Faith Promise Commitment Sunday, November 19


In the next weeks during our Faith Promise emphasis, we will focus on the Bible teachings about our attitude toward our money and our things. These practices of how to better manage our finances, will strengthen families, and prepare us as we make our Faith Promise commitments for 2024. Our theme, "Too Much...Living with Less in the Land of More" will teach us practices, that when applied, will lead to financial peace in our lives.

A "Faith Promise Commitment" is a prayerfully-arrived-at decision of how much of one's income to give back to the Lord's work. It is a sacrificial amount beyond what one can "safely" afford to give. It is a faith covenant with God, committing beyond what one can see to give, with the understanding that God is to provide the funds as we step toward Him in faith.

If a family or individual has determined to tithe its income and give God \$5,000 in the coming year, they might consider increasing their Faith Promise commitment to \$5,600 for the year seeking to rely on God to provide and enable giving the additional \$600 that constitutes a step of faith beyond what can be tangibly afforded to give.

You stand to gain the most when you make a Faith Promise. A card is enclosed on which you will be asked to state your commitment. This is done confidentially. You need not sign your name. For the next few weeks, please place the card in a place where you will see it often. Pray earnestly that God will lead you in your decision, then on November 19, Faith Promise Commitment Sunday, these cards will be received during our worship services.

"Faith Promise" is a time of personal soul-searching as we each ask, "Lord, what would You have me give to Your work at BCC in 2024?" It is a time of heightening our vision as we consider what God can do through us in Batesville, in the surrounding communities, and around the world. Be praying for this time of spiritual growth as individuals and as a church family.
