Section I

Deacon Responsibilities and Ministry Teams

Deacon Ministry Responsibilities

The Diaconate serves along with the Pastor and church staff as a part of the pastoral care and leadership team for the church. Biblical qualifications for the office of Deacon can be found in 1 Timothy 3:8-13. Deacons minister to families during times of hospitalization, grief experiences, death, and family crises. Deacons also have a proclamation and leadership responsibility to the church as they lead in worship, and help to give overall direction in the spiritual aspects of church life.

Specific Deacon expectations responsibilities include the following:

- Be a resident, full member of Oakmont for at least one year, and at least 25 years old.
- Offer pastoral care and support to Oakmont members and families by serving on 1-2 deacon ministry teams based on one's spiritual gifts, natural talents and abilities, a sense of calling by God, and a passion and interest for particular areas of service.
- Participate in a service of ordination and installation during both morning worship services.
- Participate in an orientation meeting and complete a spiritual gifts inventory.
- Attend and participate in Diaconate meetings (8-10 times per year) and Ministry Celebrations.
- Make home visits to all first-time guests on the Sundays in which one serves as a prayer partner.
- Serve communion on the first Sunday of each month and at other special worship services as assigned.
- Serve as spiritual leaders of our church, being men and women of spiritual maturity through prayer, Bible study, meditation, and worship.
- Be exemplary in one's Christian living and witness, faithful in church attendance and in the life of the church, and committed to one of the founding, biblical principles of our church – tithing.
- Exhibit a loving, gracious, and mature spirit, promoting harmony and unity within our church family, dealing constructively with conflict.
- Offer visionary, “big picture” leadership, and guide the church family to that future where we can join God in His kingdom work.
- Act on certain business and employment interests of the church as prescribed in our by-laws, as well as serve as the corporate board of directors for Oakmont Baptist Church, Inc.

Deacon Ministry Teams Descriptions

Deacons will choose to serve on ministry teams based on their spiritual gifts, natural talents and abilities, a sense of calling by God, and a passion and interest for particular areas of service. Following a time of prayer, Deacons will choose the teams which they believe best fit their talents, spiritual gifts, calling, and passion for ministry.

Oakmont Deacons are no longer assigned a specific group of families as they have in past years. Instead, the pastoral care will be administered through the functions of the Deacon ministry teams and the church staff. In addition, we believe that much of the pastoral care of our members has taken place most effectively in times of illness, crisis, or death through the ministry of our Sunday School classes. It is our hope and anticipation that this faithful support will continue through our Sunday School ministry. Oakmont members, however, may request having a personal Deacon if they desire by contacting the Church Office. Following that request, a Deacon will be assigned to that individual or family.

Below are descriptions of the 13 deacon ministry teams by which our deacons will minister to the needs of the congregation. Other deacon ministry teams may be added during the course of the year as needed and determined by the Diaconate. Generally, deacons will have the opportunity to serve on one to two ministry teams once they have completed the spiritual gifts inventory and have engaged in a time of spiritual discernment regarding their calling to a specific ministry of pastoral care and leadership in the church. Participation in a team will include appropriate training to serve on that team once deacons have discerned where God is leading them to serve.

Hospital Ministry Team

This team will work with the pastor and church staff to offer a ministry to Oakmont members and their families who are hospitalized due to illness, accident, or surgery. Deacons serving in this ministry will need the ability to listen with deep empathy and allow the patient or family member to verbalize their fears, anxieties, and uncertainties that often surround a time of hospitalization and recovery without judgment or the need to “fix” the situation. They will offer a ministry of presence and prayer, simply “being” with people in their time of physical, emotional, or spiritual need. This team will partner with Sunday School classes and other small groups to which the family or individual is connected, and make those groups aware of the hospitalization.

Crisis/Benevolence Team Ministry

This team will work with the pastor and church staff to offer financial, material, emotional, and spiritual support to individuals and families who are experiencing a marital, family, vocational, or financial crisis. This team will be well versed with the helping resources offered by our community and be ready to make appropriate referrals to families needing that assistance. The team will also work with the pastor and staff in administering the benevolent fund (supported by our monthly communion offering) to individuals or families needing specific financial assistance on a short-term basis. Team members will work in an atmosphere of complete confidentiality.

Bereavement Team

This team will minister to families during the time of death. This ministry will include a presence in the home to provide any help the family may request, and representing the Diaconate at visitations and/or funerals or memorial services where distance or time does not prohibit their participation. This team will also provide follow-up with physical, emotional, and spiritual support during the first year following a death in the family. Sympathy cards will be sent when a church member or immediate family member dies at the time of the death, six months after the death and at the one year anniversary. Cards will be sent at the time of death for extended family members. Each team member would be responsible to respond based on a monthly rotating schedule.

Homebound Ministry

This team will work with the pastor and church staff to offer a ministry of support and encouragement to individuals and their families who are confined to their homes, a retirement center, or a nursing home due to declining health or continued illness. Many of these individuals, though certainly not all of them, will be senior adults. These deacons will offer spiritual and emotional support, encouragement, and friendship to those individuals, as well as their families, confined to their places of living. This team also will partner with identifiable Sunday School classes and other small groups in continued ministry to the individual and his or her family and also with the Tuesday Night Ministry team to provide a weekly dinner to Homebound members.

Prayer and Discernment Team

This team will lead our deacon body and church family to pray regularly for the ministry of our church and the needs of our membership and to organize our deacons, upon request, to go to the homes and pray for individuals and families who are facing illness, a crisis, or some other physical, emotional, vocational, or spiritual need. The Prayer and Discernment team will also lead the church in times of important decision-making to structure means that invites God to speak to us as we discern His will and voice together, guiding the church to make decisions in a prayerful, discerning fashion rather than utilizing a voting methodology. The Prayer and Discernment Team will also be available to meet with individual church members and/or their families to help them discern a particular course of action for their family, vocational, educational, or spiritual journeys.

Conflict Resolution Team

This team will be charged with mediating conflict and disagreement that may exist between church staff members, between church staff and church members, or among the membership of the congregation. It is our hope that this team will be the least utilized team in our church. However, we recognize that because we are each different and unique personalities, conflict is inevitable at some point in congregational life. This team will take a proactive, biblical approach, as prescribed by Matthew 5:21-24, Matthew 18:15-18, and Ephesians 4:29-5:1, in seeking to cleanse anger and resentment between individuals, and bringing forgiveness, healing, and reconciliation to those relationships. This team, after prayerfully listening to all sides, will “speak the truth in love” (Ephesians 4:15) to individuals and the congregation in conflictual situations. In cases where conflict between individuals cannot be resolved in a biblically prescribed fashion, the Conflict Resolution Team will consult with the Diaconate and may ask individuals or families to remove themselves from areas of leadership until they can find the Christian grace to be reconciled to the estranged individual(s). The membership of this team will consist of the Deacon Officers. The Deacon Officers may also enlist other deacons to be a part of the resolution process if they deem it necessary.

Stewardship Team

These individuals will serve as a deacon liaison to our current Stewardship Team to keep the Diaconate informed regarding the finances of the church, and participate in the stewardship development of each Oakmont member. These deacons may serve as voting members of the team if asked to do so by the Ministry Support Team to complete a slate of members for a rotating year. If the team is already full, they may serve only as a liaison back to the Diaconate.

Personnel Team

These individuals will serve as a deacon liaison to our current Personnel Team to keep the Diaconate informed regarding the church staff of our church, and participate in decisions relating to the employment, evaluation and support, and salary and benefit administration for the church staff. These deacons may serve as voting members of the team if asked to do so by the Ministry Support Team to complete a slate of members for a rotating year. If the team is already full, they may serve only as a liaison back to the Diaconate.

Property and Space Team

These individuals will serve as a deacon liaison to our current Property and Space Team to keep the Diaconate informed regarding the maintenance and upkeep of our church property and space. These deacons may serve as voting members of the team.

Ministry Support Team

These individuals will serve as a deacon liaison to our current Ministry Support Team to keep the Diaconate informed regarding the selection process of placing individuals on the two rotating church teams (Personnel and Stewardship) and in the assisting of church members to find places of ministry and service at Oakmont. These deacons may serve as full members of this team, suggesting names and enlisting as needed.

Missions Team

Deacons on this team will serve a liaison between the Missions team and the Diaconate. They will assist in bringing matters of the Missions team back to the Diaconate for information and when needed discussion by the deacons. They may serve as full voting members of the Missions team if they desire.

Oakmont Square Apartments Team

The Oakmont Square Apartment Team has the responsibility to serve as the advisory group in the management of Oakmont Square Apartments. This group meets periodically to assist the property manager in business issues relating to the apartments.

Oakmont Community Center Team

This team serves as the visioning team for the Oakmont Community Center ministries. These ministries include the Backyard Buddies, Medical Clinic, S.T.E.P.S, Homeless Ministry, Celebrate Recovery, and Intentional College Community. This team helps to dream, lead and support these and other ministries that take place through the Oakmont Community Center.

Section 2

Worship Responsibilities

Before the 9:40 Service

1. Schedule

- Arrive 20 minutes before the service begins (i.e., 9:20 for the 9:40 Service).
- Meet in the Music Library to go over the service and for any last minute details.
- Deacons serving communion at the 9:40 Worship Service also serve at the Emerge Worship Experience.

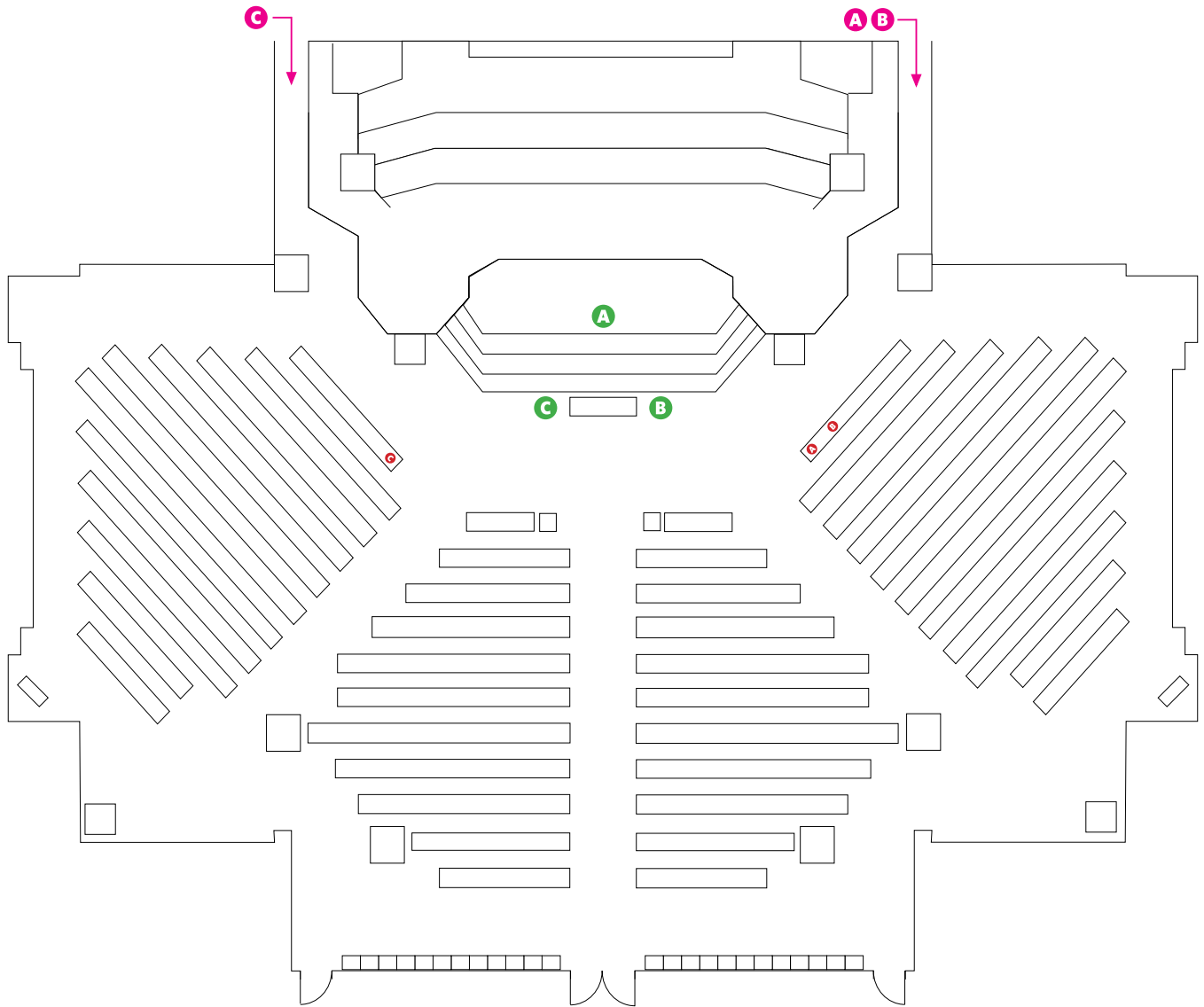
2. Substitute

- Deacons who are not able to be present for their assigned Sunday should arrange for an active Deacon (or an inactive Deacon if an active Deacon is not available) to substitute for all duties, including visitation of first-time guests.
- A list of Active and Inactive Deacons, along with contact information, is provided in this guide.

3. Assignments

- Section III contains the Deacon Rotation Schedule for the year. Please do not lose this guide.
- Deacons will be assigned to the same location for communion each month they serve.
- Deacons will serve communion three times a year (once every four months).
- Deacons will be Prayer Partners and Worship Assistants five times a year (in addition to communion Sundays).
- Deacons serving communion will be Prayer Partners and Worship Assistants on a rotating basis for the months they serve.
- Deacons who regularly attend the Emerge Worship Experience will be assigned responsibilities on a rotating basis, but will not necessarily need to attend the 9:40 Service on their assigned Sundays (if only the “visiting” deacon on a non-communion Sunday). However, they should check in at 9:25 a.m. to be sure they are not needed for the 9:40 Service. (Please have appropriate attire handy in case you are needed to serve at the 9:40 Service.)

9:40 Entrances and Seating Non-Communion Sundays



1. Lining Up

- Deacons should line up in the 600 Wing hallway to enter the sanctuary on a non-communion Sunday.
- Deacon B (right plates) and Deacon A (praying deacon) line up at the door closest to Red Banks Road
- Deacon C (left plates) lines up at the door closest to the Music Library.

2. Seating

- The Deacons will sit on the first row of the side sections of the sanctuary.

9:40 Offering

1. Moving to Positions

- When the Minister invites the Ushers to come down for the offering, the “praying Deacon” should immediately move to the podium and the two Deacons passing out the plates should move to the stand beside the communion table.

2. Saying the Prayer

- Once the ushers are in place, the “praying Deacon” should begin praying.
- This should be a short prayer thanking God for His blessings and the opportunity to return His tithes and our offerings.

3. Distributing the Plates

- After the prayer, the two “plate Deacons” will hand the offering plates to the center-most Ushers who will take and pass them to the Ushers on the left or right.

4. Following the Prayer

- Once the prayer is completed, all Deacons may return to their seats.
- If appropriate, Deacons singing in the choir may move into the choir loft for the anthem.

5. Presenting the Tithes and Offerings

- As the congregation stands, the two Deacons who passed out the plates should return to stand in front of the communion table.
- After the Ushers have returned to the front, the deacons should take the stack of offering plates from the ushers.
- The plates should be placed on the communion tables.
Note: on communion Sundays, the offering plates should be placed on the pedestals beside the communion stations at the front used during the Emerge Worship Experience.
- Deacons may then return to their seats.

9:40 & Emerge Outreach

1. Fellowship Pads

- Following BOTH services all four assigned Deacons should collect the signed pages from the Fellowship Pads

Deacon A: Left Downstairs

Deacon B: Left Center Downstairs

Deacon C: Right Center Downstairs

Deacon D: Right Downstairs

BALCONY: Check to see if anyone sat in the balcony during the service and check the pads if necessary.

NOTE: Some pews have two pads on them. Some pads may have more than one sheet filled out at each service. Be sure to collect them all.

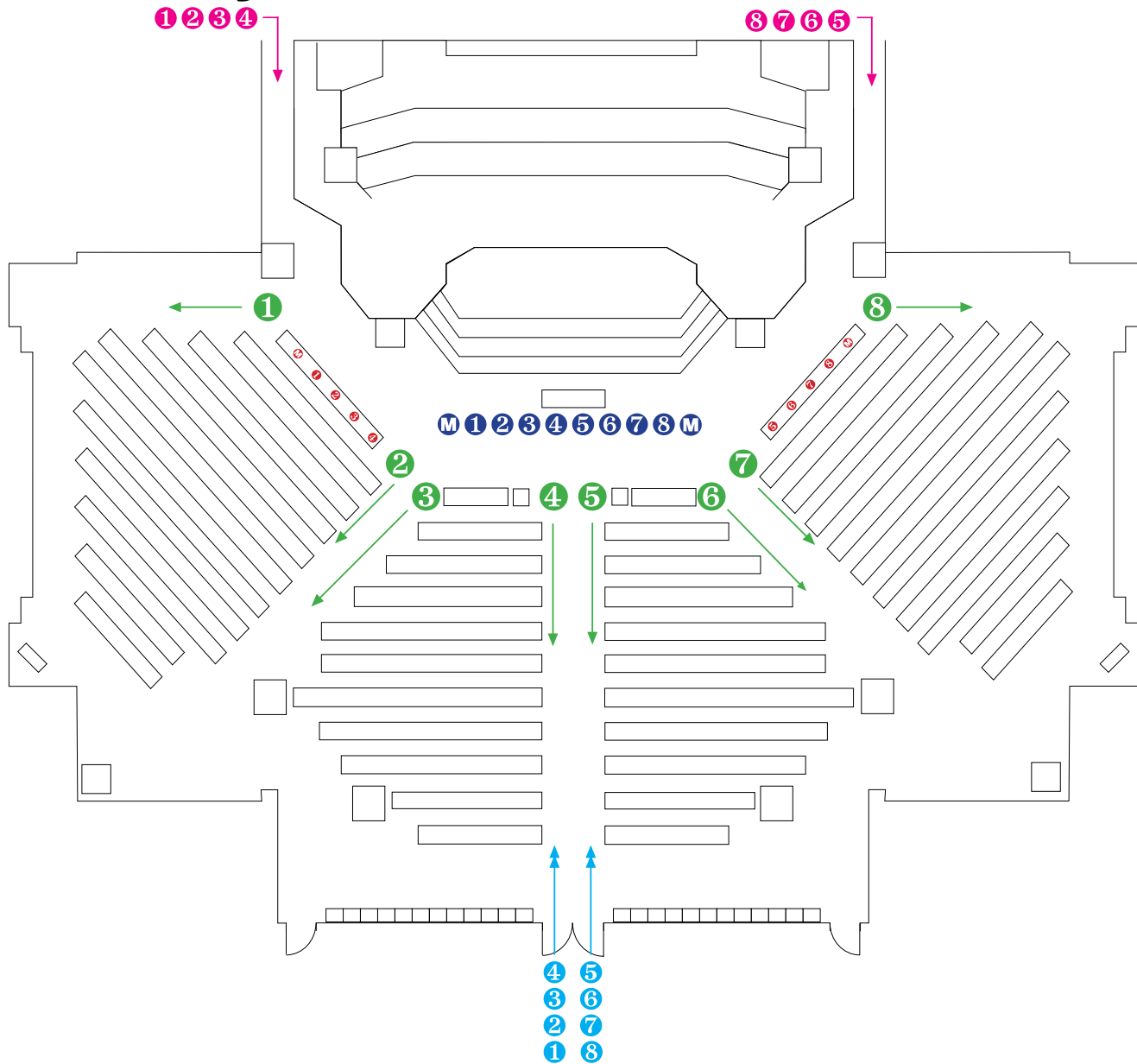
2. First Time Guests

- The signed pages should be taken to the Music Library.
- Following the Emerge Worship Experience...
 - First Time Guests should be highlighted on the forms.
 - Blue visitation Cards should be completed for each First Time Guest.
 - Blue visitation Cards should be divided among the four Deacons for a /contact that day.
 - Door knockers and current *Connections* should be taken to leave with each guest.
 - Please do not mark through names on the Fellowship Pads since they are used to record the attendance of everyone who signs in.

3. Returning Signed Pages

- Signed pages should be placed in the designated location in the Music Library.

9:40 Serving Communion with Trays



1. Moving to the Table

- Deacons who do not normally attend the 9:40 Worship Service may come into the sanctuary during the Passing of the Peace.
- At the appropriate nod from the Lead Minister, the Deacons who are able should stand together.
- The Deacons closest to the communion table should move toward the table with the other Deacons following.
- Ministers serving the choir, orchestra, and other musicians will be at the end of the row of Deacons.

2. Receiving the Elements

- The Lead Minister will hand one tray of the bread to the center-most left side Deacon who will pass it to the Deacons on the left.
- The Assisting Minister will hand one tray of the bread to the center-most right side Deacon who will pass it to the Deacons on the right.

3. Distributing the Elements

- Once all the trays are distributed, the Lead Minister will nod to indicate that the Deacons should begin serving the congregation.
- Deacons will move to their assigned areas and distribute the elements alternating rows moving toward the rear of the sanctuary.
- Additional Ministers will assist in serving the choir, orchestra, and other musicians.

4. Returning to the Table

- Once all Deacons have served their sections, they should move to the Narthex. Deacons who arrive in the Narthex first should serve the Ushers and others in the Narthex.
- The Deacons should line up at the center rear doors in two rows in the order indicated on the chart.
- Once all Deacons are at the rear door, the Lead Minister and Assisting Minister will stand indicating the Deacons should return to the communion table with their trays.
- At the front, the Deacons should fan to the left and the right in front of the table.
- Ministers who are serving the choir, orchestra, and other musicians will move to the end of each row of Deacons.

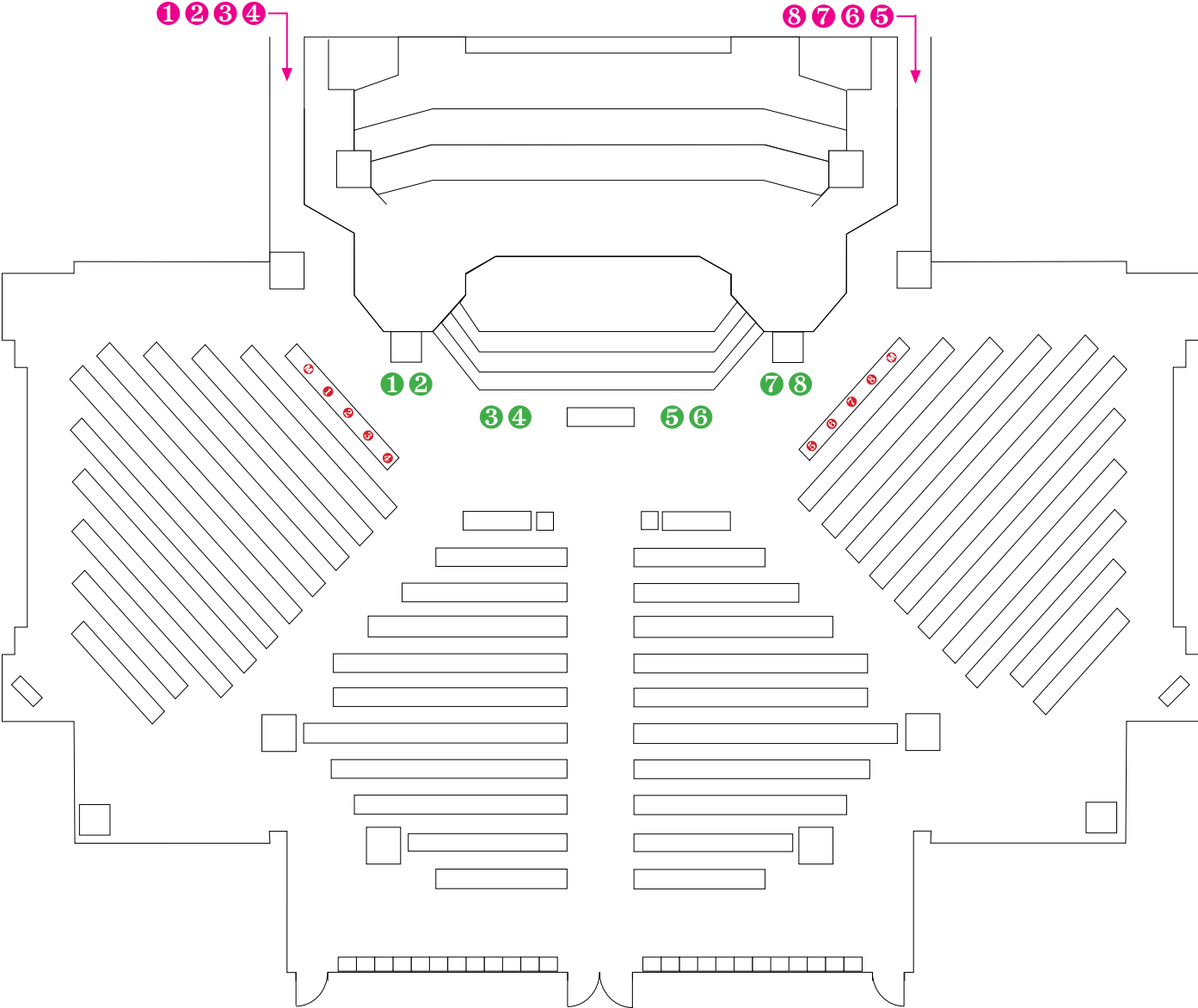
5. Returning the Elements

- The process of Receiving the Elements will be reversed.
- The Lead Minister and the Assisting Minister will hold onto the last returned tray.
- At the appropriate nod from the Lead Minister, the Deacons, and Additional Ministers should return to their pews.
- At the second appropriate nod from the Lead Minister, the Deacons, and Additional Ministers should sit.
- The Lead Minister and the Assisting Minister will serve the Deacons and Additional Ministers (from the farthest to the closest), and return to the communion table.

6. Receiving and Distributing the Cup

- The process used for the bread will be repeated with the cup.

9:40 Serving Communion by Intinction



1. Moving to the Table

- At the appropriate nod from the Lead Minister, the Deacons who are able should stand together.
- The Deacons should line up to the left of the communion table with Deacon #8 being first in line.

2. Serving the Deacons

- The Deacons will receive Communion by intinction from two of the Ministers.
- The Ministers will give a cup or a plate to each Deacon.
- Once all the Deacons have the elements, they should move to their assigned location.

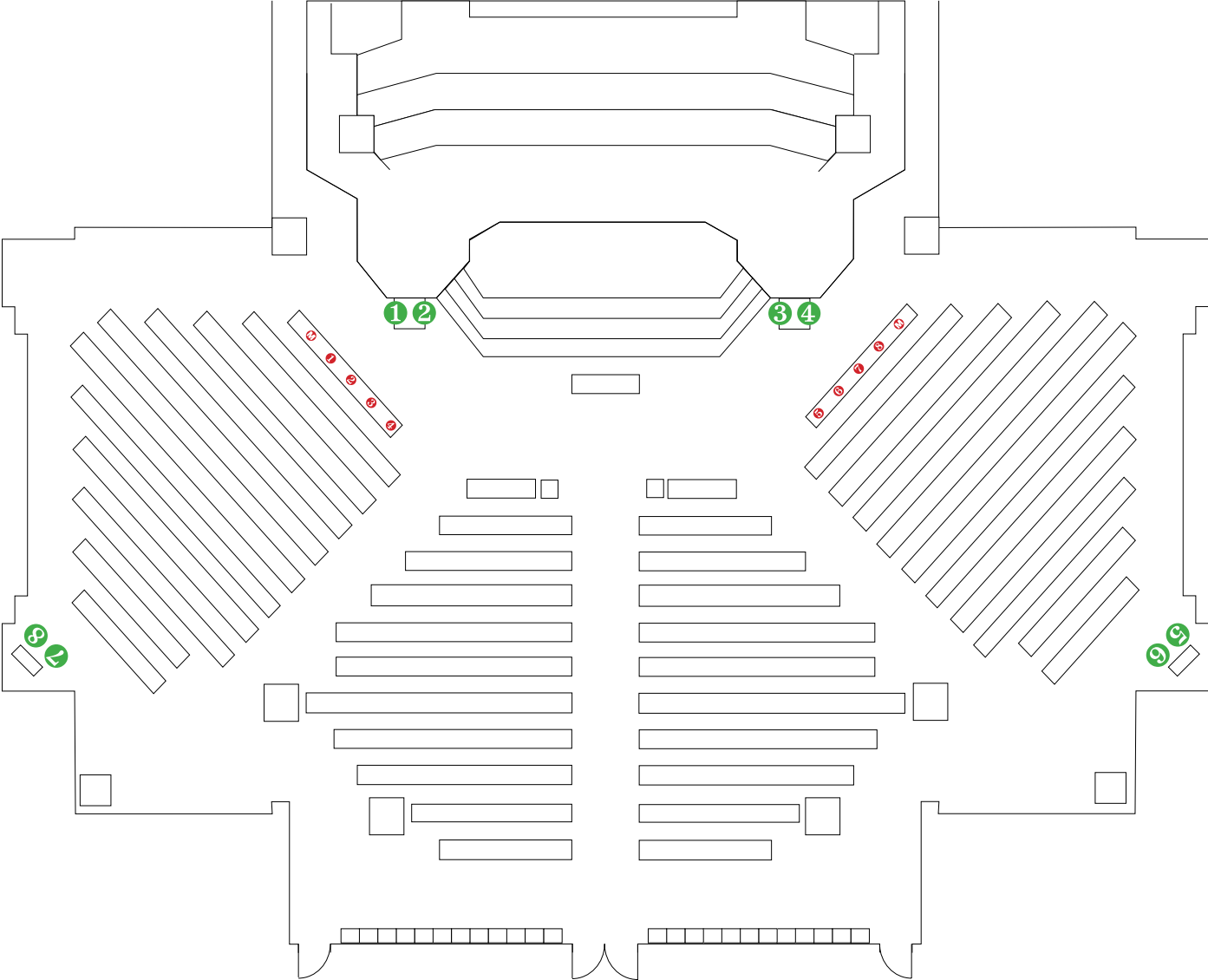
3. Distributing the Elements

- If the bread is not pre-cut, the Deacon holding the bread should use the linen cloth to hold the bread so that people may easily tear off a piece.
- It is customary to say, “The body of Christ, broken for you” and “The blood of our Lord, shed for you” as the person takes the elements. (You may use variations of these statements.)

4. Following the Distribution of the Elements

- Once everyone has been served, the Ministers will return to the table.
- The Deacons should bring their elements to the table.
- The Ministers will take the elements from each Deacon.
- Once all the elements have been returned, the Deacons may return to their seats.

Emerge Serving Communion by Intinction



1. Moving to the Table

- Deacons who do not normally attend the Emerge Worship Experience may come into the sanctuary during the Passing of the Peace.
- At the appropriate nod from the Lead Minister, the Deacons move to the communion table from their seats or the rear of the sanctuary.
- The Deacons should line up to the left of the communion table.

2. Serving the Deacons

- The Deacons will receive Communion by intinction from two of the Ministers.
- As soon as the Deacons have received the elements, they should move to their assigned locations to serve the congregation.

3. Distributing the Elements during the Time of Response

- The elements will already be at the stations.
- One Deacon should hold the bread.
- One Deacon should hold the cup.
- It is customary to say, “The body of Christ, broken for you” and “The blood of our Lord, shed for you” as the person takes the elements. (You may use variations of these statements.)

4. Following the Time of Response

- Once everyone has been served, the elements may be returned to the tables at each station and the Deacons may return to their seats.
