



Respect Life Month for 2025 is October, celebrated by the Catholic Church in the U.S. focuses on the dignity of human life from conception to Natural death.

The 2025 theme is "Life: Our Sign of Hope."



June 24, 2025, marks the third anniversary of the Supreme Court's decision in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, which overturned

Roe v. Wade and ended nearly fifty years of virtually unlimited, nationwide abortion. Hope had never been lost in God's power to right that wrong and accomplish what the world believed to be impossible. During this Jubilee Year of Hope, we are called to reflect more deeply on the enduring hope that has been won for us through the death and resurrection our Lord Jesus Christ.

The *Dobbs* decision not only gave states the freedom to protect preborn children but also paved the way for pro-life victories nationally. The federal government is now closer than ever to defunding Planned Parenthood and other organizations whose abortion profiteering harms women and babies. At the same time, we know that several states have enacted extreme pro-abortion policies, overriding existing pro-life safeguards, with some states leaving children vulnerable to abortion even up to birth. Despite the good

that *Dobbs* decision accomplished, the battle for life is far from over. I urge all Catholics to engage their elected officials on all issues that threaten the gift of human life, in particular the threat of abortion.

As we confront the challenges of our time, let us find hope anew in this *Jubilee Year* and be strengthened in our resolve to serve the cause of life. May our Catholic parishes continue to welcome, embrace, and accompany women facing unexpected or challenging pregnancies through initiatives like <u>Walking with Moms in Need</u>. And may we never tire of sharing



Christ's message of mercy with all who are suffering in the aftermath of an abortion through ministries like <u>Project Rachel</u>.

Even amidst the increasing attacks on human life, we know that the "storms that buffet us will never prevail, for we are firmly anchored in the hope born of grace, which enables us to live in Christ and to overcome sin, fear and death." As we move forward in hope, may we be united in our efforts to protect God's gift of life, in every stage and circumstance.

Mary hands Rosary to St. Dominick

October is the month of the Holy Rosary: Also, Respect Life Month

We honor Our Lady by the recitation of the Rosary in October; the **Feast of the Holy Rosary is October 7.**

Devotion to the Rosary goes back to the 13th century. St. Dominick is credited with the practice of the Rosary as we know it today. He wanted to help Christians focus on the life of Jesus as seen through the eyes his mother, who knew him best.

The Rosary is a Christ-centered prayer. There are 4 seasons in the Life of Jesus; his birth, his ministry, his passion & death and, his Resurrection & Ascension. We reflect on 5 moments – 'mysteries' - in each of the 4 seasons of Jesus' life.

Joyiul Mysieries: in the **first season** of the Life of Jesus, we reflect on the announcement of **his birth and his early childhood**. These mysteries are prayed on **Mondays and Saturdays**.

Luminous Mysteries: In the **second season** of the Life of Jesus, we reflect on **his mission and ministry.** We reflect on Jesus' Baptism in the Jordan by his cousin John the Baptist, which initiates his public ministry. This is followed by his first miracle, the wedding feast at Cana, his proclamation of the Kingdom of God, his Transfiguration and the institution of the Eucharist. These mysteries are prayed on **Thursdays.**

Sorrowful Mysteries: in the **third season** of the Life of Jesus, we reflect on his **condemnation**, **passion and death**. These mysteries are prayed on **Tuesdays and Fridays**.

Glorious Mysteries: in the fourth season of the Life of Jesus, we reflect on his Resurrection from the dead and his Ascension into heaven. We pray these mysteries on Wednesdays & Sundays.

In praying the Rosary, we honor Mary the mother of Jesus by honoring her Son in a **Christ-Centered Prayer**. If, in the words of St. Paul, we are to "have that attitude in you which was also in Christ Jesus" (Phil 2: 5); the **Rosary** helps us reflect on the Life of Jesus on a daily basis.

October – Respect Life Month: During October, we are encouraged to pray the Rosary every day. One of the lessons we learn in praying the Rosary during October – **Respect Life Month** – is, to respect human life at every stage of its development – **womb to tomb** - as Mary and Joseph did - "when an angel appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, 'Rise, take the child and his mother, flee to Egypt...Herod is going to search for the child to destroy him" (Mt 2: 13–15). **Pray the Rosary for a greater Respect for Life**.
