

Hey there! Pastor Gerber here again. Welcome back.

Today we're on to Commandment #5. But let's review really quickly. You shall have no other gods before me. You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God. Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. Honor your father and your mother. And now, you shall not murder.

What does this mean? (And here comes your extra memory assignment for this session) We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body, but help and support him in every physical need.

I want you to look at these situations that are written out for you. Take a look at the accompanying verses as well. Then decided if that act is or isn't murder according to the Bible or if the Bible doesn't say. Be careful, though. Just because there isn't an accompanying verse with an act doesn't mean that it's not pretty obvious whether or not that act is murder.

Press pause until you have completed that.

Ok. Welcome back.

We'll start with a tough question. Is it possible to be angry, but not sin? Well, look at the verses that you just read. Anyone who is angry with or hates another is a murderer. Notice, if you're angry with someone it's murder of words. But what if you're angry that your car won't start? Is that a sin? No. As long as you're not angry at someone else for forgetting to put gas in or you're not angry at the person who put the motor together. It is possible to be angry without sinning.

So, how do we stand for life? First, it's important to remember who the real enemy is. Look up Ephesians 6:12 and write down whom the enemy is on your worksheet.

You can pray for an love those around you. You can be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other just as God forgave you in Christ.

The main point today is that you should support and love your neighbor.
