## A Word from Our Pastor

Sadness. Grief. Heartache. It's what we feel as we pray for the families and friends of those who died in the Texas floods. Resolve, resilience, and togetherness; it's what we pray God will give these devastated communities as they mourn and rebuild. Endurance, wisdom, and faith; it's what we pray for the churches and church leaders as they rely on Jesus and share the hope of Jesus with their neighbors.

Sadness. Our Texas neighbors are experiencing a deep sadness that's beyond what most of us can imagine, unless we've experienced a similar tragedy. Yet all of us experience sadness. And all of us can feel sadness for hurting people around the world.

I've heard it said to preachers, "Never forget as you gaze out on the congregation that there's a puddle of tears at the feet of every person present." Not literal tears, but symbolic tears that point to the sadness, grief, and struggles unique to each of our lives and that we bring with us to worship.

One day the sadness, the tears will be no more. When Christ returns, "He will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away. And the one who was seated on the throne said, 'See, I am making all things new'" (Revelation 21:4-5).

Until that day, God walks with us in our sadness. The Scriptures tell us God knows and honors every tear, putting

them in a bottle and keeping them in a record (Psalm 56:8). And the Lord gives us strength to live faithfully and fruitfully amid life's pain, even as we work and pray for God's kingdom to come on earth as it is in heaven.

The tears cried in Texas are being kept in God's bottle. The tears cried by Amy Cook (the person who puts together and sends out the E-Connections each week) and her family at the sudden death of her father are being received with tenderness and care by the Lord. Your tears and mine, all in God's bottle.

Which means we are not alone. The One who made us, who redeems us in Christ, and who sustains us by the Holy Spirit, is with us. Always. Even amid the tears. Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, walking with us in personal relationship, uniting us to our sisters and brothers in Christ, working through us to spread the love and grace of Jesus in the world. Thanks be to God.





FOR THE MONTH OF JULY, WE WILL CONTINUE TO LEARN ABOUT HOW JESUS SHOWS US TO LOVE OTHERS. WHENEVER THERE ARE MOMENTS IN OUR LIVES WHEN WE DON'T KNOW HOW TO DO SOMETHING, THERE ARE PEOPLE THAT CAN HELP US GET BETTER AT THE THINGS WE WANT TO

LEARN HOW TO DO. WHEN IT COMES TO LEARNING HOW TO LOVE OTHERS, THERE IS NO ONE BETTER TO TEACH US HOW TO DO THAT THAN JESUS. SO, FOR THIS MONTH, ALL OF OUR BIBLE STORIES WILL FOCUS ON THE DIFFERENT WAYS THAT JESUS TEACHES US TO HELP AND LOVE ONE ANOTHER.

# Youth Mission Trip 2025: West Yellowstone, Montana

This year's youth mission trip will be to the town of West Yellowstone, Montana, as we work with the congregation of First Baptist Church West Yellowstone. This community is one that is very

near and dear to my heart. In the summer of 2018, I lived in West Yellowstone serving as a CBF intern at the church. I also worked at one of the local ice cream shops, as the purpose of the internship was to replicate what it is like to be a bi-vocational minister. The internship was so good that I almost did not

come back to North Carolina!

West Yellowstone is an amazingly unique town. It has a year-round population of 1,200 people. However, during the summer months, it receives over a million tourists who enter Yellowstone National Park through the park's west gate. The church itself probably has a handful of year-round members, but they are a church full of loving and passionate people.

Each day that I spent in West Yellowstone was a new adventure waiting to be discovered. During my time there, I learned how to make homemade ice cream, took selfies with bison, hiked the backcountry of Yellowstone National Park, stood on precarious cliffs, signed as a wedding witness for complete strangers, caught a limit of lake trout while battling hypothermia, preached a sermon, led communion, went white water rafting, fought an aggressive bat, got snowed on in June, and spent every day in the presence of God's most beautiful creation.

I am beyond excited to share this special piece of my heart with the youth going on this trip, as they make their own memories of this amazing place. This is truly a trip that we will never forget. And who knows, y'all may have to fly out to Montana to drag me back home!
