

Holy Spirit Activate!

Numbers are important. No doubt all of us are aware of our age—it's not "just a number." We might not want to be aware of it, but our doctor wants to know our weight, and the numbers attached to our blood pressure, and any numbers that might be reported on our most recent blood test. Our banks look at our credit report when loaning us money. Numbers tell us, in tangible ways, how we're doing.

Would you like more numbers? Here are some numbers on the health of our church. Last year, we ended 2023 with an average of 604 persons in worship. This includes both in-person and online worship, and it compares to 534 in the previous year. A deeper dive will tell you that this year benefited by having Christmas Eve on a Sunday but we were up in ways that blow my mind, nonetheless.

As we have for many years now, we met our commitment to The United Methodist Church in giving 100% to apportionments, an amount that this year totaled \$129,750. Our Easter offering came in at \$18,620, and our Christmas offering of \$23,059, which surpasses the record set in 2020 by nearly \$2,500.

To date, we have collected \$1,188,095 toward our "Fast Forward" capital campaign. We are currently sitting on debt of \$393,577 and are projecting that at the end of our capital campaign in 2024, we will have a debt of just \$162,571. For a church whose annual budget is \$1,162,266, this is quite a manageable amount.

We also ended 2023 with 56 new members, grieved the death of 19 members, and celebrated the baptism of 5 persons. The number of new members, in particular, is amazing and should be celebrated with a bunch of high-fives!

And, while it's more antidotal, we are seeing a much longer list of guests (both first-time and returning). Did you know that immediately following Christmas Eve, we did something we've never done before? We taped an individual video welcoming persons and thanking them for their presence. And, while it's early, it seems to have paid off with a much higher percentage of first-time guests returning the last two Sundays!

To what do I credit all this good news that indicates such health among us? Certainly, the Holy Spirit most of all. The Spirit of God is moving among the people of First St. Charles in some absolutely fun and exciting ways. Additionally, our incredible staff's increased and creative efforts at outreach and marketing, that extend both internally and out into our community are clearly making an impact. A focused effort on gathering new people to Christ and focusing on our commitment that "there's room for everyone at the manger," lets ALL know that First St. Charles is a place that puts St. Charles <u>first</u> and continues to be a place where everyone is safe, welcome and wanted.


Thank you for being part of some really special Christmas magic this year.

Our partnership with Lincoln Elementary helps provide resources and support to one of the poorest schools in St. Charles City. Since our partnership began, Lincoln has been named a a National Blue Ribbon School.



Each month, we offer utility assistance and gasoline cards to people in St. Charles Country who are facing hardship. In October alone, we provided over \$2300 in utility and gas assistance. These funds are a lifeline that help keep the lights and heat on for families in need.




MINI MISSION TRIP JANUARY 20TH AT 12 PM




