WELCOME AND MEMBERSHIP: Welcome to worship at Orange Park Presbyterian Church! There are Connect Cards in the pews for visitor information, communications, and prayer requests (once completed, place in the offering plate). If you would like to talk with Pastor Sandra about becoming a church member, please note that on the card, and she will reach out to answer your questions.

BULLETIN COVER: The bulletin image is a mosaic in the Pfarrkirche Kaisermühlen, a church in Vienna constructed at the end of the 19th century in the style of a Romanesque basilica. The mosaic of Mary is framed by images of the disciples. Over her head is a mosaic of two angels holding a crown.

CHILDREN'S CHURCH AND NURSERY: Children's Church is for ages 4 through 13 and takes place right after the children's message. Our nursery is open upon request for the younger ones.

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING: A congregational meeting will be held after worship today for the purposes of (1) hearing the final report of the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) and to elect the church's next full-time installed pastor and (2) electing ruling elders to serve in terms beginning January 1.
