## DAILY ABIDING: TIME SET APART FOR GOD

Regardless of what you call time with God, such time is a core spiritual discipline in abiding with God.

Here are a few common terms:

#### MORNING WATCH.

This name conjures up the image of a watchman at his post early in the morning. All is still. No one stirs. He is alone with his thoughts and his God. Watchful and alert, he waits for the sun to rise. "My soul waits for the Lord more than watchmen for the morning, more than watchmen for the morning" (Psalm 130:6 ESV).

#### DEVOTIONS

Very simply, the term "devotions" speaks of our desire to live a life devoted to God. We set aside a portion of each day as an act of devotion. We reserve this time as holy, set apart for one thing: meeting with God.

#### APPOINTMENT WITH GOD.

Clearly, this indicates an arrangement to meet God at a particular time and place. It is a date, a rendezvous.

#### UIET TIME.

"Quiet" refers primarily to our heart's gaze rather than our physical setting. The idea is to silence our compulsive inner restlessness and come into God's presence. Although the ideal setting for a quiet time might be a hushed, serene spot, that isn't always possible. Quiet times are not always quiet. You can keep your date with God with children playing nearby; at other times, amid the buzz at a fast food restaurant, or on an airplane at 35,000 feet. The "quiet" in quiet time doesn't require physical silence, but there is no way to get around the "time" part. We must make time for God.



#### A Practical Plan the Four Rs

**Read:** Choose a book of the Bible and read a portion each day. Read slowly and thoughtfully.

Report: Make notes about what you read, engage yourself with what God has written to you.

**Reflect:** What difference does this Scripture make for you today? How might you apply any commands or instructions?

**Respond:** Talk to God. Let your reflection inspire your prayer.





#### **PASTOR CHARLIE**

As I approach the 2-month 'anniversary' of my time with you, I continue to get my feet more firmly planted beneath me. I have had numerous opportunities to spend time with individuals and groups, which has increased my sense of personal connection with you and my understanding of some of the challenges and opportunities before us.

One of these challenging opportunities became a Lenten season of gaining a deeper understanding of how our worship dynamic on Sunday morning can contribute to a greater sense of unity around our mission as a church and a better experience of that unity (in love) with one another 'across' the patio. Hopefully we will find some ways that will strengthen and further us in living into those goals, as well as become aware of ways that detract from that. What we experience and learn during this time I hope will be valuable in growing our worship experience together.

One of the things we tried on our first Sunday (last Sunday as I am writing this) was our **9:30 Coffee Connection.** I loved the way Sherry Grant and her team (Garry Grant, Cindy Baeza, and Sonya Wallin) transformed the Fireside Room in a welcoming and charming place to gather, to share morning coffee and treats, and enjoy the company of one another prior to worship. I also loved the turnout! Thank you for packing out the room and spilling into the patio! My only disappointment was that I didn't have more time to talk with more people. I especially enjoyed getting to talk to two of our youth for a little while. I'm thinking I need to get there earlier this week!

The other thing we did differently was start both worship services at the same time, with the preaching pastors remaining in both services for the entire time. I know that felt so much better to me that I was able to worship in song, in preaching, and in praying, as well as having some extra time with people afterwards. All in all, I felt it was a good start to Lent!

Looking ahead to the first Sunday in March, we have some special things lined up. First of all, it's **our combined worship service.** You may have noticed the term "One Church Service" has not been used lately. You can pin that on me. My first Sunday was that "one church" service, which caused a little hiccup in my spirit, because the immediate implication (to me, at least) was that we are *one church* on the first Sunday of the month, but not on the other three. What is implied is that when we worship as the Legacy and the Gathering we are *two churches,* instead of one church mutually supporting one another as we worship in *two different settings.* 

Hence, I've been calling it the "One Service" Sunday. The problem is, I don't like the name. It needs a name that doesn't describe what the service is, but who we are in that service. We are one church, but I would like something that captures a vision of the church a little differently. The words *Tapestry* and *Fusion* come to mind...but, I don't know. What do you think about a new name for that service?

OK, on to the other special things lined up in addition to the joy of all being together for worship and a meal, will be a **presentation by the youth on their winter camp trip** to Hume Lake. That will include music, personal testimonies, and a video or slide show. Also, on that **Sunday we will kick off the campaign to raise money for the Rod Hawkin's Memorial Scholarship Fund,** or *Rod's Fund* for short. There will be a special offering that day, which is intended to be over and above your regular giving to the church.

Last, we will have a **Called Congregational Meeting** immediately following the service to nominate and elect the three (3) remaining At-Large Nominating Committee members. Be sure you talk to whomever you want to nominate ahead of time to see if they are willing to serve, if elected.








