

ONE MORE - Supernatural Provision

Summary

This week we focus on the second prayer of the ONE MORE campaign: 'Lord, what would you have me generously and cheerfully give to this initiative?' Using the miracle of feeding the 5,000 from the Gospel of Mark, Chapter 6, it is illustrated how we often withhold areas of our lives from God, particularly our finances, which can hinder His supernatural provision. But, God's strategy is to bring us to the end of ourselves and our resources so that we and everyone else can know the miracle is His doing and not our own. Our challenge is to trust God with our 'lunch' (whatever we have to offer) to believe that what seems small or insufficient to us is God's starting point for miracles.

Intro Prayer

Heavenly Father, as we gather together today, we ask that You would open our hearts and minds to what You want to teach us. Help us to set aside our preconceived notions and fears about *giving* and *generosity*. Lord, we pray that You would speak to each person according to their need and according to Your will. Give us ears to hear, hearts to receive, and the courage to respond in faith to whatever You are calling us to do. We surrender this time to You and ask that Your Spirit would move among us. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Ice Breaker

What's the most memorable packed lunch you ever had as a child, and was there anything in it you absolutely refused to share with anyone?

Key Verses

- Mark 6:30-44

Questions

1. What areas of your life do you find easiest to surrender to God, and which areas do you tend to 'negotiate' with Him about?
2. The disciples had just witnessed Jesus perform many miracles, yet they still doubted His ability to feed the crowd. How do we sometimes forget God's past faithfulness when facing current challenges?
3. Why do you think Jesus chose to use the boy's small lunch rather than create food from nothing? What does this teach us about how God wants to use what we have?
4. What fears or concerns do you have about giving sacrificially? How might these fears be hindering God's supernatural provision in your life?
5. Pastor Clay shared that he felt God saying this campaign is 'reward, not risk.' How might changing our perspective from risk to reward affect our willingness to give?
6. How can we move from asking 'Can we even do this?' to 'Can you believe we get to do this?' in our approach to God's calling on our lives?

Life Application

This week, spend time in prayer asking God specifically what He wants you to give to the ONE MORE campaign and who your ONE MORE is that He wants to reach for His glory. Don't rush to a comfortable number based on what you think you can afford. Instead, wait on God and be open to Him asking you to give an amount that requires faith and trust in His provision. Write down what you sense Him leading you to give and commit to following through, even if it seems impossible from your current perspective.

Ending Prayer

Lord Jesus, thank You for the example of the boy who gave his small lunch and saw You multiply it beyond imagination. Help us to trust You with our own 'lunch' - whatever resources, time, or abilities You've given us. Give us the courage to step out in faith, even when we don't understand how You'll provide. We don't want to be hindrances to Your supernatural provision, but rather willing participants in Your miraculous work. As we consider what You're asking us to give to One More, help us to see this as an opportunity to witness Your faithfulness rather than a risk to be feared. May our obedience bring glory to Your name and advance Your kingdom. In Jesus' name, Amen.
