

Therefore be patient, brethren, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth, waiting patiently for it until it receives the early and latter rain. You also be patient. Establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand.

James 5:7-8

3rd Sunday of Advent

"Be patient brothers & sisters until the coming of the Lord."

So, we may need to be patient with ourselves as God continues to work on some dominant or addictive attachment in our lives over an extended period of time. This is why James in today's second reading (James 5: 7-10) encourages us to be patient: "Be patient brothers and sisters until the coming of the Lord." Let us avail of the Sacrament of Penance as part of the healing process.

Gaudete Sunday, "Rejoice always...the Lord is near"- Where? In the Sacrament of Penance, during the Advent Season.

When John the Baptist heard of the works of Jesus, he sent his disciples with a question,

"Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?"

Jesus said in reply, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them. Blessed is the one who takes no offense at me" (Mt 11: 2-4).

Matthew was citing Isaiah verbatim – from today's 1st reading (Is 35: 1-6, 10) - giving a clear vision of what the Messiah will usher in when he states: "Say to those who are frightened: be strong, fear not! Here is your God, he comes with vindication; with divine recompense he comes to save you. Then will the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf be cleared; then will the lame leap

like a stag, then the tongue of the dumb will sing." In other words, the Messiah will bring salvation; he will bring healing & wholeness & restoration. The Messiah will be a Savior.

Healing and wholeness may not be a momentary thing in our lives. Healing and wholeness may be more of a process which occurs over an extended period of time. It only took one day for Moses to lead God's people out of Egypt. It took him forty years in the desert to get Egypt out of the minds and hearts of God's people. You may recall an example of this when Moses went up on Mt. Sinai to receive the 10 Commandments from God. When he returns from Mt. Sinai, Moses is stunned to find God's people worshipping a Golden Calf.


So, we may need to be patient with ourselves as God continues to work on some addictive attachment – **drugs, drink, purity** - in our lives over an extended period of time. In today's 2nd reading (James 5: 7-10) James encourages us to be patient: "Be patient brothers and sisters until the coming of the Lord." Let us use the Sacrament of Penance as part of the healing process.

Let James' words conclude Gaudete Sunday in a spirit of joy:
[With Joy] "Be patient brothers and sisters until the coming of the Lord."



"Brothers and sisters: Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice!... The Lord is near."

The Father greeted his 'Prodigal Son" with great joy and with great celebration, when he returned from his errant and sinful ways and, they were reconciled, the purpose for which the Father sent Jesus into the world then and now: "God so loved the world he sent his only begotten son into the world, not to condemn the world, but, that the world might be saved by him." (John 3:16). Jesus continues to do the same in the Sacrament of Penance today, where we hear his voice echoed in the priest's voice "Father, forgive them..." It is an opportunity for us to "Rejoice" at being reconciled with our Savior

What is Las Posadas?

Different cultures have a beautiful way of enriching all of us spiritually. **The Hispanic culture**, for example, has a deeply spiritual practice during the season of Advent in preparation for Christmas, which they call "Las Posadas."

The word *posada* means "shelter" or "lodging." This Advent custom, popular throughout the Spanish-speaking world, reenacts Mary and Joseph's journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem and their search for lodging along the way. The ritual lasts for nine days (December 16-24), representing the nine months of Mary's pregnancy.

A group of people travel from house to house on their route, taking the role of pilgrims seeking lodging. Those inside the homes are innkeepers who refuse them. At the last home all are invited in for prayer and refreshments. It is a prayerful way of preparing for the coming of Jesus. It is a Hispanic way of "Keeping Christ in Christmas." It begins, Tuesday, Dec 16.





The Jesse Tree is Jesus' Family Tree



Here is what the prophet Isaiah foretold: "A shoot will come from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a branch will bear fruit." Jesus is that "branch" that will bear fruit.

St Nicholas & Gift-giving – Feast, Sat, Dec 6th Some hold that the practice of Christmas gift-giving goes back to the birth of Jesus, when the Magi brought gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh to the stable at Bethlehem.

Others, hold that the practice of gift-giving goes back to St. Nicholas – whose feast day is December 6 – it goes back to the 5th century, when he was Bishop of Myra in contemporary Turkey.

In our time, the practice of gift-giving has been taken over by **commercial concerns**, which see it as an opportunity to make a lot of money. These gifts are more **self-centered**—What do 'I' get for Christmas?

The Magi and St. Nicholas give us the true sense of Gift-giving at Christmas time – it is **other centered**, as an expression of my love.

En primer lugar, los profetas tenían FE en Dios. Creían que el pueblo de Dios debía obedecer sus mandamientos fielmente y amar al Señor sobre todas las cosas. Tenían fe en que Dios los protegería y apoyaría, y que siempre cumpliría sus promesas.

En segundo lugar, tuvieron PACIENCIA. Perseveraron cuando la gente rechazó su predicación. Algunos profetas tuvieron que ser pacientes con sus propias debilidades o con su incapacidad para cambiar el comportamiento del pueblo de Israel.

El tercer don de los profetas fue la ESPERANZA que al cumplir los mandamientos de Dios, su pueblo se renovaría, junto con toda la creación.

¿Qué aprendemos de estos profetas? Primero, tenemos que mantener firme nuestra fe en Dios. Si vas a la iglesia una vez a la semana, lo mínimo requerido, sería como hacer ejercicio solo una vez a la semana y pensar que eso te mantendrá en buena forma. La oración, para nuestra salud espiritual, es un ejercicio tan importante como los aeróbicos para la salud física.

Segundo, necesitamos paciencia, y no solo con nuestros hijos. Tenemos que ser pacientes con nosotros mismos y con Dios. No esperes convertirte en un santo de inmediato.

Tercero, el don de la esperanza nos ayuda a ser pacientes porque confiamos en que Dios cumplirá sus promesas y nos dará todo lo necesario. La lectura de Isaías nos da la esperanza de que Dios nos recibirá con gozo y dicha (Is 35,10). Tom Schmidt


