In the Fall, I was asked to speak at a "spiritual retreat" for in-country missionaries with Wycliffe Bible Translators. (We are huge fans and supporters of this ministry). Our Hebron Church elders have approved this call and time of service. We are being sent by you, Hebron Church, so thank you for being engaged globally with this endeavor. This small group of missionaries will be conducting a business meeting, fellowship gathering, and spiritual retreat with a guest speaker (aka - me!) They have not met live in person since before COVID. They are eagerly anticipating a rich time together in fellowship and productivity.

We will be seeking primarily to encourage, pray for, strengthen with the Word these missionaries. We will be living life with them at the capital city, Bangui, CAR. I will also preach at some local, indigenous churches. Finally, we were also asked to lead a marriage/family conference for a native CAR team of Bible translators. We will be busy and engaged! It's all very exciting.

work globally. There is now more Bible translation work in progress than ever before!

- There are currently 7,388 languages in active use worldwide.
- Only 724 of these have the complete Bible.
- 1,617 have a New Testament, and 1,248 languages have selections and stories.
- There is work in progress through Wycliffe missionaries happening in 3,266 languages.
- 1 in 5 people, speaking 5,509 languages, do not have the whole Bible in their first, heart language.
- 129 million people, speaking 1,680 languages, still need translation work to begin so the unreached can receive God's Word.

Pray, please pray, for God's work in this world and for Wycliffe missionaries.

If you have been paying attention to this space in past issues, you will know that we have been planning to meet approx. ½ of our planned budget deficit through asking the congregation at large to increase their giving by \$25/month. Through some very generous estate gifts in 2022, the other approx. ½ would be covered through transfers from Hebron's savings. A valid question is that with four months behind us, how are we doing?

We are pleased to report that we have seen good evidence of the people of Hebron putting their faith into action. We have been tracking recurring giving against a baseline that shows what sort of revenue we would need to make up that ½ of the deficit, and through 4 months we are over \$9000 ahead of our congregational support goal.

It is truly a blessing to see faithfulness in action. Thank you for your support thus far and what you will be able to do through the rest of 2023. It is amazing to see God working on so many hearts and stirring them into action.

To reflect this a little more accurately, we are changing how we report our progress. We are going to start adding in our planned transfers from savings (i.e. the other ½ of how we plan to meet our deficit) so we can track towards our goal through balance of 2023.

It primarily serves the administrative needs of our staff, but it also offers some exciting opportunities to support the way you are involved in our church. Not only will this improve work life for our ministry staff, it will make it easier for our church family to connect with each other, keep up with what's going on, and grow as a connected community of believers. Please note Access ACS will no longer be available for use starting on June 5 while we transition to Realm<sup>®</sup>. Online giving will still be available during this time.

In August online giving will be changing to Realm® as well. This will impact those who currently give online or have recurring giving set up. Stay tuned for the exact date this will take place, as well as new additional ways to give.

If you have a valid email address on file, you will receive an email on August 2 inviting you to set up a login for *Connect*. Once you've set up your *Connect* login you can stay connected to our church wherever you go by downloading the free *Connect – Our Church Community* app for iPhone and Android devices. Use it to communicate with your groups, RSVP to events, manage your giving, update profile information, and more.

Have questions? Need help? Want someone to assist with taking your *Connect* profile picture? Stop by the *Connect* Help Desk after either service on August 6 or August 13 and talk with a member of the Tech Team.

We are also excited to announce that work is underway on a new website and church logo.

Hey everyone! I just wanted to give a little PSA about VBS and how important it is for you to sign up and register ASAP. There is going to be a cut off for when I can guarantee that there will be T Shirts if you ordered them at registration. The longer you wait the less likely it will be that we will have one available for you during camp.

So, it is my hope that the majority (90%) of you would be registered by June 7th. It is actually my hope that we get there a lot sooner. We will have some scannable signs at the check in booth for kids for the next couple of weeks during Sunday school. It takes just a few moments to register and we hope that all of your kids and friends they would invite would be able to sign up ASAP. While we are making every effort to have things ready in advance, there are certain things that we cannot do until we are within 2 weeks of camp.

I know that a lot of people don't really know what they are doing until they get within the month of an event; but with the scope of something like VBS, here is a picture of what it looks like as we make the run up to VBS. Here are 11 reasons we need you to make the commitment to VBS ASAP. These are not in order of importance because they are all important and dependent on the amount of registrants.

- 1. Final orders for snack supplies
- 2. Final orders for craft supplies then printing and preparing them
- 3. Determining the proper groups kids will be in
- 4. Making sure the T Shirt order is complete
- 5. Determining which environments hold which aspects of VBS
- 6. Determining the number of leaders necessary for each environment
- 7. Printing and Preparing all of the Small Groups Activities for the week
- 8. Decorating is something that has to happen close to camp no matter what
- 9. Making sure that all of our check in and check out stuff is ready (orange tags)
- 10. Communicating final approach details with more efficiency because everyone is on the contact list
- 11. Clearances to work with kids take time to come back once they are requested

So, that is a peek behind the curtain. Help us give these kids the best experience possible by helping us and registering ASAP. Thank you so much!
