have a theory, a highly unscientific theory based on a sample of two people. The theory: that many people (not all!) find their favorite season of the year to be the season in which they were born. The two person sample study: I was born in late October; fall has always been my favorite season. Alicia was born in June; summer has always been her favorite season. Does this theory hold true for you?

While I appreciate and enjoy summer, I'm always looking for reminders during summer that fall is almost here. We had great reminder several weeks ago. Do you remember when a long heat wave with highs in the upper 90s was followed by a brief "cold spell" with highs in the low 80s? The low temperatures themselves were a great taste of fall, but then I visited a convenience store for a cup of coffee. The store manager must be a very astute observer of human nature. With the cooler temperatures, the store made sure to provide its customers the option of Pumpkin Spice flavored coffee, a perennial fall favorite! The coffee was extra good that day, taking me into October with every sip.

Much more significant than coffee flavors of course, is the arrival of the fall semester at our schools, colleges, and universities. It will still be summer when school starts across Pitt County this Monday, when ECU plays N.C. State in football next Thursday night, and when our Wednesday night activities resume on September 3, but we will be in our fall rhythm.

God made us as rhythm-based creatures. Breathing rhythms, heart-beating rhythms, eating and

sleeping rhythms; to be physically healthy, we need strong rhythms in all these areas and countless more. God

also made us as spiritual rhythm-based creatures. Our walk with God is far more impacted, I believe, by our daily, weekly, and annual rhythms than most of us realize.

Each creation season (winter, spring, summer, fall), regardless of which one is our favorite, helps shape our rhythms of daily attentiveness to God. The school season for many of us dramatically shapes the number of people with whom we interact and serve in Jesus' name.

As we enjoy the last days of summer and move toward fall, as school begins and we dive into the school year rhythm, I invite us to pay attention to the Spirit's work among us in the new rhythms. Who will Jesus bring into our lives as new friends? Who will Jesus bring into our path to love? How will we experience the love of the Father, the grace of the Son, and the guidance of the Spirit in these new days? What will God be up to in our church this fall semester?

I'm looking forward to sipping a Pumpkin Spice flavored coffee in October, marveling at all God is doing among us.




### **WELCOME, NEW MEMBERS!**




## Wednesday Night Events Return September 3!
