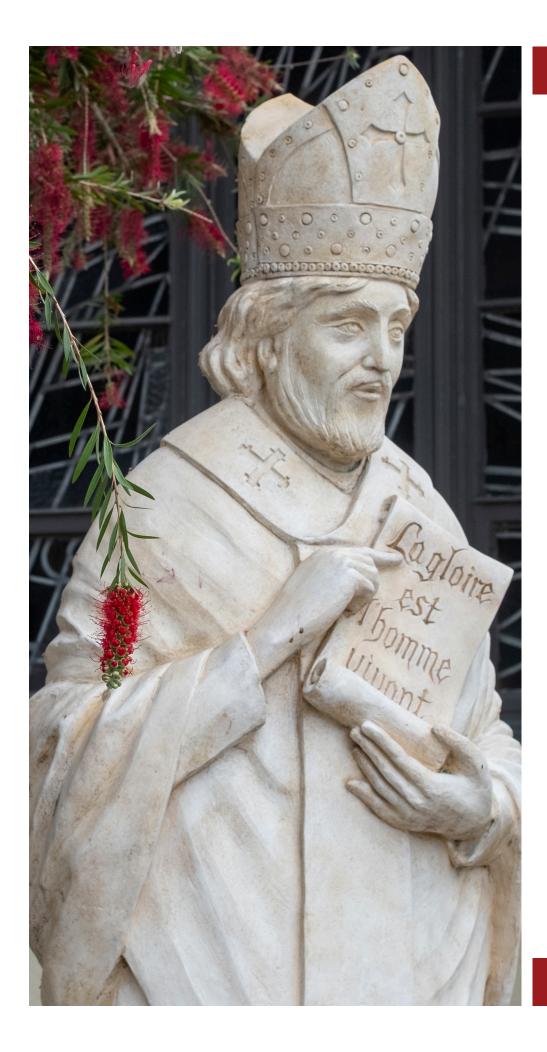

### **Parish Generosity**

Thanks to parishioner generosity we were not only able to cover our operating expenses, but also to improve our campus and continue to make charitable donations on behalf of our parish.

One way our parish puts stewardship into practice is to give some of our treasure to those in need. Last year our Generosity Committee donated \$50,300 on behalf of our parish to various charities including H.O.P.E. (Helping Other People Everyday), Life Center, Mary's Path, Orange County Catholic Worker, Precious Life Shelter, Presentation Learning Center, and St. Vincent Friends Outside Program.

Upon the closing of his assignment here at Saint Irenaeus, Fr. Binh made the important decision to begin the process to purchase the Presentation Sisters' Convent. This was a pivotal decision for continued parish growth and for a successful start for the new Parochial Administrator, Fr. Mark Cruz.

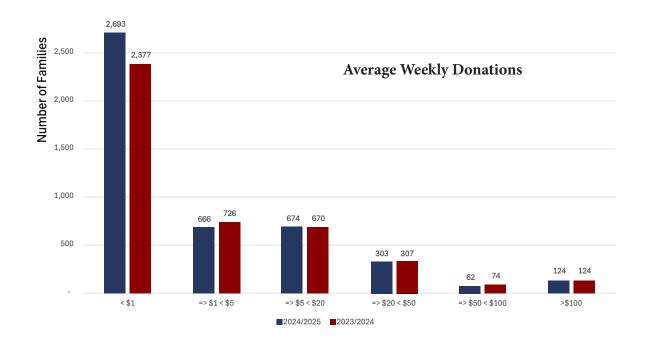
The campaign to purchase the convent was soft-launched in June and we have received \$270k in donations towards the \$1.5 million purchase price. We are grateful for the generous donors in support of expanding the campus facilities to provide new meeting spaces, a full kitchen, break room, conference rooms, and a beautiful chapel.

### SACRAMENTS CELEBRATED

- 81 infants/children baptized
- 176 children celebrated their First Holy Communion
- 181 sick calls/anointings provided
- Ten children and seven adults received their three Sacraments of Initiation
- 84 high school students and 32 adults received the Sacrament of Confirmation
- 16 weddings and 13 convalidations performed

### THE PARISH IN ACTION

- Seven charities received monthly support
- 50+ active ministries
- 42 volunteer catechists and aides supported the Youth Faith Formation (YFF) program
- 14 volunteer catechists supported the Confirmation program
- 67 funeral services conducted
- 75 Valentine's Day cards for Care Center residents created by Youth Ministry HS students
- 27 families supported by Tuition Assistance gifts which allowed 35 children to receive a Catholic education
- 35-40 aged-out foster and at-risk community youth served homemade dinner once a month by Bridge of Light Ministry
- 440 bags filled with gifts thanks to parishioner monetary donations - and later distributed at four Care Centers and to the homebound by Giving Tree volunteers
- An average of 170 families served at H.O.P.E.'s each first and third Saturday of the month food bank distribution
- Approximately 160 families per month visited the Christian Services Office
- 10 special scheduled collections and three disaster relief appeals supported financially by our generous parishioners
- 305 children enrolled in the parish Religious Education program, grades 1 8
- 72 teen and 27 adult volunteers made it possible for 135 children to attend the YFF summer Bible Camp
- 306 children enrolled in the parish school (TK 8th grade)
- 50 Christmas cards for the Homebound created by Jr. High peacemakers
