What influences you?

Psalm 1:2-3 says, "If you delight in the Law of God and meditate on it day and night you are like a tree firmly planted by streams of water." This lovely promise is that you will bear fruit in its season, your leaf will not wither, and whatever you do will prosper. Remember, the stream of water is the Gospel, and the delights are of the Lord. Psalm 36:7-8 says, "How priceless is your unfailing love! Both high and low among men find refuge in the shadow of your wings. They feast on the abundance of your house: you give them drink from your river of delights." It is our responsibility to send our roots deep into the river of His delights. The Law of the Lord is the Word of God. The Word of God can be trusted. It is truth.

One of the ways for us to drink from the river of His delight is to memorize and read Scripture often in our own private worship times. Another way to do that is to attend worship and participate corporately with the people of God. A third way to learn from the Scriptures is to attend one of the studies mentioned in this guide: Groves, Bible studies, All Moms and Look through the Scriptures. Whichever you choose, being in a study with others will help you grow, strengthen your faith, enable you to bear fruit, and produce in you a life lived more like Christ.

We have been declared righteous by Christ's blood, but we must pursue righteousness (right living) by the power of the Holy Spirit that is at work within us. And we can't do that without the Word of God. I Peter 1:23-25 says, "For you have been born again, not of perishable seed, but of imperishable, through the living and enduring Word of God. All men are like grass, and all their glory is like the flowers of the field; the grass withers and the flowers fall, but the Word of the Lord stands forever."

If you know the Word of God it will guide you when you walk, watch over you when you sleep, and speak to you when you are awake.

Look through the studies offered in this Guide. Find one that fits with your schedule and grow in your knowledge of and delight in God's Word.

SMALL GROUP BIBLE STUDIES

Bible studies are different from Groves by the length of commitment and the time in which they start and stop. They are also not advertised, but rather the leader contacts those interested in doing a study. Bible studies are just that - a study of a particular book in the Bible, a particular word or doctrinal theme.

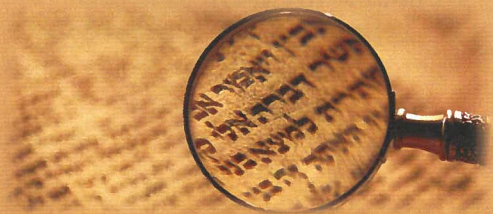
