



November 2nd - 9th

Social Justice & Mission together with **Faith Formation** are pleased to be hosting two very special guests during one very special week of Fellowship and Discipleship Development for **First Presbyterian Church!**

This November, FPC will be welcoming back long-time mission partner, **Mirna Pérez** of **Juntos Guatemala**. We'll get to hear updates from Mirna on the evolving work Juntos has been coordinating in the remote region of Ixcán, as well as exciting new developments underway in San Antonio Aguas Calientes.

In conjunction with Mirna's visit, we have also invited her brother, **Gerber Pérez**, as guest speaker. Gerber is an experienced educator and leader in community development and collaborative cross-cultural mission. He has been an effective guide and teacher for multiple North American groups and service teams over the past 15 years, including several of our first service teams. We are very excited to bring Gerber's engaging presence and nuanced awareness of outreach to our larger FPC family, and into the broader community.

- During their visit, Mirna and Gerber will also get to spend some dedicated time with both our Youth and Midweek kids. Then on Wednesday evening, Gerber will serve as our guest speaker during a Midweek Fellowship Dinner in Blair Hall (childcare will be available). On Sunday, Nov. 9th, the Pérez siblings will conclude their time with us by leading us through Sunday Worship.
- While in Salina, Mirna and Gerber will also be speaking to Salina Rotary, engaging with local healthcare professionals during a Lunch-n-Learn, exploring our local partnership with Salina Grace Resource Center, and touring the facilities of both Salina Grace and the Emergency Aid Food Bank, and joining us in celebrating Salina's Women of Achievement.



"WE GIVE WITH GRATEFUL HEARTS AND GENEROUS SPIRITS."

Our 2026 Stewardship Season is making use of what we learned from Bruce Reyes-Chow's book <u>Everything Good about God Is True</u>, specifically the chapter titled "Generous". While Webster's Ninth New Collegiate Dictionary defines "generous" (characterized by a noble or forbearing spirit, liberal in giving, marked by abundance or ample proportions), Bruce Reyes-Chow centers generosity in the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. "Simply put," he writes, "we can be generous because God has been generous to us."

Bruce goes on to say, "that the abundance of life that we are given by Jesus' life, death, and resurrection can change how we live. Out of the gift of new life, humanity is compelled, commanded, and convicted to be generous: generous beyond our imagination and beyond the expectations of the world. Radical generosity flows out of the idea that there are enough resources for all of us to thrive. ... Jesus' life, death, and resurrection were acts of generosity that push us to reimagine abundance, scarcity, and what is enough."

When I think about abundance, scarcity, and what is enough I think about how our congregation has responded to the needs of our community, both those who are part of our congregation and our neighbors throughout Salina and outside of Kansas. I think about how we have spent the past few years growing in relationships by coming together for Dinners for Eight and this summer's activities when Bruce Reyes-Chow visited. One of the repeated responses was how good it felt to be doing something together as a congregation.

We have also been responding to the scarcity with which the wider culture tempts us by finding new ways to be led by Christ, together in faith and love, as we look forward to a November visit from our mission partners from Guatemala and have partnered with area farmers to fill our freezer with our neighbors' needs in mind. Together we are pushing back against a mindset that says there is never enough by witnessing to the abundance of new life in Christ as we generously offer our time and abilities through our congregation's ministry and mission.

As our Stewardship Season unfolds, I hope you will see how we are witnesses to God's abundance in Jesus Christ both in worship and through the different materials that have been created to help us all think about what it means to be generous.

How have you witnessed our congregation approach giving based on the new life we are offered through our risen Lord, Jesus Christ? How would you finish the sentence, "I choose generosity...?" Hopefully your answer reflects the Gospel, as Bruce Reyes-Chow puts it, "We give because we are grateful, and because it brings us joy to give." May this be a season when we all, with our time, talents, and treasure, help bring the abundance of God's love in Jesus Christ to fullness in and through the life and ministry of Salina, First Presbyterian Church!

SESSION SEPT 15. 2025 MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

- Received reports from the Clerk and standing committees including a financial report from the Treasurer. The report of the annual financial review for 2024 conducted by Varney & Associates was accepted.
- Approved the recommendation to continue the Board of Pension health insurance plan for 2026 for eligible employees.
- The Building & Grounds committee has accepted a bid for installation of new lights that will focus on speakers in the pulpit and lectern areas and power switches for the sanctuary. Work is nearly complete on installation of sound suppression units that are attached below the sanctuary pews to help eliminate echoing and distortion of sound.
- The all-church picnic is Sept 28 at a local pumpkin patch. Planning has begun for the 2026 Heartland Day Camp.
- Long time mission partners from Guatemala will visit in early November. Gerber Perez will be a guest lecturer on Sunday, Nov 9.Several community engagements are also arranged.
- The annual FPC stewardship campaign will begin Sept 28. Church leaders have been asked to consider their financial commitment and respond before October 1.
- Offered support to Pastor Phil and his family as they begin to deal with his father's recent cancer diagnosis.
