SMALL GROUP TIME

1. Have you ever started something strong but struggled to finish it? What made it hard to keep going?

Help students connect the "race of faith" idea to real life—sports, school projects, or personal goals. The goal is to get them thinking about endurance and focus.

2. Hebrews 12 talks about running the race of faith with perseverance. What are some things that could slow a person down in their faith?

Encourage students to name distractions, temptations, or habits that make following Jesus harder. Transition to the idea that we have real enemies trying to pull us off course.

3. Read 1 Peter 5:8. What are some lies the devil uses to try to deceive people today?

(Pg 1363) He wants us to fall into lies about identity, success, worth, purpose, or whether God really loves us.

4. Romans 12:2 warns us not to be shaped by the world's patterns. What are some things in our world that try to distract you from God?

Let them talk about social media, popularity, comfort, or anything that can steal their attention or priorities.

5. Galatians 5:17 says our sinful nature "wants what is contrary to the Spirit." What are some examples of how our sinful nature drags us down?

Keep it real but safe: selfishness, jealousy, anger, and pride. Emphasize that everyone has this struggle.

6. When you mess up or lose focus, how does it help to remember that Jesus is still running beside you?

Point them to grace. Jesus doesn't walk away when we fall; he picks us back up and helps us keep going.

7. What's one practical way you can "keep your eyes on Jesus" this week?

Encourage specific answers like prayer, reading Scripture, talking to a Christian friend, or remembering a Bible verse when tempted or distracted.
