# From the Pastor's Desk

Recently our church affirmed six men to begin serving as part of our deacon ministry. These men were nominated by the church and vetted by our deacon body. When we look for men to serve in deacon ministry, we look for men who exhibit the biblical requirements for deacon. We also look for men who exhibit the following characteristics.



First, we look for men to serve in this ministry who are committed to this church. In other words, these are men who have invested their time, talents, and treasure in this local body of believers that we call home. For you to be considered to serve as a deacon, you must be a member of the church. Church membership is important.

Secondly, we look for men to serve who represent the church membership. The Bible has a lot to say about the nature, skills, and character of those who would be deacons. We see the deacon ministry addressed in the books of Acts, Timothy, and Titus especially. From the biblical record, we can summarize these readings into three, concise points. A deacon must 1) have a good reputation in the church and community, 2) be a tither, and 3) be regular in worship and Bible study attendance.

Third, we look for men willing to serve our church membership. What we ask of all church members is to gather with the body in corporate worship, grow in your walk with the Lord through discipleship, give of your time, talents, and treasure, and to go on mission. We expect that of deacons but especially expect them to serve the church body. The word deacon is a transliteration of the Greek word for servant. In Acts 6, the deacons (servants) were appointed to "this duty" or "service." The best deacons are those who are "all in" and currently serving in some ministry capacity.

Lastly, we look for men to serve who will lead the membership of the church. God has called pastors to lead and shepherd His church as the undershepherd of a local body of believers. Deacons come alongside their pastor offering wisdom, counsel, encouragement, and prayer. In the absence of a pastor, deacons should be those that lead the body in transition.

It's not too often that I share thoughts on those called to this ministry, but know how grateful I am for the men who willingly serve our church as deacons. This month, we will have a deacon ordination service, where one of the men elected to this ministry will be ordained as deacon. I hope you will take part in this service.

Even if you are never elected to the office and ministry of deacon, my hope for you is that you will be a dedicated member of our church that gathers, grows, gives, and goes on mission for Christ in our community and beyond.

Sunday AM - Our morning childrens' ministries are off to a great start after kicking off a new year in August. In August, we worked through chapter 1. Jesus gives grace. He creates. He completes. And, He gives us the ability to Go, Glow, and Grow.

#### Why are Children's Ministries Important at Cheraw FBC?

Research shows a person's worldview is largely formed by age thirteen—what a child believes about God, themselves, and the world by then carries into adulthood. By age two, children are already beginning to answer big questions like: Who am I? Why am I here? What's right and wrong? Who is God? What happens after I die?

That's why children's ministry is so vital! Early faith formation must start here. Even the youngest children in our nursery are learning what love, safety, and peace feel like. Children's ministry is about planting seeds that can grow for a lifetime.

Every encouraging word, every prayer, every worship song, and every fist bump or hug shapes how a child understands God and life. And your presence speaks volumes too—the way you handle situations, the way you pray and call out to God, the way you answer questions. It matters, friends.

In a world that is constantly shaping young minds, we don't have time to waste. So let's lean in, friends. Let's keep planting, teaching, praying, and loving well. It matters. Love you guys, Aleisha

## **Snapshot of This Semester**

If you could be a fly on the wall during Cheraw Students on Sunday nights, you'd notice something really incredible. You'd see students sharing their testimony every single Sunday night!

Your testimony doesn't have to be a 45-minute sermon! Whenever we share our testimony with Cheraw Students, we typically spend five to seven minutes, whereas I have witnessed many students sharing their testimonies at the lunch table for just two minutes.


