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Working Behind the Scenes Today's Scripture: 1 Chronicles 10-16

"He leaves his house and puts his servants in charge, each with his assigned task, and tells the one at the door to keep watch." - Mark 13:34

A lot of Christians feel discouraged because they can't preach or sing or stand up in front of a group. Sometimes they begin to think their gifts and abilities don't count for much in the kingdom of God.

Nothing could be further from the truth. Over the years, I've been involved in hundreds of Christian conferences and church meetings. And while the speaker often gets the most attention, it is usually someone else who deserves the most credit. Someone sent invitations, handled the registration, prepared the room, and prayed for the Lord's blessing. The speaker stands on a platform of service provided by those who work unnoticed and out of sight.

In 1 Chronicles 12, we see that thousands of men, with a wide variety of gifts and abilities followed David and swore allegiance to him. Some were advisors and some were warriors. In the midst of their celebration of turning Saul's kingdom over to David, the Bible tells us that people came bringing provisions-flour, cakes of figs and raisins, wine, oil, cattle, sheep. And we read that there was joy in Israel.

Those who work behind the scenes have a ministry just as important as those who stand up front and lead. Perhaps God has given you a gift of ministry behind the scenes. If so, thank God for it and for its importance in the building of His kingdom.

I am writing this in the midst of Holy Week and all that we are doing and thinking and preparing for as Easter approaches. We are well into our Lenten "experiment" with two simultaneous worship service times, exploring how to strengthen the unity of our church as one body as we do this. I have sought your feedback in personal conversations during this time, and what I've seen and heard has been mostly positive. The Coffee Connection time has been a joy to behold! Lots of people, mingling, sitting, and standing while enjoying coffee and food. I can't say how much 'cross-pollination' is taking place between folks worshiping across the patio, but hopefully that's happening. Our first attempt at live-streaming the sermon from one building to the other had some hiccups – coordinating the service elements to coincide exacting at the same time when it came to the sermon was off by about 7 minutes, so that needs work...sound quality was an issue early on before it was corrected...and the picture quality was negatively impacted by my wearing a white shirt. So, things to work on if this has a chance to be a viable, sustainable strategy. We will have another chance at it on April 14 when I will be live-streamed from the Sanctuary to Wedaa Hall. After that, the Session, with input from the congregation, discuss how best to move forward.

NOTE: I will take one vacation week beginning April 21 (Sunday). That means I will be unavailable **Sunday–Saturday, April 21-27**, but back on Sunday the 28th. Mike Aguillon will preach on the 21st.

An update on the progress of **Rod's Fund** for camp scholarships. As of last Sunday (March 24), we have raised \$3,425! Thank you to everyone who has given so far. We didn't set a goal amount to raise, but in my mind was a figure somewhere between \$5,000 - \$10,000. So we're definitely on course to hit that first figure, and hopefully end up somewhere inbetween the two.

Not many suggestions came in for a name for our combined worship service. "Combined" Service was one, which is exactly what it is, so that might be a simple solution. "Fusion" Service was another. Fusion is used to refer to food that in cooking "incorporates elements of diverse cuisines," which gives a vibe that goes along with inevitable diversity of preferences within a congregation, and the idea of food and feeding aligns with what happens in worship. And then there is "Tapestry" service, which has the image of a variety of different colors and threads woven together into something beautiful. From the back side it looks rather random and messy, but the front reveals its inter-connected beauty. In the end, it's 'just' a name, and whether we ever decide on one is less important that what actually happens when we gather together.
