## A Word from Our Pastor



**G**raduates Sunday! Join us Sunday morning as we celebrate our high school and college graduates, praying for them and their families, and blessing them as they follow God's call in their lives.

*Getting to know our sisters and brothers from the Korean Baptist Church of Greenville.* Since February, our Korean Baptist friends have been worshipping in our Fellowship Hall each Sunday afternoon at 1:00, then enjoying lunch and fellowship afterward. Our first big opportunity for interaction occurs this Sunday, June 7, as the Korean congregation joins us in the Sanctuary for worship at 10:45. Their Interim Pastor will be out of town, they asked if they could worship with us on that day, and we said, "Of course!" We will hear Psalm 100 in Korean and in English.

*One more visit from our website company.* We're almost there, almost ready to reveal our new web site! But there's a little bit more video and a few pictures we need to make the site the best it can be. A crew from Parable Media will be with us Sunday in worship; just be your normal, wonderful selves as they walk among us with their cameras.

*Jarvis Preschool at Oakmont:* Due to aging facilities, the preschool that has met at Jarvis Memorial United Methodist Church for decades needs to relocate. Last November, Oakmont voted to welcome the preschool to our campus for the 2026-27 school year. The current preschool year has ended and the teachers have begun relocating to our facilities. Welcome, everyone, to "Jarvis Preschool at Oakmont"!

*Paying for our new Youth Room:* At our Business

Meeting in March, the church authorized spending up to \$1,375,000 to extend one of our education wings to include a new Youth Room. Farrior Construction is still waiting on a building permit from the city, but we're confident that permit will be granted soon and construction will begin.

At a special called Business Meeting following our worship service on June 14, we will vote on a proposal for how we can pay for the project. A summary of the proposal: First, once bills start coming due, we utilize all the monies contributed so far to the Building Fund (and you can keep giving!). Second, once we've drawn from what's available in the Building Fund, we then use up to \$500,000 from our reserve funds (thanks to the congregation's generosity and good stewardship over the years, we currently have over \$1.3 million in reserves). Third, we borrow the rest of what's needed, paying off the loan when The Branches property is sold. See the article below for more details. Congratulations, graduates! Blessings to the Korean Baptist Church of Greenville and Jarvis Preschool at Oakmont! And thanks be to God for the resources and the opportunity to bless the youth of Greenville for generations to come.

## SPECIAL CALLED BUSINESS MEETING

There will be a special called business meeting after the worship service on Sunday, June 14, 2026, in the sanctuary to consider a recommendation from the Diaconate on the funding plan for the youth room addition. The church, at the ministry celebration on March 8, 2026, approved the expenditure of up to \$1,375,000 on the youth room addition.

The funding option being recommended by the Diaconate to recommend is as follows:

Designated monies received through May 17, 2026	\$ 226,539
Outside Borrowing	\$ 625,000
Internal Reserves	\$ 500,000
Other Designated Monies/Future Designated Funds	\$ <u>23,461</u>
	<u>\$1,375,000</u>

The internal reserves at the end of April 2026 were \$1,341,598. If Oakmont was to use internal reserves of \$500,000, that would leave internal reserves of \$841,598.

The Stewardship Team also approved the use of the General Memorial Fund and Property Improvement Fund in the Designated account. At the end of April 30, 2026, they contained \$15,452.03 and \$375.00, respectively. There are still funds coming into the Building Fund on a regular basis.

The Stewardship Team received quotes from three financial institutions. It was the Stewardship Team's recommendation and approved by the Diaconate that Oakmont move forward with the proposal from Southern Bank with a 5-Year fixed rate option at 5.70%, amortized over 20 years that would be collateralized by the land and building at the Branches location. The first 18 months of payments would be for interest only and then both principal and interest payments over the remaining 42 months. The plan is that once Branches is sold, the proceeds from the sale be used to pay off the loan or as much of it as is possible. The church is required to approve the borrowing of funds.

# Children's Connection

FOR THE MONTH OF JUNE, WE WILL BE TAKING OUR STUDENTS ON A TREASURE HUNT THROUGHOUT THE STORIES OF THE BIBLE. BUT THE TREASURE WE ARE SEEKING IS NOT RICHES OR GOLD. INSTEAD, WE WILL BE LEARNING ABOUT THE GREATEST TREASURE OF ALL...THE KINGDOM OF GOD. THROUGH OUR STORIES

AND LESSONS THIS MONTH, OUR CHILDREN WILL LEARN, NOT ONLY WHAT THE KINGDOM OF GOD IS, BUT THEY WILL DISCOVER WHAT IT MEANS TO BE INCLUDED IN THE KINGDOM OF GOD AND HOW TO SHARE THE KINGDOM OF GOD WITH THOSE WHO ARE AROUND THEM. WE HOPE THAT YOU WILL JOIN US ON THIS EPIC JOURNEY, AS WE LEARN ALL ABOUT THE INCREDIBLE KINGDOM OF GOD.

Our story for this week comes to us from Matthew 13:31-32. In this story Jesus is describing something called "The Kingdom of God/Heaven." So, what is the Kingdom of God? When you hear Jesus talking about the Kingdom of God, He is simply referring to how God interacts and rules over creation. The Kingdom of God is when the perfect realm of Heaven mixes and interacts with the earthly realm. It is when God's good and perfect will comes to earth for us to be a part of. It is a little bit confusing to understand, so that is why we are going to learn more about it this month. Part of Jesus' mission when He came to earth was to share with us what the Kingdom of God is and how we play a part in it.

So, in this week's story, Jesus is talking to a crowd of people about what the Kingdom of God is like. And instead of describing the Kingdom of God in a grand and incredible way, like we might imagine, Jesus uses a different kind of description. Jesus says that the Kingdom of God is like a mustard seed. Why do you think Jesus would say that? When we think about the Kingdom of God we might think of a grand and mighty Kingdom. One with a large castle and giant walls. A Kingdom that expands to all ends of the earth. But instead, Jesus says that the Kingdom of God starts out like a tiny little mustard seed. If you didn't know, a

## **JUNE THEME: KINGDOM QUEST —SEEKING THE GREATEST TREASURE**

Kingdom Quest—where we are seeking the greatest treasure...and it isn't a chest full of gold coins. Our memory verse is found in Matthew 6:10 where Jesus prays: "Your Kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven" (NIV). God's kingdom is so important, and it isn't something just for our future in heaven. God's kingdom is here...wherever God's people are doing what God wants us to do. And God wants everyone, including our children, to be a part of it. So this month, we are going to listen to Jesus tell stories about tiny seeds, a lost coin, and hidden treasure to help our children learn that they can be a part of God's kingdom. No armor, swords, or battles required. All we have to do is listen to Jesus. His stories show us what God's beautiful kingdom is like and how we can be a part of it. We want every child to know—and celebrate—this truth: I can be part of God's kingdom.

mustard seed is incredibly small. It is so small it is actually no bigger than the tip of a sharpened pencil! But Jesus goes on to say that while the mustard seed starts out small, it eventually grows into a large plant, one so large that birds come and rest in its branches.

What Jesus wants us to understand is that the Kingdom of God takes time to grow and spread throughout the earth. When Jesus left Heaven and came to earth, He brought the Kingdom of God with Him. But as Jesus lived His life, as He taught people, and interacted with people, He shared the Kingdom of God with them. Slowly over time, the Kingdom of God spread with each new person that began following Jesus – just like a seed takes time to grow into a plant. So, although a mustard seed may not seem like much at first, when it finishes growing, it becomes a large and safe place for the birds to come and rest and be protected.

Although the Kingdom of God may have started out small, it has been growing since the time of Jesus. And it will continue to grow until Jesus comes back again. As more and more people follow Jesus, the Kingdom of God grows with them, becoming a place of refuge and safety for Jesus' followers, just like the mustard seed plant protected the birds of the earth. So, this week I want you to remember this one thing—Jesus shared the Kingdom of God with us so that we could help it grow. As we tell others about Jesus, and as we live the life that Jesus showed us how to live, we invite people into the Kingdom of God. And as more people are invited into the Kingdom, the Kingdom of God grows with them. Until eventually, the Kingdom of God will cover all the earth.

So even though the Kingdom of God may have started out as a tiny seed, it has grown to become a place big enough for everyone in the world. This week, I want you to think of what it means to be a part of the Kingdom of God. How does being a part of the Kingdom of God help you to feel safe? How does being a part of the Kingdom of God show you that you are loved? How can you share the Kingdom of God with others?

## JUNE THEME: KINGDOM QUEST— Seeking the Greatest Treasure

### GOD VIEW: THE CONNECTION BETWEEN TRUTH AND GOD’S CREATION, AS SHOWN THROUGH GOD’S BIG STORY

We are so excited to dive into Kingdom Quest, a two-month series on the parables of Jesus. Our brains are hard-wired to understand the world in terms of story, so when Jesus told stories, He gave His followers a chance to wrestle with deep truths. He challenged them to discover how those truths could apply to their daily lives. Through many of the parables, Jesus painted pictures of what God’s kingdom is like and how each one of us can pursue and be a part of it. We start off exploring how the kingdom grows through The Stories of the Mustard Seed and the Yeast. Then we dive into The Story of the Lost Sheep and connect the dots on how Jesus came to find us and make a way for us to be part of God’s Kingdom. We follow up with The Story of the Lost Son and how God wants everyone to be part of His kingdom. And we finish June with the Stories of the Hidden Treasure and the Pearl, so kids can discover that seeking to know God and His kingdom is more important than anything else in their lives.
