## 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

**Review your Ministry involvement:** 

Like Martha, do you want to do what you want to do for Jesus?
Or

**Like Mary**; do you listen to Jesus and, then, do what **he** wants you to do for him?



### Hospitality; welcome to strangers.

Many people are now familiar with the work of Andrei Rublev (c.1360 - c.1430), the great Russian icon painter, and in particular with his 'Old Testament Trinity': picturing the 3 angels welcomed by Abraham (Genesis 18 – today's 1st reading). Christians see this scene as a prefiguring of the Christian doctrine of the Trinity. This icon is also called 'Welcome to the Stranger'. There are 3 seated figures, but there are 4 sides to the table: the 4th is an invitation to join them. Anyone praying with this icon, will feel that the invitation is somehow mutual: as you welcome the Divine Persons into your heart, they are inviting you to sit at table with them; they are inviting you into the heart of God.

In today's gospel, Jesus is welcomed into the house of Martha & Mary. The link between the two readings is *hospitality*. Like the 3 Genesis figures, Jesus is a pilgrim; invited into the house.


The two sisters' style of hospitality is very different: Mary just sits in his presence, "listening to him speak"; Martha does what she wants to do for Jesus – make him feel welcome. Mary gives him nothing but her attention, Martha gives him everything except her attention.

In ministry, you will find both attitudes: the Martha syndrome, "compulsive helpers," who don't consider what you want them to do but, what they want to do for you. This attitude can lead to "burn-out" in ministry. While, those in the Mary syndrome, will "listen to Jesus" in contemplative prayer and reflection on the word of Jesus in the scriptures and, then respond, act. John 11:5 states that "Jesus loved Martha," and her sister Mary and brother Lazarus. He knew what remedy to apply. And no doubt he saw her strengths. The story of Martha and Mary comes directly after the story of the Good Samaritan (last Sunday's Gospel). This makes it clear that Jesus valued active service, like Martha, and not only contemplation like Mary.

In a situation of crisis (John 11) both Martha and Mary looked very different from the way they look in this peaceful scene (Luke 10: 38-42). Their 'high' and 'low' stations were reversed. The crisis was their brother's death. There Martha shines; she went out to meet the Lord where he was to be met, and had a profound conversation with him, while "Mary stayed sitting in her house." The problem with contemplatives is that they can come to love their own contemplation above all else: above the needs of their neighbor, and even above the Lord. There is no hospitality there. For you never know where hospitality will take you.

Let me tell you, that to approach the stranger Is to invite the unexpected, release a new force, Or let the genie out of the bottle. It is to start a train of events Beyond your control.... (T.S. Eliot)

Martha and Mary represent two ways of hospitality, each of them perfect in itself but capable, like everything human, of being influenced by the ego.

Could you serve as a catechist in the School of Religion this coming year? Will you take the 'risk', or, 'play it safe!'

Pero si tenemos presente al Señor, podremos ver cuáles son las distracciones que debemos dejar de lado y cuáles son oportunidades para servir al Señor de una manera diferente. A medida que pasamos más tiempo con el Señor en la oración, a experimentar la paz de Dios, nos da la capacidad de elegir la mejor parte.--Tom Schmidt


