Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ

St. Irenaeus Church has been entrusted with much, because of the many generous parishioners like you who have recognized that God has blessed you with plenty. This Annual Stewardship Report is a real and measurable way in which each one of you exercised your gifts here at St. Irenaeus Church in the fiscal year of July 1, 2022 - June 30, 2023.

I would like to draw your attention to some highlights. Over the last fiscal year, we had an increase in families registered at our parish, children enrolled in our parish school and parish faith formation program, children who received the Sacraments of First Holy Communion and Confirmation, and volunteers and catechists. On the other hand, household/families that

financially support our parish and average weekly collections are down slightly.

Our newly formed Pastoral Council has formulated a pastoral plan to promote our growing and active parish. There are three distinct priorities: 1) enhancing our prayer and worship experience, 2) improving our faith formation, and 3) increasing volunteers and missionary disciples. We started implementing this plan last June and I am happy to say that there are already positive results!



SACRAMENTS CELEBRATED

- 91 infants/children baptized
- 155 children celebrated their First Holy Communion
- 109 sick calls/anointings provided
- Nine children and five adults received their three Sacraments of Initiation
- 117 high school students and 18 adults received the Sacrament of Confirmation
- 12 weddings and 4 convalidations performed

THE PARISH IN ACTION

- Six charities received monthly support
- 33 volunteer catechists and aides supported the Youth Faith Formation (YFF) program
- 218 funeral services conducted
- 75 Valentine's Day cards for Care Center residents were created by Youth Ministry high school students
- 27 families supported by Tuition Assistance gifts which allowed 36 children to receive a Catholic education
- 12 organizations received donations based on need/request
- Approximately 35-40 foster and at-risk community youth served homemade dinner once a month by Bridge of Light Ministry
- 450+ bags were filled with gifts thanks to parishioner monetary donations - and later distributed at five Care Centers and to the homebound by Giving Tree volunteers
- 320 children enrolled in our parish school (TK through 8th grade)
- An average of 200 families served at H.O.P.E.'s twice monthly food bank
- Approximately 90 families per month visited the Christian Services Office
- 83 teen and 25 adult volunteers made it possible for 195 children to attend the YFF summer Bible Camp
- 12 special scheduled collections and three disaster relief appeals supported financially by our generous parishioners
- 288 children enrolled in the parish Religious Education program, grades 1 8
