BULLETIN IMAGE: "The Lord's Prayer" (1872) is the work of Louis Prang & Co. (American, 1824 - 1909). Louis Prang was a printer, lithographer, and publisher. He is sometimes known as "the father of the American Christmas Card." Prang was born in Prussian Silesia and emigrated to America in 1850. After his initial success in printing, Prang went to Germany to learn newer lithography techniques. The rest is history: faithful reproduction of major art works, album cards for scrapbooks, greeting cards, and books for art instruction.
