A Word from Our Pastor

It's six days before the Passover. Jesus is in Bethany, once more at the home of Lazarus, Martha, and Mary. Soon, Jesus will be betrayed, crucified, and buried, entering a tomb much like the one he's just instructed Lazarus to come out of. The focus of the scene in John 12:1-8 is Mary's washing of Jesus' feet with costly perfume, interpreted by Jesus as the preparing of his body for burial.

As Mary anoints Jesus' body for the grave, her brother Lazarus sits at the table with Jesus. Notice the irony; Lazarus's dead body has already been anointed and buried, yet here he sits alive and well, bodily present and eating a meal with all the others! Lazarus had experienced death, was four days in the tomb, Jesus brought him back to life, and now he's eating dinner with friends as if nothing ever happened!

It's important to note that Lazarus did not experience resurrection like Jesus did on Easter Sunday. Lazarus is brought back to his normal life and will face death once more. I wonder what it was like for Lazarus to experience death a second time? Did first-hand knowledge make him better prepared?

Jesus knew of course, that bringing Lazarus back to life would be the final straw for the chief priests, scribes, and Pharisees. After these religious leaders heard the sign Jesus had performed with Lazarus, "from that day on they planned to put him to death" (John 11:53).

Did Lazarus have a sense that he too would be a target? "So the chief priests planned to put Lazarus

to death as well, since it was on account of him that many of the Jews were deserting and believing in Jesus" (John 12:10-11).

There's so much about Lazarus we don't know. But we know the most important thing; we know he was loved. Loved by his sisters, loved by Jesus so much that his sisters didn't have to say his name in their message to Jesus. All they had to say was, "Lord, he whom you love is ill."

And so it could be said for all of us and for all the world: "Lord, they whom you love are ill." Ill with the sin that clings so closely, separating us from God and each other, keeping us from loving as we were created to love. Ill with the pain, brokenness, sorrow, and suffering that comes from living in our broken world. For those whom he loves, Jesus dies and is raised from the dead by the same power that raised Lazarus from the dead. Only Jesus is raised never to die again, victor over sin and death and all that works against the purposes of God.

And so we join Martha, Mary, Lazarus and all who have gone before us in saying, "Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!"





Oakmont Spring Cleaning Is April 18!





Our story for this week comes to us from Matthew 14:22-23; Mark 6:45-52, and John 6:16-21. After a long day of teaching the crowds, Jesus instructed the disciples to get into a boat and sail to the other side of the Sea of Galilee without Him. After the disciples had sailed away, Jesus dismissed the rest of the crowds and went up on top of a mountain to pray. When Jesus came down from the mountain, the disciples had sailed a far distance from shore. As the disciples were in the boat in the middle of the night, a strong storm came. As the disciples were fighting the storm, trying to keep the boat afloat, they noticed a figure walking toward them on the water. At first, the disciples were terrified because they thought the figure was a ghost! But they soon realized that the figure wasn't a ghost, it was Jesus! Jesus called out to them and told them not to be afraid. When the disciples realized it was Jesus, Peter asked if he could walk on the water with Jesus, and Jesus said he could. When Peter stepped on the water, he was able to walk! But as the storm grew stronger Peter took his eyes off of Jesus, and he began to sink! But Jesus pulled Peter out of the water

and told him there was no need to be afraid. Then Jesus calmed the storm with just a word, and all of the disciples were amazed at what they saw!

This incredible story shows us that Jesus can do anything! Even in the midst of a mighty storm, Jesus was able to walk on water. And not only that, Jesus calmed the storm with His words. Peter was even able to walk on the water by trusting in Jesus. Whenever it feels like we are going through the storms of life, this story reminds us that Jesus will help us get through them. As long as we keep our eyes on Jesus, we will make it to the other side. And even when it feels like we are sinking, when we call out to Jesus for help, He will pull us out of the water and save us. Jesus really can do anything. We just have to trust in Jesus' timing and know that no matter what happens, Jesus will always be there with us.

MARCH THEME: UPSIDE DOWN – Treat Others The Way Jesus Treats You

GOD VIEW: THE CONNECTION BETWEEN TRUTH AND GOD'S CREATION, AS SHOWN THROUGH GOD'S BIG STORY

You may have heard what Jesus lived and taught described as “The Upside-Down Kingdom.” Though Jesus is King of the universe, He entered our world as a humble carpenter. Instead of demanding that others serve Him, Jesus healed, listened to, and cared for the people deemed most unimportant. Rather than living in a palace and depending on horses and chariots, Jesus walked long, dirty miles on His own tired feet. By our world's standards, that's completely upside down!

This month, we want our kids to discover how the Bible defined success—through humility and service. We explore how John the Baptist pointed people to Jesus, rather than to himself, and we meet the Roman Commander who, despite power and position, bowed to the authority of God. We take a look at how Jesus taught us to love our enemies and—through the story of Martha and Mary—how it's important to give our time to Jesus first, before doing things for Him. Finally, we wrap up the month with Jesus' humble entry into Jerusalem, and how He washed the feet of His disciples, instructing them to serve one another in the same way. Through it all, kids will discover that being first is less important than putting others first.


The youth group will meet on a regular weekly basis, every Sunday and Wednesday night, unless otherwise posted.
