

## **FIRST FACTS**

Dr. Raymond Kerns was installed as pastor on May 12, 1927 on the 67th anniversary of the founding of the Church. During his ministry, the church was cleared of all indebtedness. In the Second World War, 219 of the young men of the congregation answered their country's call and the Church maintained an active Soldier Center. In 1946, Dr. Kerns resigned as pastor. Dr. James Elliott became pastor on December 30, 1946. The new Chancel was dedicated on July 7, 1951 when the Resurrection Window was revealed (having been hidden from view from the congregation since the church was first erected). In 1954, 200 members of the congregation were encouraged to start the Sunrise Presbyterian Church.

#### What Do Faithful Bible Investigators Do for Fun?



#### What Are We Learning as Faithful Bible Investigators?

FBI has started a new unit titled Love God, Neighbor and Enemy! Our first lesson was titled, Love Extravagantly. These are all very interesting concepts to explore. **Love** is defined by the Hebrew word "ahava" which means "to give." This helps us frame our understanding of what Jesus refers to when he gives us the Golden Rule. Love isn't the warm and fuzzy kind of love which often comes to mind, but rather an active giving of self. We explore who exactly are our neighbors. **Neighbor** literally means "nearby ones," but this unit asks us to see our neighbors as those whom we are bound to through our shared humanity. So, everyone is a potential neighbor. **Enemies** are defined as people we find hard to love.

The **Golden Rule** calls us to love others the way we would want God to love us. This isn't easy and is often some of the most difficult work we ever do. Reverend Jochim Alexandropoulos was an Orthodox priest on a Greek Isle in World War II, when the Nazis came one day, demanding that he provide them with a list of all the Jews on the Island. The next day he handed them a list containing only one name, his own. God may never ask us to love our neighbor to this extent, but we pray if we are asked we will face our task with the same kind of courage, mercy and extravagant love the Reverend did.

February and our learning will ask us to; serve a stranger, show mercy wash another's feet, be courageous and live peaceably! We can't wait to share what we learn with all of you!



#### <u>How Can YOU Help Us In Our Learning?</u>

During lent, we are asking for your help in creating an interactive bulletin board in the lobby near the sanctuary entrance. It will be titled "Words of Love" and will include various colored hearts. Each week a new question will be posted on a different colored heart. The children's answers will be displayed with the question heart. We are asking that you provide a response for each question on the appropriately colored heart so that your heart can be added to our display. The FBI students are interested in reading your responses. Hearts and sharpies will be set out in the sanctuary. Please answer the question on a construction paper heart and leave in the sanctuary near the back ledge or on the table in the lobby. Additional colored hearts will be left on the table in case you miss a particular question on any given Sunday. Please help us by telling us what you think!

## PASTOR'S POSTS





Lent is just around the corner and once more, following 2023's Stewardship and Advent Seasons, we will be making use of A Sanctified Art for our worship and study. Sanctified Art works creatively to help make scripture and relevant theological themes come alive through various media such as visual art, liturgy, hymn lyrics, graphic designs, and more.

After hearing positive feedback from the congregation's experience of resources used throughout Advent, I'm looking forward to making fuller use of A Sanctified Art throughout Lent. Their theme is "Wandering Heart: Figuring out faith with Peter". Other than Jesus, Peter is the most mentioned person in the gospels and by following his pursuit of Jesus we too catch a glimpse of who Jesus is for us in our own journey of faith.

As with Advent and Stewardship, one of the places you will best see A Sanctified Art is through weekly worship liturgy and visual depictions of the scriptures which will inform our time together. In addition to Sunday mornings, those who either pick up a Lenten Devotional booklet for their personal use or who participate in Dinners for 8-or-more will find a resource full of visual-art, reflections on scripture, and reflective poetry helping us figure out faith.

Sign-ups for Dinners for 8-or-more (small groups that meet weekly over a meal or appetizers) are found at the back of the sanctuary or calling the church office. Like last year, once we have a list of participants, groups will be assigned which will set their own schedule throughout February and March. Many of those who participated in 2023 saw both their faith and fellowship with others grow, so please consider making Dinners for 8-or-more part of your Lenten journey at First Presbyterian Church.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday with a brief worship service, including imposition of ashes and will be held in the first floor chapel at 6 p.m. on February 14th. In addition to weekly Lenten Sunday worship there will be a Choral Cantata on Sunday, March 24th, Palm Sunday and an observance of Maundy Thursday on March 28th.

As the creators of *A Sanctified Art* remind us, "faith is a constant journey of steadfast pursuit, one that ebbs and flows." And with many journeys, it is best done with others beside us. So please consider joining Dinners for 8-or-more, participating in Ash Wednesday or Maundy Thursday services, or simply joining in worship throughout Lent in anticipation of Easter! May our wandering hearts better figure out faith as we continue to be led by Christ, together in faith and love, as we joyfully think, question, grow and serve God's purposes in our lives and throughout Salina.
