- What parallels do you see between **Gen 12:2-3** and the Great Commission (**Matt 28:18-20**)?

APPLICATION

- Read **Galatians 3:29**. What promises given to Abram are now yours?
- Has God ever laid a hard command upon you? Explain.
- Read **Heb 11:8**. In what ways do you walk by faith? Is God calling you to trust him more in some area of your life? Explain.
- If God called you to "leave" how would you respond? What limits would you place on God? What challenges or difficulties would you face?
- Jesus says "whoever loses his life for my sake will save it." In what way have you lost your life for Jesus' sake?
- In what way has God blessed you to be a blessing to others? Do you seek to be blessed or to be a blessing?
- How can you become more of a blessing to others? Who specifically can you share God's blessings with this week?

- What action/repentance does God want you to take according to the truths of this text?
- Are there any other prayer needs?
