enCompass Mission:

Set-up/Tear-down Volunteer

Purpose

Set-up/tear-down volunteers support the entire church body and staff at enCompass by preparing our spaces at Concordia for Sunday services and also packing and cleaning to prepare spaces for other events happening at Concordia.

Time Commitment

- For set-up, arrive at 7:30, usually takes 60 minutes. For tear-down, start approximately 10 minutes after the service, takes 30 minutes
- Serve once every 3-4 weeks

Ministry Tasks

- Coordinate schedule and availability via Planning Center Online
- Complete tasks efficiently
- Follow guidelines to ensure thoroughness and safety
- Task areas include: Lobby, Auditorium, kidZone & Connect meeting places
 - Specific task lists can be obtained from Darcy or Deron

Qualifications

- A heart for service and commitment to enCompass
- Able to handle physical demands of the role (some heavy lifting)

- Set-up/Tear-down Volunteers' primary contact is Darcy Mears, Children's Ministry Director and/or Deron Vaupel, Ministry Administrator
- Any questions, concerns, and challenges can be discussed with Darcy or Deron

Welcome Team Member

Purpose

Welcome Team members serve as the primary point of contact for people attending enCompass on Sunday mornings. Their energy and enthusiasm invite people in and set the tone for the rest of the morning.

Time Commitment

- Arrive at 9:40 to get situated, then greet people in the lobby until approximately 10:05
- Serve approximately once every 4-6 weeks

Ministry Tasks

- Coordinate schedule and availability via Planning Center Online
- For those at the front door, open the door for people and greet them with a warm smile and friendly hello
- For those at the auditorium door, hand out bulletins and greet people with a warm smile and friendly hello
- Be aware of people who may be newer to enCompass and be proactive about introductions and answering any questions they might have
- Welcome Team members usually hand out pens during announcements, but this is not mandatory

Qualifications

- Timeliness
- Friendly, helpful demeanor

EnCompass Café Team Member

Purpose

Café team members provide the essential fuel for those attending enCompass Church on Sunday mornings. Their efforts create an environment where people are able to connect with others in meaningful ways before and after Sunday services.

Time Commitment

- Usually 8AM - 11:30AM, one Sunday morning a month

Ministry Tasks

- Purchase food supplies on the Sunday when volunteering – this involves a trip to Cub Foods to buy the supplies on the Sunday morning when the volunteer is managing the café – a church debit card is used to purchase supplies. Usually the supply list includes doughnuts & coffee creamer, but sometimes includes a few other items that may be needed for a particular Sunday
- Be willing to volunteer about 1 Sunday per month
- The volunteer is responsible for the setup, clean up and tear down of the café each Sunday when they work
- Communicate with other Café volunteers to coordinate schedules and availability to work in Café
- Be able to occasionally fill in for others and be willing and able to alter start & end volunteering times depending on what is happening at church on a particular Sunday
- Interact with church visitors and regular attenders that use the Café
- Brew approximately 8-10 pots of coffee per Sunday
- Keep café food & coffee supplies stocked when café is open
- Alert Café Coordinator if additional supplies are needed

Youth Sunday Connect Leader

Purpose

Youth Sunday Connect Leaders welcome Jr./Sr. High Students into a warm and engaging environment and facilitate discussion that is focused on their ever-deepening relationships with Christ.

Time Commitment

- 1-2 hours of preparation and communication during the week
- On Sunday mornings, arrive at 8:45 for final prep with Connect running from 9:00-9:50

Ministry Tasks

- Get theme, curriculum, game, and small group questions from the Ministry Administrator. Review and revise as needed to best connect with students.
- Pray throughout the week that God will use your time with the students to help them belong, grow and serve in their faith in Jesus Christ.
- Ensure you have all the supplies assigned to the week's curriculum.
- Arrive at 8:45am to ensure the room is set up and any media devices are working properly.
- The typical order of your Sunday morning session:
 - Breakfast & Conversation: 15 minutes
 - Game/Mixer/Ice Breaker: 10 minutes
 - Teaching video: 12-15 minutes
 - Small group discussion: 15-20 minutes
 - Closing conversation, dismiss: 5 minutes
 - Invite the students to the following Sunday and/or future events.

- Genuine interest in the lives and faith of our Jr./Sr. High Students.
- Willingness to adapt to the needs and questions of the students.
- Ability to speak with warmth, clarity and enthusiasm.

- Any questions, concerns and challenges can be discussed with Kevin
- Curriculum and small group questions come from Deron Vaupel, Ministry Administrator

Adult Sunday Connect Group Facilitator

Purpose

Adult Sunday Connect Group Leaders gather a group of 10 to 30 people who meet together almost every week to actively offer each other support and encouragement while pursuing an important ministry goal.

Time Commitment

- 5-10 hours of preparation and communication during the week
- On Sunday mornings, arrive at 8:45 for final prep with Connect running from 9:00-9:50

Ministry Tasks

- Develop a listing of those you will recruit and seek to welcome into your group. (The church staff can assist you with determining those who might be interested in your group.)
- Offer all the essential group information to the church staff:
 - The name of your group
 - The purpose of your group
 - The benefits of participating in your group
 - Your contact information
- Show up early to all group meetings, end group meetings on time
- Pray regularly for your group members
- Identify and develop others in your group who are gifted to serve as future Connect Group Leaders
- Faithfully participate in enCompass Leadership Lunches
- Regularly invite new attenders into your Connect Group

Qualifications

- An attractive and growing relationship with Jesus Christ
- A thorough understanding of Christian beliefs and theology
- Ability to effectively invite, welcome and build regular relationships with those interested in your group
- A personal desire to create a growing and dynamic group that supports the core themes of enCompass Church

- Any questions, concerns and challenges can be discussed with Kevin

Sunday Connect Sub-Group Leader

Purpose

A Connect Sub-group leader supports the spiritual growth and learning of a group of 3-7 participants by actively facilitating meaningful discussion, sharing and interaction.

Time Commitment

- 15-30 minutes of preparation during the week
- Sundays, 8:45-10:00am (approximately 30 weekly meetings per year)

Ministry Tasks

- Review topic and discussion questions prior to each Sunday meeting.
- Arrive 10 minutes early in order to warmly welcome those who will join your group (Your group members will likely rotate throughout year)
- Work diligently and thoughtfully to actively involve all group members in discussion
- Follow-up after group meetings with participants that expressed a significant need or concern.

Qualifications

- A heartfelt desire to see others grow and learn
- An ability to facilitate meaningful discussion
- A desire to effectively welcome others help them relax and enjoy the learning opportunity

Supporting Structure

- Connect Sub-Group Leaders interact with and report to Sunday Connect Group Leader/Teacher
- Any additional questions or concerns can be discussed with Kevin Thomas, Lead Pastor

kidZone Volunteer

Purpose

kidZone volunteers serve the children of enCompass by helping them find a sense of belonging and a growing faith. They support the Teacher/Leads in one of three classrooms: Nursery (birth - 2 years old), Preschool (3 - 5-year old's) and Elementary (K- 5th grade).

Time Commitment

- Arrive at 9:40 on volunteer Sundays, usually finished by 11:20
- Volunteer approximately once every 6 weeks

Ministry Tasks

- Coordinate schedule and availability via Planning Center Online
- Cultivate relationships with Teachers/Leads
- Support separating children and parents with love and patience (the art of distraction)
- Actively participate in the curriculum and care of our kids at enCompass including:
 - Worship
 - Story time
 - Lessons
 - Games
 - Crafts
 - Bathroom breaks & diapering
 - Discipline as needed

Qualifications

- An attractive and growing relationship with Jesus Christ
- A heart for children and learning
- Have attended enCompass for 6 months or more
- Pass a background check and sign off on policies/procedures for safety
- Follow guidelines to ensure safety and security

kidZone Teacher/Lead - 9 AM Connect

Purpose

kidZone teachers/leads for 9 AM Connect provide a very important service to our families. Teacher/Leads in classrooms with Birth – 5th graders are responsible for the safety, security, and spiritual growth for our children at enCompass. Teachers/Leads invest in two core themes; helping the children/families belong to the community and encouraging growth in their faith.

Time Commitment

- 1-2 hours of preparation and communication during the week
- On Sunday mornings, arrive at 8:45 for final prep with Connect running from 9:00-9:50

Ministry Tasks

- Maintain quality communication with Director and all staff
- Support separating children and parents with love and patience (the art of distraction)
- Prepare lessons and materials each Sunday – currently Orange, available on-line
- Actively participate in the curriculum and care of our kids at enCompass including:
 - Worship, Story time, Games, Crafts
 - Lessons
 - Bathroom breaks and/or diapering
 - Discipline as needed
- Make consistency of programming a priority for the kids
- Plan to connect with the kids and their families as often as you can
- Be prepared to work with adult volunteers and/or Youth volunteers who may serve with you for your support. Volunteers may need guidance and patience. Be the Boss!
- Participate in Leadership Lunches and opportunities

kidZone Teacher/Lead – 10 AM

Purpose

kidZone teachers/leads provide a very important service to our families. Teachers/Leads invest in all three core themes; helping the children/families belong to the community, encouraging their growth in faith and welcoming the adult volunteers.

Time Commitment

- Arrive at 9:40 to assist with setup of classroom and do any final lesson prep
- Assist with tear down, usually done by 11:30

Ministry Tasks

- Maintain quality communication with Director and all staff.
- Coordinate schedule and availability via Planning Center Online
- Support the organization and cleanliness of our storage area and building.
- Support separating children and parents with love and patience (the art of distraction).
- Prepare lessons and materials each Sunday – currently Orange, available on-line.
- Actively participate in the curriculum and care of our kids at enCompass including:
 - Worship, Story Time, Games, Crafts
 - Lessons
 - Bathroom breaks & diapering
 - Discipline as needed
- Make consistency of programming a priority for the kids
- Plan to connect with the kids and their families as often as you can

Worship Team Musician

Purpose

Worship Team Musicians, along with the Worship Leader, invite and guide the enCompass community in to genuine and authentic worship.

Time Commitment

- Plan to arrive at 7:45 to complete any necessary setup with rehearsal starting at 8
- Assist with tear down, usually done by 11:30
- Frequency of involvement is determined by desired availability and how often specific musicians are needed

Ministry Tasks

- Coordinate schedule and availability via Planning Center Online
- Listen to and practice the songs before each Sunday Service so you feel confident in your role for that service
- Come to rehearsal prepared with whatever you need to fill in your specific role. Chord charts will be provided.
- Assist with tear-down at the end of the service. This is usually done by 11:30.
- Represent a Christ-like attitude at enCompass. As you lead people into worship at enCompass, you are representing Christ, our desire to be in God's presence, and the ministry of enCompass.

Qualifications

- An attractive and growing relationship with Jesus Christ
- Ability to perform their instrument or voice to the best of their ability on a Sunday morning, with obvious exceptions (illness, injury, etc...)
- Ability to read the worship chord charts that are given out as guidelines for each song
- Being prepared for each Sunday they are playing

Supporting Structure

- Worship Team Musicians' primary contact is Brett Carey, Worship Leader
- Any questions, concerns and challenges can be discussed with Brett and Deron Vaupel, Ministry Administrator

Announcement Team Member

Purpose

A morning announcement team member enthusiastically invites Sunday morning attenders to belong, grow and/or serve at enCompass Church through our groups, ministries and events.

Time Commitment

- Plan to arrive at 9:45 to participate in our pre-service prayer gathering
- Spend approximately 30-45 minutes prior to Sunday morning structuring and rehearsing what you will be announcing

Ministry Tasks

- Get list of announcements and supporting details from the church staff, usually Friday afternoon
- Pray throughout the week that God will use these announcements to help others belong, grow and serve at enCompass
- Start announcements with a personal introduction. Usually people include how long they have been a part of enCompass and one facet of our church they greatly enjoy or appreciate
- Clearly communicate all announcements, including information about Connection Cards and Offering.

Qualifications

- An attractive and growing relationship with Jesus Christ
- Ability to speak with warmth, clarity and enthusiasm
- A personal desire to help others become more active participants in the ministry of our church

Supporting Structure

- Announcement team members' primary contact is Deron Vaupel, Ministry Administrator
- Any questions, concerns and challenges can be discussed with Deron

Tech Team Member - Audio

Purpose

The audio volunteers run the soundboard during rehearsal and services on Sunday mornings, striving to create a distraction-free environment where people can engage in worship.

Time Commitment

- Arrive at 7:15 (may be later depending on the week) for set-up and assist with tear down, usually done by 11:30

Ministry Tasks

- Coordinate schedule and availability via Planning Center Online
- Oversee all audio aspects of sound check, rehearsal, and service
- Develop a familiarity with enCompass' sound system (stage, board, rack, and video)
- Troubleshoot any issues that arise during sound check, rehearsal, and service
- Mix sound at an appropriate level (be around for a couple services and you'll pick it up)
- Assist with teardown of auditorium

Qualifications

- Reliably able to arrive on time
- Experience running a sound board is preferred
- Has strong troubleshooting skills
- Able to interact well with pastor & worship leader
- Responds well to constructive feedback
- Timely communication

Supporting Structure

- Report to the Tech Team Lead
- As needed, individuals from the Set-up/Tear down team can assist with tasks in the auditorium

Tech Team Member - Graphics & Lights

Purpose

The Graphics & Lights volunteers support Sunday services by operating the computer and light board in the tech booth, striving to create a distraction-free environment where people can engage in worship.

Time Commitment

- Arrive at 8:30 (may be later depending on the week) and assist with tear down, usually done by 11:30

Ministry Tasks

- Coordinate schedule and availability via Planning Center Online
- Work with speaker and worship leader to ensure accuracy of slides
- Edit any slides for readability and coordinate backgrounds with lighting
- Lead final service walk-thru at 9:45. Gather all involved, make sure everybody knows what's happening and when
- Record the service using the digital camcorder that is set up in the tech booth
- Troubleshoot any issues with computer, projector, lights, and video broadcast setup
- Coordinate with sound tech for any video/audio integration during service
- Assist with teardown of auditorium

Qualifications

- Competency in ProPresenter, light board, and video broadcast setup
- Attention to detail
- Able to multi-task
- Timely communication

Supporting Structure

- Report to the Tech Team Lead
- As needed, individuals from the Set-up/Tear down team can assist with tasks in the auditorium

Communion Set-up Team

Purpose

The Communion Set-up Team serves the enCompass community by working behind the scenes to prepare the elements on Sundays when we receive communion.

Time Commitment

- Arrive at 9:15 to set up elements and stay after the service to clean up items, approximately once a month

Ministry Tasks

- Coordinate schedules and specifics of set-up with Deron Vaupel, Ministry Administrator
- Set up elements in an orderly and sanitary manner
- Notify Deron of any supplies needed

Qualifications

- Reliable
- Attention to detail

Supporting Structure

Communion Set-up team's primary contact is Deron Vaupel, Ministry Administrator

Offering Counter

Purpose

Offering Counters handle the various responsibilities that come with receiving a weekly offering. By following clear processes for counting and handling money, their service gives the enCompass community assurances of the accuracy and legitimacy of our accounting.

Time Commitment

- 10-15 minutes after Sunday service, approximately once every 3 weeks

Ministry tasks

- Along with a second counter, collect the offering at the end of service
- Independently count offering and confirm total with second counter
- Record information on provided tally sheet
- Give funds to Recording Secretary for deposit

Qualifications

- Flexible, honest, and able to maintain confidentiality

Support Structure

- Offering Counters primary contact is Caren Nicholson, Recording Secretary

PlanNerds Team Member

Purpose

The PlanNerds are responsible for planning and executing various events for the enCompass community throughout the year. These events focus on welcoming and inviting people in to the enCompass community.

Time Commitment

- 2-3 hours of preparation in advance of an event
- 2-3 hours on the day of an event

Ministry Tasks

- Work with a team to plan various events for enCompass community
- Provide support for each event throughout the year
- Take the lead on approximately one event each year
- Work with the team to develop new events

The current schedule of events is:

- Welcome Lunches (as needed)
- Fall Family Fun Festival (October)
- Christmas Celebration (December)
- Year-End Celebration (June)

Qualifications

- A passion for the core values of enCompass Church and seeing those values fulfilled in the various events that are planned.
- Able to work well in a team environment
- Able to discern what events will fit the ethos of enCompass
- Timely communication via e-mail and phone
- Able to follow budget guidelines for particular events.

Supporting Structure

- The PlanNerds primary contact is Deron Vaupel, Ministry Administrator
- Depending on the event, other staff members may have extremely helpful input and experience

Connect Group Leader

Purpose

A Connect Group Leader gathers a group of 5 to 15 people who meet together at least one time a month to actively offer each other support and encouragement while pursuing at least one foundational ministry theme of enCompass: Belong, Grow, and/or Serve

Time Commitment

- 1-3 hours weekly for preparation, communication, and connection

Ministry Tasks

- Determine the purpose of your Connect Group. Your group must reflect one or more of the core themes of enCompass Church: Belong, Grow, Serve
- Develop a listing of those you will recruit and seek to welcome into your group. (The church staff can assist you with determining those who might be interested in your group)
- Work with church staff member to determine best choice for group curriculum
- Offer all the essential group information to the church staff: name of your group, purpose of your group, benefits of participating in your group, your contact information, and day/time/place of group meetings
- Call/email and/or text current and potential group members at least 24 hours before each group meeting
- Show up early to all group meetings and end group meetings on time
- Pray regularly for your group members
- Identify and develop others in your group who are gifted to serve as future Connect Group Leaders
- Faithfully participate in enCompass Leadership Lunches
- Regularly invite new attenders into your Connect Group

Qualifications

- An attractive and growing relationship with Jesus Christ
- Ability to effectively invite, welcome and build relationships with those interested in your group.
- A personal desire to create a growing and dynamic group that supports the core themes of enCompass Church

Supporting Structure

- Connect Group Leaders primary contact is Kevin Thomas, Lead Pastor
- Any questions, concerns and challenges can be discussed with Kevin
- Connect Groups meet for at least one season (Fall, Winter, Spring, Summer) and can be renewed with endorsement from Kevin and/or church staff members.

Student Ministry Volunteer

Purpose

A Student Ministry Volunteer Leader invests time in developing friendships with a small group (2-4) of middle or high school students. These friendships are designed to encourage and support the development of their lifelong Christian faith.

Time Commitment

- 2 hours each Sunday—looking for a variety of ways to connect with students throughout our Sunday morning events and activities
- 2 hours per week: connecting with students via text, social media, or face-to-face

Qualifications

- A natural affinity for teenagers
- An awareness of the unique needs and concerns of middle school or high school students
- Exceptional listening and solid conversational skills
- A flawless record of personal conduct with minors
- Initially participate in personal interview with Student Ministry Pastor

Ministry Tasks

- Be responsive to the training and instruction available through Student Ministry Pastor.
- Use Sunday mornings to continue to make contact and further develop friendships with your students.
- Make weekly connection with your students through text, social media, or face-to-face conversations.
- Pray for the needs of your students on a weekly basis.

Supporting Structure

- All student ministries volunteers are trained, led, and supported by our Student Ministry Pastor.

Prayer Support

Purpose

The Prayer Support individuals provide a special service to the enCompass community. Whether it's joining others in prayer after a Sunday service or connecting during the week to provide extra support and encouragement, these individuals work to help all at enCompass more fully live out the values and mission of the church.

Time Commitment

- 10-15 minutes after Sunday services (as needed)
- 60-90 minute monthly gatherings

Ministry Tasks

- Regularly available to support others on Sunday mornings for 10-15 minutes after the service
- Commit to regular prayer for the weekly prayer list
- Be available (as needed) for other specific prayer support throughout the week (meetings, phone calls, prayer request list, etc.)
- As needed, commit to serve up front during services, per Kevin's request

Qualifications

- Committed to following Christ and listening to the leading of the Holy Spirit
- Able to handle sensitive personal situations with tact

Support Structure

- Prayer Support team's primary contact is Lisa Vaupel
- Additional input and support comes from Kevin Thomas, Lead Pastor, as needed

Community Service Team Member

Purpose

Community Service Team Members work with others at enCompass to serve the needs of those outside of our church. Through these efforts, we strive to express the grace of God to our local community.

Time Commitment

- 4-6 evening meetings per year
- 2-10 hours of volunteer time invested per service project (about 3 per year)

Ministry Tasks

- Participate in team meetings, offering input, evaluation, and recommendations for effectively serving the needs of others in our local community
- Use your personal abilities, energy, and/or resources to assist in the completion of church-wide service projects
- Pray for the needs of the group and the needs of those we serve

Qualifications

- A heartfelt desire to serve others
- Ability to collaborate with others in a team effort
- A willingness to serve without receiving personal credit or attention

Supporting Structure

- The Community Service Team is led and supported by the Community Service Team Leader
- Any additional questions or concerns can be discussed with Kevin Thomas, Lead Pastor

Community Service Team Leader

Purpose

The Community Service Team Leader gathers and organizes a team that serves the needs of those outside of our church community. Through these efforts, we strive to express the grace of God to our local community.

Time Commitment

- 4-6 evening meetings per year
- 2-10 hours of volunteer time invested per service project (about 3 per year)
- 2-3 meetings per year with Lead Pastor to discuss current and future team plans

Ministry Tasks

- Communicate team plans and meetings to all interested members of the Community Service Team
- Set agenda and effectively facilitate team meetings
- Work with the church staff to coordinate future plans and promotional efforts of Community Service Team efforts
- Evaluate and adjust team plans as deemed necessary by team members and church staff
- Ensure team members celebrate service opportunities and accomplishments
- Occasionally participate in Sunday morning announcements to offer updates and invitations

Qualifications

- A heartfelt desire to serve others
- A welcoming attitude to new team members
- Ability to effectively organize and lead team meetings
- Ability to focus and organize the collaborate efforts of the team members
- A willingness to serve without receiving personal credit or attention

Supporting Structure

- The Community Service Team Leader's primary contact is Kevin Thomas, Lead Pastor
- Interacts with and is supported by entire church body

Sheridan Story Friday Volunteer

Purpose

Sheridan Story Friday Volunteers help deliver food for the weekend to select students at Central Park Elementary School. We collaborate with this ministry to demonstrate Jesus' love and care for families in our local community that struggle with a lack of food.

Time Commitment

- 1 hour per month, maximum, usually 10-11AM on the first Friday of each month
