MONSTERS & JACK-O-LANTERNS FOR PRESBYTERIAN MANOR





This past June, Bruce Reyes-Chow met and talked with us about choosing faith. His book that we studied, "Everything Good about God is True" challenges us to think about generosity. He states," God has been generous to me, so I give back to God all that I have the courage and faith to offer."

During this year's stewardship campaign, you have heard more of Bruce's message. However, Bruce is not the only writer espousing generosity.

A recent digital publication from Twin Cities Public Television tells that "Generosity isn't just a kind thing to do—it's one of the most powerful things you can do for your mind." Michael MacDonald, PhD writes:

DID YOU KNOW THAT GENEROSITY IS GOOD FOR THE BRAIN?

The brain loves to give. Acts of kindness release a mix of feel-good chemicals — dopamine, serotonin, even oxytocin — that lift your mood and energize your mind.

Sharper thinking, thanks to kindness. Generous actions activate the prefrontal cortex, the brain's control center for planning, decision-making and memory. Just by helping someone out or offering a small gift, we're giving our minds a workout that keeps them flexible and focused.

Less stress, more clarity. Generosity also seems to quiet the brain's alarm system. The amygdala, which handles stress and fear, becomes less reactive when we practice compassion.

Empathy builds brainpower. When we give, we're often tuning in to someone else's needs. That's empathy, and it's more than just a feeling — it's a cognitive skill. Practicing generosity helps us grow more intuitive, insightful and socially aware.

Practicing acts of kindness has been shown to reduce depression and anxiety, sometimes more effectively than traditional therapy. Helping others gently shifts our focus away from internal struggles, freeing up space for clarity and peace.


So when you give your time, your presence, your care, you're doing more than helping someone else. You're building a stronger, brighter, more resilient mind for yourself.

During November, in the conference room at 9:00 and 11:15 am, respectively, Martha Murchison will offer Bible stories which delve into the lives of women in the Hebrew scriptures. Many times, we have read these stories and have not thought deeply about the issues involved in the lives of the characters. It also may be that we've never heard the stories. If you can read the scripture before class, great, but come even if you haven't had time to read.

- **November 2:** We will read and discuss the book of Ruth, which is about grief, depression, migration, and navigating patriarchal systems.
- **November 16:** We tell the story of Abigail found in I Samuel 25:2-43. It's about a brave and courageous woman who saves her household from the mistakes of her husband, Nabal. (His name literally means the fool)
- **November 23:** We tell the story of Hagar found in Genesis 16 and 21:1:1-20. It's about divorce, spousal abandonment, child abandonment and angels coming to help.

- Pastor Tim Maguffee served as Acting Moderator of the meeting in Pastor Phil's absence.
- Received reports from the Clerk and standing committees including a financial report from the Treasurer. Committees were reminded to review and prepare 2026 budget requests.
- Approved the recommendation to move Pastor Phil's Board of Pension health insurance coverage from the Transitional Plan to the Congregational Pastor Plan to take advantage of cost savings.
- Rescheduled the December 7 communion service to November 30 due to plans for the annual cantata that will fill the chancel with instruments on December 7.
- Elected Ruling Elder Randy Hardy as commissioner to the Presbytery of Northern Kansas (PNK) Stated Meeting on Nov 18 at this church.
- Approved submission of a Mission Grant Application to the PNK in the amount of \$3,000 in support of Juntos Guatemala and their upcoming visit, Nov 1-9, 2025.
- Set Sunday, Nov 16 as the date of a congregational meeting to receive the report of the nomination committee for church officers, endowment trustee and nominating committee for 2026.
- A memorial tribute will be given on behalf of the congregation for Pastor Phil's father who passed away on Oct 17. Pastor Phil had traveled to Pennsylvania to be with him.
