WHAT IS ADVENT?

The season of Advent, which comes from the Latin word adventus meaning "coming" or "visit," begins four Sundays before Christmas and ends on Christmas Eve. Advent is the beginning of the church year for Christians.

During Advent, we prepare for and anticipate the coming of Christ. We remember the longing of Jews for a Messiah and our own longing for and need of forgiveness, salvation, and a new beginning. Even as we look back and celebrate the birth of Jesus in a humble stable in Bethlehem, we also look forward, anticipating the second coming of Christ as the fulfillment of all that was promised by his first coming.

Although we are accustomed to celebrating Christmas on a single day, in both Christian tradition and on the church calendar, the Christmas season lasts from sundown on December 24 (Christmas Eve) through Epiphany of the Lord (January 6). This is sometimes referred to as the Twelve days of Christmas.

Advent is a time of heavy anticipation. It focuses on waiting for a big occurrence. During Advent we're anticipating the full realization of something that began at the first Christmas when Jesus Christ was born but isn't yet fully realized. Technically, Christmas begins on December 25. Everything leading up to that date is Advent. And it's important to note that distinction so we can be fully mindful of the hope that faith speaks into our human experience.

In The United Methodist Church, we affirm that Christ will come again to judge the living and the dead as prelude to the revealing of the new creation. So when Christ returns, a renewed creation comes, too. This new creation is marked by the unity of Creator and created alluded to in the book of Genesis. In the New Testament, this renewed creation is aligned with freedom from death, sin and decay. So, the renewed creation takes the shape of a world without the bounds of death and liberated from the systems and actions through which humans tear themselves apart from one another and from God. There's a lot of hope inspired by believing that such a world is possible. Advent is a season for reflecting on and renewing that hope.

What do we do for Advent?

One of the ways we reflect Advent in communal worship is by utilizing an Advent wreath, a simple wreath surrounding four exterior candles and one central candle. The four exterior candles represent the hallmarks of a renewed creation: Joy, Hope, Peace and Love. The central candle represents the presence of Christ. Each Sunday, one more of the exterior candles is lit. Finally, the Christ candle is lit as a reminder of Christ's ongoing presence. We, of course, can bring this practice home, creating our own Advent wreaths and contemplating our own longings for more joy, hope, peace and love.




PRAYER PARTNERS ARE GOING!



Did you know that between our children, ESL adult students and volunteers, we are averaging 60 people on Wednesday evenings? We have all the rooms occupied on the first level with students and we have a conversation class taking place in the hallway! Thank you to all our Sunday School classes that share the rooms with us. You make it possible for us to be in ministry.

Our Bridges are getting stronger as we collaborate and share the load with other local churches. Emmanuel UMC in Stephenson has graciously become an extension of our Building Bridges program by opening two classrooms for our ESL students. This has enabled us to offer Basic and Level I ESL classes on Wednesday mornings from 10:00 - 11:30 AM. So far, our two teachers are working with 4 adult students. This partnership is a blessing to our immigrant community.

We had our Just Neighbors Immigration Clinic on November 15th at our church and our friends from Emmanuel UMC volunteered for the event and prepared breakfast for our volunteers. What a blessing to have such loving collaborators in ministry.

In the month of November our children learned about gratitude. They were visited by Ori Largent from Leyendo Juntos, and she read a book to our children about community helpers. They made beautiful cards that they gave to teachers and family.

BRADDOCK ST. UMC WATTS WEEK January 3 — 10, 2026

Braddock Street will once again host the Winchester Area Temporary Transitional Shelter (WATTS) the week of January 3–10, 2026. WATTS is a low-barrier shelter serving Winchester, Frederick County, and Clarke County. Last season, 81% of WATTS's guests were from our local community—people who may be your former



classmates, friends, coworkers, or neighbors. WATTS was founded by local churches after a man tragically froze to death on the streets of Winchester. Together, the churches provide safe, warm shelter—and with your help, we can offer our guests a loving, welcoming environment that encourages them to come inside and receive care. Beyond shelter, WATTS staff assist guests with the steps needed to overcome homelessness, such as securing identification, attending doctor appointments, entering rehabilitation, and more.

How You Can Help

We need many hands to make this ministry successful! Even if you can only serve one shift, your help is greatly appreciated. Volunteers are needed to:

- Serve delicious dinners and warm breakfasts
- Help with showers in the evening
- Provide fellowship and encouragement

- Cleaning supplies (Lysol spray, Clorox wipes)


