



February 28, 2026

Come Walk With Us on February 28th!

Braddock Street UMC is honored to once again serve as the host site for Coldest Night of the Year, an international walk that raises awareness and funds for homelessness and supports the mission of WATTS.

For the past four years, our church has welcomed this meaningful community event. Last year, over 800 people joined us to spend an afternoon walking in the shoes of someone experiencing homelessness.

The walk offers two route options through Winchester: **2K Walk**: A loop through the downtown area. **5K Walk**: A route extending to the Museum of the Shenandoah Valley and back through downtown. All routes begin and end at Braddock Street UMC and conclude with a soup kitchen in our Fellowship Hall. Billy Sous and Clem's Kitchen will be generously providing the soups.

We are also in need of volunteers, especially those familiar with Braddock Street, to help guide participants through the Fellowship Hall, Sanctuary, and Wolfe Street areas. If you would like to walk or volunteer, please register at:




LAY LEADER REFLECTION

SJI CLIMATE POD TIP OF THE MONTH

Start this year with a resolution to reduce your use of plastic. Swap plastic bags for reusable ones, use a refillable water bottle, and say no to disposable cutlery. Simple changes like these can make a big impact. Recycling is easy, but how you recycle might depend on where you live. For recycling guidelines, scan the QR code or visit winchesterva.gov/Services-Payments/Utilities/Waste-Recycling



Did you know?

- Materials can be recycled multiple times. Depending on the type of plastic, a plastic bottle can be recycled up to 10 times!
- Recycling (and avoiding use of single use containers) saves space in our landfills.
- Recycling saves energy! Producing a new plastic bottle from recycled materials saves up to 75% of the energy that it takes to create one from raw resources.



NATIONAL BLOOD SHORTAGE FROGGY'S CLOSET FOOTWEAR DRIVE

The US has a severe emergency blood shortage, with hospital demand outpacing supply, according to the American Red Cross, which called on people to donate blood. Inclement weather has led to the cancellation of more than 400 blood drives, and a severe flu season is also limiting donations. Low blood supply can affect the ability to treat patients in need, including trauma patients, chemotherapy patients with underlying blood disorders, patients with sickle cell disease and others, said Courtney Lawrence, the Red Cross' divisional chief medical officer.



What is Froggy's Closet?

Founded in 2009, Families Reaching Out Group (F.R.O.G.), Froggy's Closet, a Winchester, Virginia based non-profit is dedicated to making a difference in the lives of foster children and children who have been victims of abuse, neglect or are at-risk.

Every February, Froggy's Closet conducts their largest Shoe Donation Drive with the hopes to collect enough shoes to fill their requests throughout the year. We will be accepting NEW children's shoes in a collection bin outside the church office all February. Thank you!
