*News from Oakmont Baptist Church*

## A Word from Our Pastor

**T**hank you, thank you, thank you for your prayers, your love, your support, and your encouragement in the death of my father, Coolidge Porterfield. My Dad died Sunday morning, January 25, after a six year battle with cancer. He showed incredible strength, deep faith, and had an amazingly positive attitude throughout this journey. I'm grateful for the conversations he and I have shared in the past six years, and for the time spent with my Dad, my Mom, and my brother, Stephen. A memorial service will be held Friday, January 30, at 1:00 PM, at the First Baptist Church of Greensboro, with visitation to follow.

### *A few stories about my Dad . . .*

He was in the shopping center industry and early in his career an older executive pulled him aside and said, "Coolidge, if you don't stop being so honest you're going to ruin your career." My Dad never stopped being honest, and far from having a ruined career, he became president of a Greensboro commercial real estate firm and a leader in the community.


My Dad was a minister when I was born, serving as Associate Pastor at Yates Baptist Church in Durham. Before my first birthday he was no longer serving on a church staff. I joke that I was such a challenging baby that I drove him from the ministry! But

it was God at work, leading my Dad to his true calling in business from which he served the community and his local church. Everyone has a calling. Every field of life is a place where one can do God's work. And every one of us, regardless of our occupation, gifts, and abilities, are ministers of the gospel.

My Dad said "yes" to just about every volunteer leadership position there is at First Baptist Greensboro. Multiple generations at FBC have stories to tell of the blessing of serving with him. I've particularly enjoyed hearing from old youth group friends who speak of how much they loved my Dad, and from the young couples class Dad and Mom taught when they were in their 50s. Those young couples are now at retirement age! And they are the ones my brother and I have relied on to help our parents when we couldn't be there. Friends, what a blessing when we love each other in the church at any age. And I'm grateful for my Dad's testimony, that God does truly amazing things when older people give of themselves to children, youth, and young adults in the church.

Again, thank you, thank you, thank you for your love, prayers, and support.

### The Sermon on the Mount Large Group Bible Study







FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, WE WILL BE LEARNING ABOUT THE AMAZING TREAT OF JESUS' LOVE FOR US. THE LOVE OF JESUS BRINGS JOY TO OUR HEARTS, PEACE TO OUR MINDS, AND REMINDS US THAT WE ARE NEVER ALONE. THROUGH THE BIBLE STORIES WE WILL READ, OUR CHILDREN WILL LEARN THAT JESUS WELCOMED THE LITTLE CHILDREN, JUST LIKE THEM, INTO HIS ARMS! JESUS' LOVE FOR US DOES NOT WAIT UNTIL WE ARE OLDER. IT BEGINS BEFORE WE ARE EVEN BORN. THIS MONTH,

**WE WANT OUR CHILDREN TO KNOW THAT JESUS' LOVE WILL BE WITH THEM FOREVER.**

Our story for this week comes to us from Mark 10:13-16. In this story, as Jesus was speaking to a crowd, parents were trying to bring their children to Jesus so that He could hold them and bless them. However, when the disciples saw this, they tried stopping the parents because they thought that the children would distract Jesus from the important work that He was doing. However, when Jesus saw what the disciples had done, He got very upset with them! Jesus told the disciples that the Kingdom of God was for everyone, even these young children! Jesus reminded everyone that it is important for us to come to God, just like we are young children: full of excitement, curiosity, and an openness to learn and be changed by what God teaches us. After the children came to Jesus, He held them, blessed them, and let everyone know just how much He loved the little children.

When we are younger, it is easy to think that grown-ups have everything figured out. But that is just not the case. Grown-ups can make mistakes too, and they don't always know everything like we might think. In this story, the disciples thought that Jesus would be bothered by the children, but they could not have been more wrong. Jesus loves the children, just like you! ## FEBRUARY THEME: SWEET TREATS- JESUS LOVES ME

There's nothing sweeter than knowing that Jesus loves you. It's the sweetest treat we could ever receive, and it's for every single one of us! So, let's pray for our children, that they will know Jesus' love is the sweetest thing in the world and that it will be with them forever. Let's help them grow up always remembering: Jesus loves me.

As we grow up and continue following Jesus, we should always have an open and curious heart about the things Jesus wants to teach us. That's what Jesus meant when He said to receive the Kingdom of God like a child. We should follow God with a heart that is eager to learn, and an attitude that is ready and excited to try the things that Jesus teaches us.

So this week I want you to remember that you are never too young to receive Jesus' love, and that you are never too young to learn about Jesus and do the things that Jesus has taught us to do.

## FEBRUARY THEME: Like and Subscribe— Share the Love of Jesus

### **GOD VIEW: THE CONNECTION BETWEEN TRUTH AND GOD'S CREATION, AS SHOWN THROUGH GOD'S BIG STORY**

On the night before he gave up his life, Jesus told his friends, “By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.” Sounds simple, right? But instead of acknowledging that God is love, culture has decided that love is god. Our world applies “love” to everything from romance to a favorite ice cream flavor to encouraging people to do whatever feels best in the moment. That’s why kids need a radical redefinition of what true love looks like: choosing to treat others the way Jesus treats us. This month, we’ll explore four stories from the life of Jesus, starting with Nicodemus. Kids will discover that God loves not just them, but the entire world—everyone who has ever lived or will live—and that this love led Jesus to take on human form to rescue us. We’ll cover the most important commandment, to love God and love others, and we’ll see how the love of Jesus changed Zacchaeus in a pretty dramatic way. Finally, we’ll look at the time that Jesus healed both the daughter of an important man and a suffering, outcast woman—both serving as reminders that we can show love to people in need.


