## A Word from Our Pastor

I don't know when the trend started, all I know is my Dad embraced the trend wholeheartedly. Sometime in the last 25 years or so, office workers gradually switched to a style of clothing known as "business casual." For men, out were suits and ties, in were colorful button-down shirts. My Dad had lots of colorful shirts. Lots of them.

And wouldn't you know, my Dad and I wear the same shirt size! Since my first week back in the office after my Dad's death, I've been wearing a different shirt from my Dad's wardrobe every day. I'm two weeks in to this routine, and probably have another two weeks to go. Once I finish the cycle I might start all over again. Eventually, I'll decide which shirts to keep and I'll give the rest to our Clothes Closet ministry.

It's a short-term practice that anchors me. By wearing a different shirt of my Dad's every day, I'm remembering him, honoring him, and acknowledging I miss him. It's the way God created us; we need daily practices that focus our attention on worthy things and keep us mindful of what's most important.

What's true of our relationships with each other is just as true in our relationship with God. We need daily practices that anchor us, that focus our attention on Jesus and keep us mindful of following him, which is the most important thing in life.

The daily practices we embrace during the season of Lent are not about proving to God or to ourselves or to anyone else how disciplined we can be. Instead, they are an annual reminder of how crucial

daily practices are in keeping us focused on Jesus.

I invite us to embrace the daily reading of Scripture, using our Lenten Scripture Reading guide, available in printed form at the church and on our website. I also invite us to pray throughout the day the many variations found in Scripture of the prayer, "Have mercy on me" (Psalm 51:1, Mark 10:47, Luke 18:13).

Just as a different shirt each day reminds me of my Dad, beginning the day in silence and then in the slow, quiet reading of the daily Scripture passage reminds me of Christ's presence within me, always. When anxious thoughts, fears, and worries intrude upon the silence and the Scripture reading, I ask for help in calming the inner chatter by praying, "Jesus, have mercy on me." As my mind is drawn to confess my sin, I pray, "Have mercy on me, O God," and, "Jesus, have mercy on me, a sinner."

At some point throughout the day, I'll drift into anxiety, worry, and fear again. Just as the shirt I'm wearing reminds me of my Dad, so the prayer, "Jesus, have mercy on me," reminds me that Jesus will calm my frantic heart, soul, and mind.


But it's not just a prayer for us as individuals; it's a prayer for our church. And so as Lent begins, we pray, "Have mercy on us, O God!" "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on us!" Amen.



### 4:00 p.m. Ministry Celebration




## Hope of Glory Change-Out Day



FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, WE WILL BE LEARNING ABOUT THE AMAZING TREAT OF JESUS' LOVE FOR US. THE LOVE OF JESUS BRINGS JOY TO OUR HEARTS, PEACE TO OUR MINDS, AND REMINDS US THAT WE ARE NEVER ALONE. THROUGH THE BIBLE STORIES WE WILL READ, OUR CHILDREN WILL LEARN THAT JESUS WELCOMED THE LITTLE CHILDREN, JUST LIKE THEM, INTO HIS ARMS! JESUS' LOVE FOR US DOES NOT WAIT UNTIL WE ARE OLDER. IT BEGINS BEFORE WE ARE EVEN BORN.

THIS MONTH, WE WANT OUR CHILDREN TO KNOW THAT JESUS' LOVE WILL BE WITH THEM FOREVER.

Our story for this week comes to us from John 8:2–11. In this story, Jesus is teaching at the temple. While He is teaching, a group of religious leaders brought a woman who had made a bad choice in life. The religious leaders wanted Jesus to say it would be ok for them to kill her for her mistake! However, instead of answering the question how they wanted Him to, Jesus thought for a moment and then said something surprising. He said, “Let the person who has never done anything wrong be the one to punish her.” After hearing this, the people in the crowd began to slowly leave. Soon, only Jesus and the woman were left. Jesus asked her where everyone went, and then He said, “I don’t condemn you either. Go, and leave your life of sin.”

This story is a powerful reminder that, despite the mistakes that we sometimes make, Jesus loves us no matter what. The woman in the story had definitely done something wrong, but Jesus forgave her. Jesus

## **FEBRUARY THEME: SWEET TREATS- JESUS LOVES ME**

There’s nothing sweeter than knowing that Jesus loves you. It’s the sweetest treat we could ever receive, and it’s for every single one of us! ## FEBRUARY THEME: Like and Subscribe— Share the Love of Jesus

### GOD VIEW: THE CONNECTION BETWEEN TRUTH AND GOD'S CREATION, AS SHOWN THROUGH GOD'S BIG STORY

On the night before he gave up his life, Jesus told his friends, “By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.” Sounds simple, right? But instead of acknowledging that God is love, culture has decided that love is god. Our world applies “love” to everything from romance to a favorite ice cream flavor to encouraging people to do whatever feels best in the moment. That’s why kids need a radical redefinition of what true love looks like: choosing to treat others the way Jesus treats us. This month, we’ll explore four stories from the life of Jesus, starting with Nicodemus. Kids will discover that God loves not just them, but the entire world—everyone who as ever lived or will live—and that this love led Jesus to take on human form to rescue us. We’ll cover the most important commandment, to love God and love others, and we’ll see how the love of Jesus changed Zacchaeus in a pretty dramatic way. Finally, we’ll look at the time that Jesus healed both the daughter of an important man and a suffering, outcast woman—both serving as reminders that we can show love to people in need.

## Carolina Hurricanes Game Update


