A Word from Our Pastor

The halls at Oakmont Baptist Church are buzzing! We're getting ready to welcome two wonderful communities, having embraced the opportunity to provide space for their ministries. The Korean Baptist congregation, having worshiped at Immanuel Baptist Church for 26 years, will worship at Oakmont for the first time on Sunday afternoon, January 25, at 1:00 p.m. in our Fellowship Hall. If you would like to join me at 1:00 that Sunday to help welcome them, please let me know!

The Korean congregation will move their belongings to Oakmont this Saturday morning and Sunday afternoon (Jan. 18), following their last service at Immanuel. Special thanks to Wayne Taylor and Jimmy Weaver for great work in facilitating the move.

The second community we will welcome in 2026 is the Jarvis Preschool, with classes starting in the fall. Sponsored by Jarvis United Methodist Church, the preschool has been blessing our community for over 50 years. Their building of these long decades however, is showing its age and will be torn down. We're honored to provide a home for the preschool for the 2026-27 school year.

The Jarvis preschool staff will be with us this Tuesday morning, January 20, for their regularly scheduled Teacher Workday! Along with getting acquainted with our facilities, they will take one of our classrooms (currently not in use), arrange it like a typical preschool class, and then host an Open House for current and prospective families on Monday morning, January 26, from 9:30 to 12:00 at Oakmont. Any Oakmont families who want to learn more about the

preschool for their children or grandchildren are welcome to attend. If any of our bakers would like to offer breakfast treats for our guests, please see me on Sunday!

Speaking of children, we continue to pray for Jessica, Ben, and Wyatt Gurganus as they look forward to welcoming a new baby! Jessica's due date is in mid-March. Anticipating the arrival of Wyatt's brother, we've moved our Disciple Now youth retreat from its normal late March date to February 20-22. Jack Glasgow, our former Interim Pastor, will be our DNow speaker and will preach on Sunday morning in worship! As always, our youth and our church will be blessed by our great friend.

Speaking of our youth, the new Youth Room journey continues to go smoothly. The contractor is now in possession of the architect's plans and hopes to give us a final cost projection by mid-February. Our Branches Team is also hard at work on the sale of our Branches property. I'm grateful for congregational patience in both areas; construction projects and selling buildings are usually slow-going things, but I continue to sense strong momentum.

Winter Wednesday Nights Our Wednesday evening activities are back after our December break!



Oakmont Missions: Let's "recount the gracious deeds of God" (Isaiah 63:7) in 2025

Throughout the year, our congregation participates in a number of special offerings that support various ministries and nonprofits locally, nationally, and globally. These contributions support and encourage the ministry of the larger body of Christ. It is a gift to participate with these organizations as we together love neighbors near and far. Here are some of 2025's highlights, with more to follow next week.



COMMUNION OFFERING: Throughout the year, whenever we celebrate communion together, we also collect a special offering that is then divided between the Council on Aging, Greenville Community Shelter (formerly Crossroads Community Center) and the Oakmont Benevolence Fund. In 2025, the Communion offering supported each ministry with a total of \$32,126; GCS received \$24,094.50; Council on Aging received \$3,212.60; and Oakmont Benevolence Fund received \$4,818.90.



EASTER OFFERING: This offering goes directly to support Oakmont neighborhood area ministries, including Backpack Pals (food support for students in need at Eppes); Backyard Buddies (after-school tutoring); rent and shelter support (a growing need as housing costs rise); Ramp Builders; and The Village (moms in recovery and their children). 2025's total Easter offering was \$14,365, which has enabled our congregation to continue loving God and neighbor through these key hands-on, relational ministries. We are grateful!



THE GLOBAL MISSIONS OFFERING, gathered in December, supports the work of Cooperative Baptist missionaries all over the world. These missionaries "serve alongside congregations and local ministry partners within three primary contexts: global poverty, global migration, and the global church" (learn more at cbf.net). In October, Alicia had the gift of witnessing God's love at work in healing hearts and resurrecting hope through two CBF-connected refugee ministries in Uganda. Oakmont contributed \$5,815.40 to the CBF GMO and, including SBC missions, \$6,845.40 total. Thanks be to God!



CHRISTMAS EVE OFFERING: Each year, the Missions Team prays to discern a current need among our neighbors that this offering might help to address. In the recent past, we've supported Hurricane Helene relief in the NC mountains and Welcome House ministry with refugees. In light of growing awareness of deep food insecurity issues in our area, the 2025 offering went to the ENC Food Bank, specifically the Pitt County area. Through a generous movement of the Spirit, we were able to share a check for \$20,114.50! They were delighted and invited us to come tour the facility and learn how \$1 supplies five meals—or how our offering will supply 100,572 meals! Thanks be to God for ministry multiplication!



Architectural plans are being finalized, site plans are being formulated, and we think construction on our new Youth Room could begin by March if not before, depending on the winter weather. This is exciting!

Add to the excitement an unanticipated and much appreciated gift of \$150,000 to our Building Fund from Immanuel Baptist Church! As Immanuel continues the long process of bringing their formal ministry to a close, and as many of their members have joined us at Oakmont as we together continue Immanuel's wonderful legacy, we're so grateful that part of the Immanuel legacy will be experienced every time a teenager walks through the doors of the new facility.

With Immanuel's gift, the eventual sale of The Branches property, and our healthy reserves, we do not anticipate a capital campaign for this new construction, currently estimated at \$950,000. But the Immanuel gift reminds us that when something wonderful happens, people want to be part of it and support it. If you would like to make a financial contribution to the new construction, we encourage you to do so! We're not asking for sacrifices or for anyone to divert their end of year giving from missions or the Ministry Action Spending Plan. But we do want to give people an opportunity to participate in this project through special giving.

Children's Connection



FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY, WE WILL BE TALKING ABOUT HOW SPECIAL THE BIBLE IS. THE BIBLE IS WHERE WE LEARN ABOUT ALL OF THE IMPORTANT THINGS THAT GOD WANTS TO TEACH US. IT CONTAINS GOD'S TRUTH AND WHEN WE READ THE BIBLE, WE LEARN IMPORTANT TRUTHS ABOUT LIFE: GOD MADE US, GOD LOVES US, AND JESUS WANTS TO BE OUR FRIEND FOREVER. DURING THIS MONTH WE WILL TALK ABOUT HOW THE BIBLE SHOWS US HOW

WE CAN TALK TO GOD, HEAR FROM GOD, PRAY TO GOD, AND LIVE FOR GOD.

Our story for this week comes to us from Acts 16:16-40. This is an amazing story about the apostle Paul and his friend, Silas. One day, as Paul and Silas were telling people about Jesus, they were arrested. The government officials in the town they were preaching in felt that Paul and Silas were causing too much trouble, so they had the two men beaten and thrown into jail. However, while they were in prison, Paul and Silas were not upset. Instead, they prayed to God about their situation and kept faith that God would help them. That night, while they were praying, a great earthquake came and shook the walls of the prison. In the shaking, Paul, Silas, and all the other prisoners' chains fell off and the prison doors opened. When the prison guard saw this, he was scared that he would get in trouble because it looked like all of the prisoners had escaped. But Paul called out to the guard and assured him that everyone was still there. Then the guard went to Paul and asked him what he needed to do to be saved. So Paul and Silas told him about Jesus! The next day, Paul and Silas were released from jail, and they celebrated all the things that God had done!

This amazing story reminds us that we can pray to God. Prayer is one of the best ways for us to talk to God and to listen as God talks to us. When we pray, we can tell God about everything that is going on in our lives—the good things, the bad things, and everything in between. God wants to hear it all! When Paul and Silas were in jail, they did not panic, and they remained calm because they knew that they could tell God

This week, I want you to remember that you can talk to God about everything that is going on in your life. As you pray to God, be sure to take time to stop and listen for God's reply as well. Just like Paul and Silas, you can pray to God!

JANUARY THEME: Game Plan— Growing Stronger in Faith Every Day

GOD VIEW: THE CONNECTION BETWEEN TRUTH AND GOD'S CREATION, AS SHOWN THROUGH GOD'S BIG STORY

While choosing to follow Jesus is the most important decision a kid can make, it's only the first step! Learning to live and love like Jesus is a lifelong journey that can feel big and abstract for kids. That's why it's so important to provide handholds for kids (and grownups!) to grow in four specific areas of spiritual formation. We call these Faith Skills: Hear from God, Pray to God, Talk about God, and Live for God. This month, we'll walk through all four skills as displayed in the life of Jesus. Kids will discover the value of talking with others about God through the story of young Jesus in the Temple. They'll practice praying to God through The Lord's Prayer and hearing from God in the parable of the Wise and Foolish Builders. We end the month with the story of Jesus choosing Levi, also known as Matthew, to follow Him—and how Matthew left everything he knew to begin living for God. Just like learning a new instrument or skill, it takes commitment and a game plan to follow Jesus. But as kids learn to spend time daily practicing Faith Skills, even for a short time, they will become more and more like Jesus.


