

29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Jesus told his disciples a parable about the necessity to pray always without becoming weary" (Lk 18: 1).

Feast of St. Luke, Saturday, October 18, 2025 – "Pray always and never grow weary..."

Yesterday, Saturday, October 18, we celebrated the feast of St. Luke. There is a 3-year cycle – Cycle A, B, C – during which we read all 4 Gospels on the Sundays of the Liturgical year. Year A mostly features the Gospel According to Matthew; Year B reads through the Gospel According to Mark; and Year C showcases the Gospel According to Luke. The Gospel According to John is read during the Easter season in all three years. This year, Cycle C, we read Luke's Gospel. Each of the four Gospel writers – Matthew, Mark, Luke and John – has his own style, his own sources, his own audience, his own emphases, and things that only he tells us about.


Luke's Gospel, for example, is the only Gospel that you will find the parable of the Good Samaritan. The message contained in the Good Samaritan is at the heart of Luke's Gospel. We can understand how for Luke, the doctor, Jesus' concern for every kind of woundedness & suffering and, the need for healing, was especially important. The "wounded man" in the story of the Good Samaritan represents for Luke the "wounded human race." Jesus is the "Good Samaritan" who comes to "Heal" our human woundedness caused by sin. Luke's Gospel is the only Gospel (Luke 15) that gives us the three parables about the way that God's love patiently seeks out — "The Hound of Heaven" - us men and women to reconcile and heal us: the parable of the Lost Sheep; the parable of the Lost Coin; and above all — perhaps Jesus' best-known parable — the parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15). Jesus paints a marvelous profile of God in this parable.

What would we know about the early life of Jesus – "the Infancy Narratives" – without the Gospel of Luke? In the first two chapters, he records the birth of John the Baptist and of Jesus himself, which lays the foundation for his message. The Gospel for Christmas is found in Luke, the Presentation of Jesus in the temple, and his visit to the temple at the age of twelve.

We should note the central role played in Luke's Gospel by the prayers of Jesus and those close to him. In today's Gospel, for example, Jesus tells his disciples "To pray always without becoming weary." Luke gives us three great prayers in the "infancy narratives": the Benedictus of Zechariah is a morning prayer in the Prayer of the Church (Luke 1: 68 - 79), Mary's *Magnificat* is an evening prayer in the Prayer of the Church (Luke 1: 46 - 55), and Simeon's *Nunc Dimittis* is a night prayer in the Prayer of the Church (Luke 2: 29 - 32). The reading of and the reflection on these prayers would be a wonderful way to enrich your daily relationship with the Lord. It was for Mary.

Vigésimo Noveno Domingo del TIEMPO ORDINARIO

Jesús da un ejemplo ingenioso de por qué debemos perseverar en la **oración**, incluso si creemos que no se escucha nuestra oración. San Pablo lleva el tema de la perseverancia aún más lejos. No solo se refiere a la oración; anima también a Timoteo a perseverar en la **proclamación** de la palabra de Dios. Este mandato puede resultarnos más difícil que la oración. Le dice a Timoteo (¡y a nosotros!) "**convence**, **reprende** y **exhorta** con toda paciencia y sabiduría" ¿Cómo podemos lograrlo?

"Convencer" me recuerda que nuestra fe debe ser razonable. No es que podamos demostrar científicamente todo lo que creemos, pero nuestra fe debe ser realista. Una madre o padre que abraza a su hijo cuando está herido, lo perdona cuando se arrepiente y lo anima cuando se siente perdido, está enseñando ese mandato de una manera que se recordará mucho más tiempo que simplemente diciéndole que ame a la gente. Mostrándoles ejemplos de amor, perdón y ánimo.

Pablo habla de **reprendernos** unos a otros. Quizás eso era lo que pensaba cuando dice que proclamar la palabra a veces puede ser incómodo. A la mayoría de las personas les resulta difícil reprender a alguien a quien tienen a su cargo, y mucho menos a alguien de igual estatus. Una reprimenda puede hacerse con paciencia y amabilidad, como muestra de preocupación más que de autoridad.

Por último, Pablo menciona la enseñanza. Los padres pueden contribuir enseñando las historias de la Biblia, ayudando a los niños a ver a Dios en la creación, enseñándoles a orar y siendo buenos ejemplos del amor de Dios por ellos. Si envían a sus hijos a clases de religión o a la escuela parroquial, hagan lo posible por apoyar a los maestros para que lo que aprenden en la escuela se practique en la casa. Lo que los niños ven (o no ven) en el hogar tiene un efecto mucho mayor que unas horas a la semana en un salón de clases. __Tom Schmidt
