# DARING FAITH Faith is about taking the first step!

What should you do when you know something is God's will but you are scared to do it? Do it anyway! Faith is about taking the first step. You may be thinking, "But I am waiting on God to do something?" Has it ever occurred to you that God may be waiting on you?

Throughout the Bible we see this important truth: **The Holy Spirit releases His power the moment you take a step of faith.** When God told Joshua to cross the Jordan River, it was at flood stage. It was only after Joshua stepped into the river, that the waters stopped flowing and the whole nation of Israel crossed on dry ground.

God waits for you to act first. Move ahead, and do what God tells you to do regardless of your fears and feelings. Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians 5:7, "*We live by faith, not by sight.*"What is God asking you to do that you have not done yet?

Beginning on Sunday, September 13<sup>th</sup> through October 18<sup>th</sup>, you will have an opportunity to see how daring your faith really is. During these weeks, you will have an opportunity to assess where you are in your walk with the Lord. Each message and worship service will lead you to contemplate this personal question.

I am also asking all of our small groups that meet during the week to follow the **Daring Faith** study guide. If you are not involved in one of these groups, maybe you could be involved in starting a new one. Each of these sessions is scheduled with a 25-30 minute message from Rick Warren and a guided discussion from it.

I believe the emphasis on **Daring Faith** during this time in the life of FBC is appropriate. With the loss of Jay as our worship leader and the announcement of my retirement next year, I believe God wants to prepare us for the future reviewing what faith in Him really is and learning what He desires of us. Please be in prayer for this and for me as I pray for you.

Those same 60 people turned in 1902 volunteer hours. It was an incredible week that produced amazing results that will impact the way ministry happens on the island.

Unfortunately, or fortunately, depending on who you ask summer is coming to a close. As we turn the page on this past summer for FBC Galveston we cannot help but reflect and see that we are on the right path. We have been moving in the right direction, and that is due to the hard work and dedicated service of each of you who make up this church. An amazing summer is behind us and a very exciting fall is before us. We will be kicking off all of our activities and ministries right after Labor Day.
