The Nunns are located in London. In July, they were here at Southland and presented their work to our students. They are currently assisting with a church-plant in London, conducting Bible studies and doing some one-on-one discipleship. They also have the opportunity to share the Gospel in the intermediate schools in London. Each Sunday this semester, our students will have the opportunity to pray for our mission partners and give during both "KidENCOUNTER" and Group Huddle Bible Study.





FOR MS/HS STUDENTS

SUNDAY SCHOOL (starts at <u>9:15am</u> on Sunday mornings): We have separate Sunday School classes for our MS and HS youth. *Both have moved to the Gathering Room (off of the Great Room; that room has a middle divider for when the classes meet separately as they will in October).*

These are meeting as normal in October and November, except for Sunday, October 5, when these students join our adult CONNECT Groups in the auditorium as Dr. Ajai Lall with C.I.C.M. is sharing about their work.

Wednesday Evening CULTIVATE (from 6:30-7:45pm each week): a study of the Gospel of Matthew, highlighting Jesus as the promised Messiah and King.

It's almost time again to "Get Lost" in the Giant Cornfield Maze in Aurora!

Wednesday evening, October 15 from 5-9pm - instead of CULTIVATE

Students from middle school and high school are going together this year (yes, we have worked it out so that younger students typically in C.O.P. will be able to attend).



Join your friends in testing your sense of direction at the giant cornfield maze. You can enter at dusk or wait until dark for the creepier journey. Enjoy delicious build-your-own sub sandwiches as well as s'mores over a fire pit.

Cost is \$15/student; that includes supper costs, the maze, life-sized boxing robots, a scenic hayride, mechanical bull and the cow train. *Invite your friends and be looking for a sign up-sheet.*

In the event of bad weather, regular CULTIVATE activities will take place instead.

FOR SENIOR HIGH STUDENTS

The 2025 College and Career Fair at Central High School Tuesday, October 7 from 5-7pm

Admission staff from over 60 colleges will be present; there will also be FAFSA/financial aid workshops, area business/job scouts and military branch representatives.



Due to space limitations, registration for the 2026 MOVE Conference (for the '26-'30 graduating classes) happens this Fall to ensure spots. Les has reached out with some details - dates, location, etc. - as we work toward reserving spots. We're trying to get a basic count by Sunday, October 5.

NOTE: We know it's early, but because of this, the first pre-registration (\$75) for next year's conference will be due Sunday, November 9.



It's officially fall! The temperatures are beginning to cool, and leaves are beginning to change colors on a few trees. Some leaves have begun to fall, though I suspect its more from the lack of rain than the normal pattern of leaves changing colors and then falling.

This last month has held some big events in my life. I suppose one could say it's been a changing of seasons, in a way, and maybe also signs of more changes to come.

We found out in August but were sworn to secrecy until recently – we're going to be grandparents! I know it's a natural step when you have kids who are grown and married, but this is a stage I have dreamed of with excitement for a long time! I adore babies, and, since having my own, I have eagerly anticipated a day when we would have a baby in the family again. There just isn't anything sweeter, if you ask me.

We are praising God for His goodness and thanking Him for this little blessing that we know will be a HUGE blessing to us. It has been fun to share the news with our church family and enjoy the excitement of others. I'm not sure how people celebrate big life moments if they don't have church family to help them celebrate! I've never known life without the blessing of friends at church.

Another big event came this past month with the news of my mother falling and fracturing her hip. I'm not in the medical field, but I know enough about life to understand that breaking a hip is a big deal. I was very sad and scared, and I felt helpless since my mom lives several hours away. I appreciate very much the prayers and support from many of you, my church family. The saga continues as this week my mom went back home after 3 weeks in a rehab facility. I appreciate your continued prayers, because we know the healing will take time and there are many things my family will need as they/we strive to keep my mom comfortable and upbeat in this process.

It's not the first time that I've wondered how people get through big changes, challenges and life events without faith in Jesus and a supportive church family. I know they do somehow, but I marvel at how difficult that would be.

Our faith is not a "pull it out and dust it off every Sunday" kind of faith. It is something that adds joy and dimension to happy times and exciting moments, and it also gives hope and peace in hard, challenging moments. It doesn't mean that we aren't concerned about real life practicalities or don't take action in the ways that we can. But it does mean we have the Holy Spirit's presence with us, giving strength and fortitude, even as we ride out our feelings and sometimes do the hard work that life requires.

I know many of you have stories of your own of life's ups and downs and how your faith in God sustained you through those. We encourage one another when we talk about those experiences and How God was faithful through them. We have his Spirit with us giving comfort and strength, and in the joyful moments we praise Him and exalt Him. In good times and hard times, may we echo the Psalmist who said:

An Outdoor "Acoustic Worship Night" at Southland Tuesday, October 21 @ 6:30pm


Here's a note from Kendall re: this evening ...

Our Upcoming Preaching Calendar



In September, we launched into our main Fall 2025 sermon series - an "exegetical" look at Paul's letter of **Colossians**. Moving forward into October,* we're continuing to make our way through this letter. As we reflect on what Paul wrote to these 1st century believers in Colossae, we're considering how that message speaks to us today in our context as 21st century followers of Jesus. As we've seen already in this series, Paul writes in this letter to combat a false teaching that is trying to

move people on past Jesus, striving to help his readers consider the place of supremacy (and sufficiency!) He should have in our ongoing lives of faith. It's what is captured in the "theme verses" of this letter, Colossians 2:6-7 - "just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, CONTINUE in Him." Paul then adds some clarifiers to that, including the imagery of being "ROOTED in Him," hence the sub-title for this series. In our lives of faith we don't "move on" from Jesus because He's the point! The rest of the letter helps us identify what being "Christ-ROOTED" looks like in a life of faith as His followers.

We'll be continuing this series through the end of October/early November. As always when working through a book like this, we encourage you to be reading through Colossians on your own during this time. We're excited for where we've already been on this journey and what's still ahead!

* A Reminder re: Sunday, October 5: We're taking a break in our Colossians series for this day as we welcome a special guest speaker. Dr. Ajai Lall from Central India Christian Mission (CICM, one of our global partners) is here with us for this morning. In addition to his sharing about their work during the 9:15am time slot, he'll also be preaching during our ENCOUNTER time. This is a great opportunity that became available and we are thankful for it.



The well-known BIBLE app (a.k.a. "YouVersion") is a great app for accessing God's Word electronically. There's also a feature within the app that we use during our ENCOUNTER time. It is simply called "EVENTS." It's a great way to follow along with the sermon and even take electronic notes. Please ask if you need help finding and/or using the app.



CONNECT GROUPS





One of our priorities here at Southland is to provide a context where relational family-like connections can develop. Because it's a prominent theme in the New Testament, we emphasize it within our process statement as a key way we can grow and be equipped in faith. That's a big part of what our CONNECT Groups are about - a small group relational setting for reflecting on God's Word and praying together.

At this point, our "regular" Connect Groups are meeting at 9:15am on Sundays (note: we also have Sunday School classes for all ages of kids/youth during this time). There's a half-sheet flyer at the Welcome Center listing our current groups, including a new one launched this Fall. With the group that's been added, we have good coverage across the various life stages/demographics: a group for college-age students (in Room #5) ... a group for young adults, entering the career stage (in the Fellowship Hall) ... a group generally made-up of those with young families (in Room #7) ... a group generally for those with older kids, even out-of-the-house by now, but who are still working (in the Great Room) ... a group generally for those who are in the retirement stage of life (in Room #6). Please don't hesitate to ask if you need help deciding which group is best for you; we'd love to help you find a place to get connected with others!

Connect Groups are meeting as normal each week during October (and, for that matter, November, too) except for Sunday, October 5. On this special day, we are hosting Dr. Ajai Lall from Central India Christian Mission. As part of his time with us, he is sharing during a combined 9:15am time.

To maximize our time with Dr. Lall on Sunday, October 5, we are not hosing a "First Sunday CONNECTION" time that morning. As a result, our next one will be on Sunday, November 2 at 10am.

We're looking forward to this opportunity and hope you plan to join us for the day!
- 2. Monday, October 13 through Wednesday, October, 22 a 10-day prayer campaign for the 10 countries with the most unreached people groups. This effort is "hosted" by Gospel Ambition, a global ministry (our partners in North Africa work as part of it). Part of their emphasis is mobilizing prayer for Jesus' global mission. The design is for people to sign-up for 15 minute slots for these 10 days, each day focused on a different country. A daily e-mail will provide information and guidance for that day's time of prayer. - 3. Sunday, November 2 We'll again be participating in the annual International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church.
