## A Word From Our Minister to Youth

It is an exciting time to be in the Oakmont Youth Ministry! Four weeks ago our amazing students led us in a powerful worship service during Youth Sunday. In the weeks following the service, many of you have come up to me to say that this year's Youth Sunday service was one of the best Youth Sunday services we have ever had...and to that I would have to proudly agree. Every year I am amazed by the talent, creativity, and passion that our students have to lead the congregation in worship. I think it is a true testament to the genuine faith that they have in Jesus Christ. At the beginning of each semester of youth group, I remind students that my goal in youth ministry is to help them develop a faith that is truly their own, not one they simply hold onto because they are told that's what they have to believe. This year's Youth Sunday service was a beautiful reminder that every single one of our students is on an incredible journey with Jesus, and they were able to show us a small glimpse of where that journey is taking them through the service that they led. To say that I am proud of them would be an incredible understatement.

But as we begin to turn our attention to summer, the youth ministry activities are just getting started! We have a full slate of programs going on this summer and I am so excited to spend that time with our students. To kick off the summer, from June 15-17, we will be having Youth Group Olympic Games, where our students will compete for the chance to win a coveted gold medal (a gold spray painted plastic plate from Dollar Tree)! Following the games, Pastor

Eric and I will take a group of students to Passport Camp in Spartanburg, SC for a week.

As we move into July, we are looking forward to volunteering at Vacation Bible School as we continue the beautiful partnership we have with The Memorial Baptist Church. After our week of VBS, we will take a day trip to Doswell, Virginia where our thrill-seeking students can get their adrenaline fix as we take on every roller coaster that Kings Dominion has to offer.

Then, to close out our busy summer, our youth mission team will be returning to West Yellowstone, Montana for the summer mission trip. However, unlike last year, when our focus was on improving and revitalizing our host church's facilities, this year's mission trip will be focused on community outreach. Over the course of our week in Montana, we will help several senior citizens in the local community as well as help lead a community outreach program called *Kids in the Park*. This one-day event will allow us to minister to, entertain, and connect with the children of the community. And, if time allows, we will also get to spend a few days driving through the incredibly beautiful Yellowstone National Park.

What I love most about Youth Ministry, especially during the summer months, is the ability to blend and experience the full spectrum of communal faith as we grow in our walk with Christ. The summer

I love hearing about their experiences and how God made a memorable impact after a full day of camp/working on a mission site. I love listening to students discern God's plan for their lives as they navigate their unique relationship with their Heavenly Father. There is simply no other way to describe what it is like being a youth minister other than, "It is a blessing."

And while I am blessed to do the job that I love, I could not do it without the support from all of

you, the people of Oakmont! I cannot thank you all enough for the countless ways that you show up and encourage me on every step of this journey. But not only me, the students as well. Your love for our students is so evident, and they can feel that love every time they step foot into our church.

I think the most tangible example of your love and support for them is the construction of our new youth building. While we eagerly await the groundbreaking ceremony, I am already imagining the laughter, the fun, the ministry, and the fellowship that will take place there. I am so excited to see the lives that will be impacted because of your generous approval to build this youth building. It will be an immense blessing, not only to our current students, but to our children and their families as well once they move up into the youth program.

This is not just a building for the present, it is an investment in both the present and the future. I am beyond excited for the ways that God will use that building to bless Oakmont and our surrounding community!

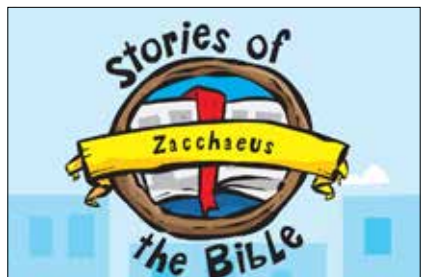

# Children's Connection



FOR THE MONTH OF MAY, WE WILL BE LEARNING ABOUT HOW JESUS CARES FOR EVERYONE! IT DOESN'T MATTER WHO A PERSON IS, WHERE THEY COME FROM, OR WHAT THEY HAVE DONE, JESUS CARES FOR EVERY SINGLE PERSON JUST THE SAME! IN OUR BIBLE STORIES THIS MONTH WE WILL READ ABOUT HOW JESUS TOOK CARE OF THE DIFFERENT TYPES OF PEOPLE THAT HE WAS AROUND. FROM SICK PEOPLE TO LONELY PEOPLE, AND EVERYONE IN BETWEEN, JESUS SHOWED PEOPLE WHAT GOD'S LOVE TRULY LOOKED LIKE BY HELPING EVERYONE JUST THE SAME!

Our story for this week comes to us from Luke 19:1–10. In this story we read about someone that you may have heard of before, a man named Zacchaeus. Zacchaeus was the chief tax collector in the town of Jericho. During Jesus' day, if you were a tax collector, the people did not like you very much! That is because many tax collectors took money from the people and gave it to the Roman government. But they didn't stop there! In addition to taking the tax money that was owed, tax collectors would also take extra money and keep it for themselves. And the worst part of it all, many tax collectors where Jesus lived were also Jews! So not only were tax collectors stealing from the people, but they were also stealing from their own people. They were seen as traitors and thieves who were betraying God to work for an evil empire like the Romans. So that is who Zacchaeus was. He was the leader of all the tax collectors in the town of Jericho. He was seen as the biggest thief and traitor; someone that the people could not stand. But on the day that Jesus came into town, Zacchaeus was curious to know more about Him. When Jesus arrived in Jericho the crowds were huge, and because Zacchaeus was a short man, he could not see over the crowds to get a look at Jesus. So, what did he do, Zacchaeus climbed into a tree to get a better look at Jesus. However, when Jesus walked past Zacchaeus in the tree He stopped and told Zacchaeus to get down. Many of the people probably thought that Jesus was going to yell at Zacchaeus and scold him for being an evil tax collector, but

#### **MAY THEME: HATS OFF—JESUS CARES ABOUT EVERYONE**

First responders and community helpers show up and care for the people in their community, and when preschoolers learn about these people, they learn who they can ask for help. And when people help us, we can say, “Hats off to them! Thanks for caring so much!”

We want our children to know that there is someone else who cares for them every day, but He doesn't wear a hat to show us who He is. We can read story after story in the Bible where Jesus shows us that He cares for every single person—no matter who they are, what they've done, or where they're from! We want every child to know “how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ” (Ephesians 3:18 NIV). This month let's pray for our children, that they will grow to love and admire Jesus more and more as we discover that Jesus cares about everyone. And join us this month as we say, “Hats off to Jesus!”

that is not what happened. Instead, Jesus told Zacchaeus that He was going to go to his house for a meal. When the people heard this, they were furious! They couldn't believe that Jesus was going to actually spend time with a tax collector. But after seeing the kindness of Jesus, Zacchaeus immediately changed his ways. He said that he would give half of his possessions to the poor and that he would also pay back four times the amount of money to every single person that he had ever wronged!

Jesus then reminded the people that just because Zacchaeus had made mistakes in life did not mean that God had kicked him out of the family. Instead, Jesus reminded everyone that God sent Him to earth to seek out and save those who had lost their way and to remind us all that our mistakes do not define who we are. Jesus' love, compassion, and patience teach us that God does not stop caring about us when we have sinned. Zacchaeus had lost his way, yes, but Jesus reminded him that it is never too late to return to the loving arms of God.

This week I want you to remember the incredible story of Zacchaeus. Remember that no matter what happens in your life, you can never mess up so badly that God will ever stop loving you. Just like Zacchaeus, we have the ability to ask for and receive forgiveness and begin living a new life for Jesus!

Also, let us try our best that when we are around other people who mess up, let's show them the same love and forgiveness that Jesus gave to Zacchaeus. By doing so, we are showing the world who Jesus truly is. Amen!

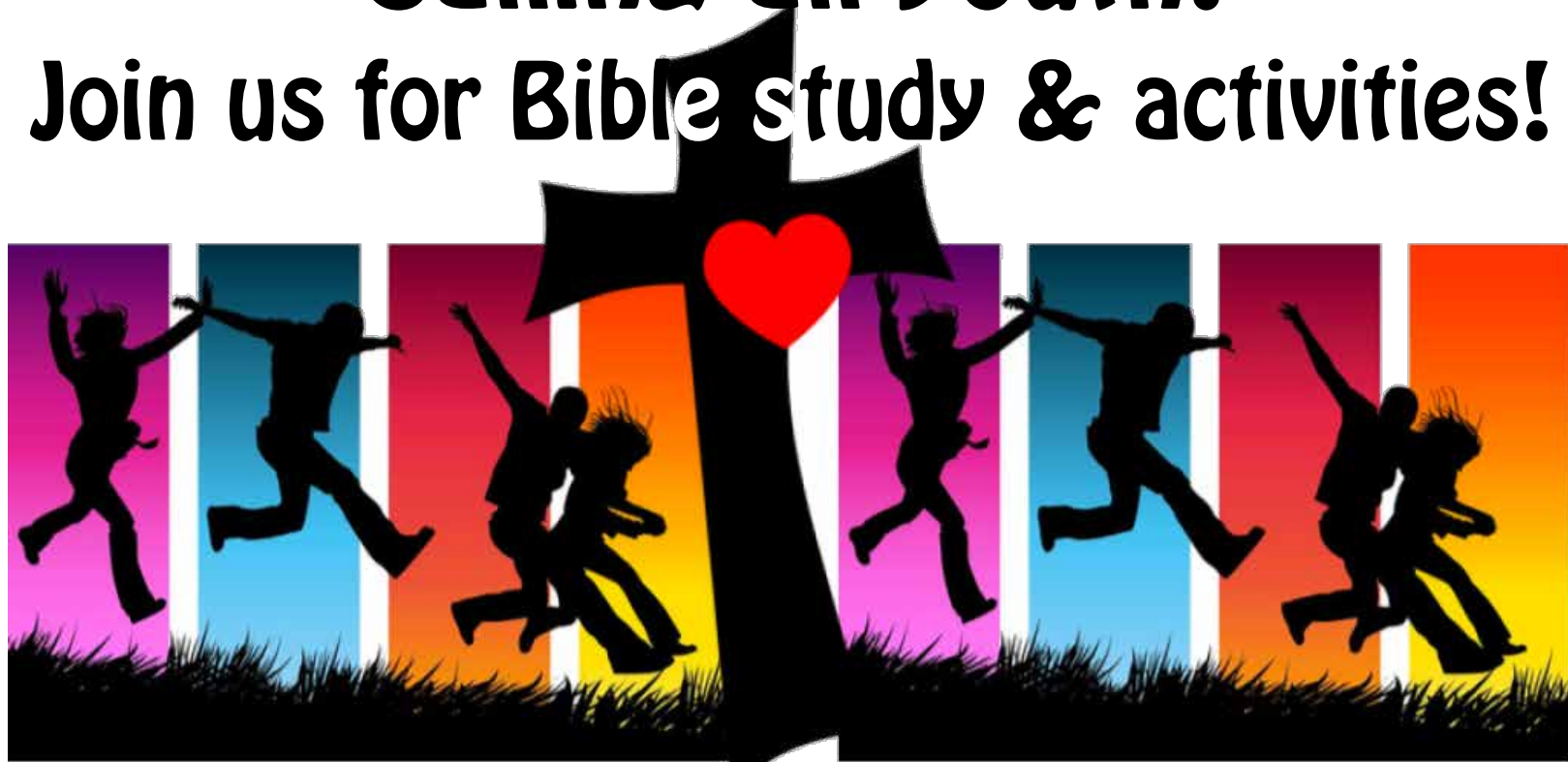
