A Word from Our Pastor

Together working and serving, that's what we were doing Saturday morning at the Easter Egg Hunt. I'm amazed by how many people worked so hard to serve and bless the children of our community! The greatest joy was seeing the smiles on the children's faces and the greatest privilege was blessing them. But not far behind that blessing was the joy of serving together to do good work. One of my favorite moments in our life together is when we all pitch in and work hard to bless our community.

Together singing in worship. I can't make it through "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today" without tears! The message of the song is central to our faith; Christ is risen! The music itself is bold, joyful, exhilarating. And unlike the Christmas carols we love so much and sing throughout December, we only sing this song once a year. I prefer it that way. In that one moment, that one annual chance to sing this great hymn, we are together in the singing, raising our voices as one.

Together cleaning up? Yes, the same joy we found in serving the children on Holy Saturday and in singing resurrection joy on Easter Sunday is ours to experience on Saturday, April 18, as we clean out our church closets! we might use someday but probably never will. We'll be grateful when the work is completed. But the joy is in the serving together, sweating together, laughing together, being together. I hope you'll join us on the 18th at 9:00 AM.

Speaking of space, we had hoped we had a buyer for our Branches property but the conversation with the interested party did not result in a sale. We're disappointed but grateful for the chance to briefly journey with another church as they discern where God is leading them for their future building needs. Our team is meeting next week to discuss and discern next steps.

As for our new construction, our contractor hopes to receive a permit from the city next week and work will begin shortly thereafter, with the rerouting of the drainage pipes the first order of business.

Together. We go through the ups and downs of selling a building, together. We enter a building program, together. We worship, serve our community, and create space in our church building, together. And Jesus is present when we're together. I look forward to experiencing the presence of Jesus when we worship this Sunday and when we gather to clean up the church the following Saturday.

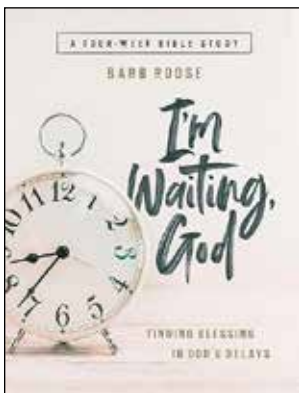

Jesus' Farewell Discourse, Large Group Wednesday Night Bible Study

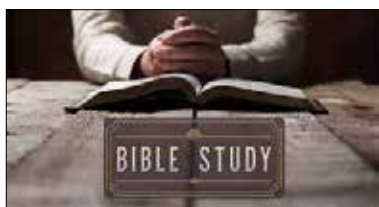

In addition to the meal, John's gospel shows us that Jesus also washed the disciples' feet, then taught them in great detail as a way of preparing them for his departure. This teaching is called "The Farewell Discourse," and we will examine these chapters during our last study of the semester. Join us as Eric Porterfield leads an exploration of John 13-17.

Children's Connection



FOR THE MONTH OF APRIL, WE WILL BE LEARNING ABOUT HOW JESUS WANTS TO BE OUR FRIEND FOREVER. IN JOHN 15:15, JESUS CALLS US FRIENDS. ISN'T THAT AMAZING! JESUS, THE SON OF GOD, LOVES US SO MUCH THAT HE CALLS US HIS FRIENDS. OUR BIBLE STORIES THIS MONTH WILL TEACH US ALL ABOUT HOW MUCH JESUS TRULY LOVES US. BECAUSE OF THIS AMAZING LOVE, WE CAN TRUST JESUS AND CELEBRATE THE RELATIONSHIP WE HAVE WITH HIM.

Our story for this week comes to us from John 21:1–14. In this story Jesus appears to the disciples after His resurrection. One day, as Peter and some of the other disciples were waiting on the beach, Peter decided that he wanted to go fishing. So he and the other disciples got into a boat and headed out to the Sea of Galilee to go fishing. They fished all night but did not catch anything. As morning came, there was a man standing on the shore that nobody recognized, and the man called out, asking if the disciples had caught anything. The disciples responded that they had not, so the mysterious man told them to cast their nets on the other side of the boat. So the disciples did this, and they immediately caught so many fish that they could not bring their nets into the boat—because they were so full! Right away the disciples realized that this mysterious man was Jesus! Peter was so excited to see Jesus that he even jumped out of the boat and swam back to shore while the other disciples sailed the boat back to land.

When the disciples got to shore, they saw Jesus sitting there by a fire that he had built. Together, the group sat down by the fire and had breakfast. When they had finished eating Jesus asked Peter a very important question. Jesus said, “Do you love me?” Remember that it was Peter who had denied knowing Jesus when Jesus was arrested. Peter was scared that knowing Jesus would get him in trouble, so he pretended that he

never knew who Jesus was. Peter turned his back on his greatest friend, Jesus. But now, Jesus was offering Peter a chance at forgiveness and redemption. Peter told Jesus that he loved Him, that he truly loved Him, and Jesus put Peter in charge of leading the Church once He was gone.

Even though Peter messed up, Jesus still forgave him. Jesus gave Peter a second chance because Jesus loved Peter and Jesus wanted Peter to know that they were still friends! This story is a powerful reminder for us that Jesus wants to be our friend forever. Even when we mess up and go against Jesus, Jesus offers us forgiveness. Even when we sin, Jesus still loves us and helps us change our ways. This week, remember that no matter what, Jesus wants to be your friend forever! Jesus loves you more than you know...what a friend we have in Jesus!

APRIL THEME: BLOCK PARTY—Celebrating Jesus and Joy That Never Ends

GOD VIEW: THE CONNECTION BETWEEN TRUTH AND GOD’S CREATION, AS SHOWN THROUGH GOD’S BIG STORY

Jesus is alive! When Jesus died for our sins, He reconciled us to God, and then when He stepped out of the tomb, He defeated the power of death. This is the reason that we can have joy, no matter what’s going on in our lives. This was all part of God’s rescue plan that began in the Garden.

Our month begins with the worst day in history, when Jesus was crucified, followed by the very best day: when He rose again! Then we travel along with two friends on the road to Emmaus and experience their surprise and joy when the stranger they meet turns out to be Jesus. We discover the enormous job that Jesus gave to His followers, including us, before returning to heaven. And with the disciples, we witness the amazing arrival of God’s Holy Spirit at Pentecost, sealing the promise that Jesus gave to always be with us, guiding and helping us every day. In fact, the Holy Spirit is constantly at work in the lives of Jesus’ followers, producing a harvest of joy (along with love, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control). Kids will discover that when we lean into the Holy Spirit, we can experience this joy that’s far deeper than mere happiness.

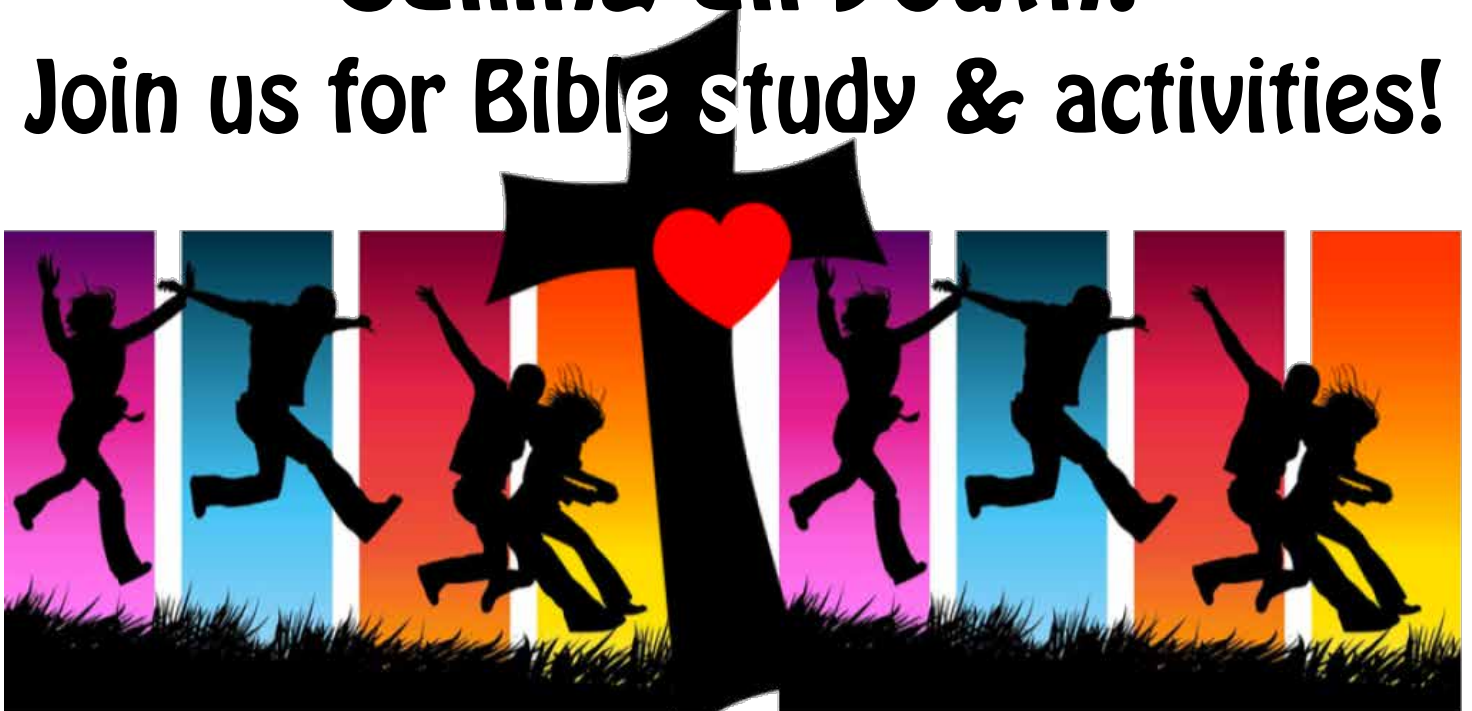
The youth group will meet on a regular weekly basis, every Sunday and Wednesday night, unless otherwise posted.
