A Word from Our Pastor

She joined our group of 2nd and 3rd graders on the third night of Vacation Bible School. She was at a disadvantage not because of the late start but because she doesn't speak English yet. She's one of our neighbors who lives at Oakmont Square Apartments. She started slowly, figuring things out as we went through the schedule of opening worship, the Bible story station, then crafts.

It was at our last station, recreation, that she came alive. It was water game night, the children passing a leaky cup of water over their heads to the person behind them, over and over again. Many of them were soon soaked. She managed to pass the cup over her shoulder instead of her head so she was dry. But I wasn't worried about her playing the game incorrectly. I was too excited to see the smile on her face and the bounce in her step! The smile kept growing the longer we played; it was a beautiful thing to see.

We moved from outdoor recreation to the Multipurpose Room for closing worship, and took our seats on the floor. There was the usual chaotic, joyful buzz in the room as we waited for all the age groups to arrive. And then another beautiful sight! Another girl in our group, a guest from a ministry in town that works with single Moms, was sitting next to our Spanish-speaking guest. She pulled out her phone when she wasn't supposed to (I let it slide because of what I saw happening) and used a translation application to communicate with her new friend!

Since our work with the Welcome House ministry began, I've become well-versed in using my phone

as a translation device when interacting with Spanish-speaking neighbors. Not once since our Spanish-speaking guest

arrived that night had I thought of using my phone as a way to welcome her. But one of her peers thought about it, and reached out to her, and blessed her.

The music started, we all stood up to sing and do the motions to "Waves of Wonder," a song celebrating the wonders of God's grace. And our first-time guest was singing and doing the motions! She may not have understood the words but the joy on her face tells me she was experiencing the presence of God. Her new friend was next her, doing the motions, singing, smiling, laughing. Waves of wonder for sure! God is good, so very, very good.

That's why we do it! That's why we work so hard to decorate the halls, plan the crafts, Bible stories, recreation, worship, the meals, it's why we give countless volunteer hours and voluntarily make ourselves more tired than we normally would be during a hot summer week in July. We serve because we know Jesus will be walking among us, blessing the children, revealing and sharing and showering us all with grace, drawing us into relationships of love with God and each other.

CBF Response to Texas Flooding and Ways to Help

From CBF: The recent flooding in the San Antonio and Kerrville regions has left many families in need of support. The CBF family continues to pray and partner with local efforts! Updates on CBFNC Flood Recovery Ministry in the NC Mountains

This summer, CBFNC is partnering with NC churches on two primary initiatives: "Meals for the Mountains," a summer food box ministry for families, and "Kids Clubb," a ministry with local children impacted by the flooding. Both ministries have practical and relational aspects, effectively sharing the love of Christ through human connection.

Each week meal boxes and backpacks filled with food go out to support about 100 families. They are distributed to about 10 sites across the area. Wanda Kidd, Disaster Recovery coordinator for CBFNC, shared the response of one recipient: "It was like Christmas!" Yes! Immanuel, "God with us," is at work even in the hardest times.

The "Kids Clubb" name is not a misspelling! This name honors Heather Clubb, a lover of missions and young people from Mars Hill Baptist who died at the age of 36. Along with fun and food, students also receive tutoring to help with the school and learning disruptions caused by Hurricane Helene. In the early weeks, numbers have been small at the clubs, allowing leaders to offer more time and attention to individual children. But word is spreading! Last week, one attendee brought 10 friends with her so they could all have fun together at Kids Clubb!

Oakmont had the gift of supporting both of these ministries through our Disaster Recovery offerings and a specific gift made to the meals ministry in June. Youth Mission Trip 2025: West Yellowstone, Montana

This year's youth mission trip will be to the town of West Yellowstone, Montana, as we work with the congregation of First Baptist Church West Yellowstone. This community is one that is very

near and dear to my heart. In the summer of 2018, I lived in West Yellowstone serving as a CBF intern at the church. I also worked at one of the local ice cream shops, as the purpose of the internship was to replicate what it is like to be a bi-vocational minister. The internship was so good that I almost did not

come back to North Carolina!

West Yellowstone is an amazingly unique town. It has a year-round population of 1,200 people. However, during the summer months, it receives over a million tourists who enter Yellowstone National Park through the park's west gate. The church itself probably has a handful of year-round members, but they are a church full of loving and passionate people.

Each day that I spent in West Yellowstone was a new adventure waiting to be discovered. During my time there, I learned how to make homemade ice cream, took selfies with bison, hiked the backcountry of Yellowstone National Park, stood on precarious cliffs, signed as a wedding witness for complete strangers, caught a limit of lake trout while battling hypothermia, preached a sermon, led communion, went white water rafting, fought an aggressive bat, got snowed on in June, and spent every day in the presence of God's most beautiful creation.

I am beyond excited to share this special piece of my heart with the youth going on this trip, as they make their own memories of this amazing place. This is truly a trip that we will never forget. And who knows, y'all may have to fly out to Montana to drag me back home!
