

31st Sunday in Ordinary Time November – Month to pray for the Holy Souls

"It is a holy and a wholesome thought to pray for the dead that they may be loosed from their sins." (2 Macc 12: 45-47).



Feast of All Souls: Pray for deceased loved ones

The Hollywood epic film director **Cecil B. DeMille** tells a story about reading a book while drifting in a canoe on a lake in Maine. For a brief moment he looked away from the book and down toward the lake. There on the water were beetles at play. DeMille watched as one of the beetles crawled up the side of the canoe. As the beetle got half way up, it dug its talons into the wooden side of the canoe and died. DeMille was fascinated by the action of the water beetle. Then, he returned to reading his book. 3 hours later he took another timeout from reading. He looked back to where the beetle attached its talons to the side of the canoe and was amazed at what he saw.

The beetle had dried up and its back had begun to crack open.

The closer he watched; he noticed that there was some movement: something was trying to force its way out through the crack in the shell which coated the back of the dead beetle. First a small moist head appeared followed closely by rainbow-colored wings. **Finally, a beautiful butterfly emerged with resplendent colors.** DeMille sat there amazed at the epiphany unfolding. The mini-creature began to move its oversized wings. It took flight and hovered over the water where the other beetles were at play. None of the beetles recognized the butterfly. They did not realize that it was the same beetle they played with just hours earlier. DeMille took his finger and moved the dried-out shell of the beetle. It looked like an empty tomb.

Image, metaphor, is a door, a window, into mystery. There are similarities between the story of the beetle and the death and resurrection of Jesus. The water beetle died fastened to a wooden canoe. Jesus died nailed to a wooden cross. The water beetle went through an amazing transformation three hours after its death. Jesus also underwent an amazing transformation three days after his death. The water beetles did not recognize the transformed beetle as it flew over the water where it had played three hours before. In the Gospels we are told that Jesus, after his Resurrection, was not recognized by those who had been with him three days before.



Belief in the Resurrection sustains a mother and her 7 sons in the face of torture in the book of Maccabees. It is in 2 Maccabees 12: 45-47 we pray: "It is a holy and a wholesome thought to pray for the dead that they may be loosed from their sins." This Scripture passage is the source of prayer for the dead. In Eucharistic Prayer II at Mass, we are called in a special way "to remember our brothers and sisters who have gone to their rest in the hope of rising again..."


Pick up envelopes on tables at Church exits or in the Parish office and list the names of deceased family members and loved ones. Those envelopes with the names of loved ones listed will be placed

on the altar and prayed for during November. Sunday, Nov 2, is the Feast of the Holy Souls and all Masses will be offered in Commemoration of all the Faitful Departed (All Souls Day).

Vocations Awareness Week November 2 - 8



John Henry Newman, who was declared a Saint by Pope Francis, was born into a prominent family in London, England, in 1801. His family did not practice any faith or religion. At the age of 15, when a high school student in Ealing, he experienced for the first time in his life a "Call" – Vocation – to follow Christ in an Evangelical Church. He later transferred to an Anglican Church and, finally ended up becoming a Roman Catholic at the age of forty in 1841. He felt called to the Catholic Priesthood and was ordained a priest in Rome in the late 1840's. He wrote a prayer for young people who are searching for their vocation. You have an excerpt from that prayer below. Newman died in 1891. He was declared a saint in 2019 and, recently, a Doctor of the Church.



"God created me to do Him some definite service; He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another.

I have my mission—I never may know it fully in this life, but I shall be told it in the next.

Somehow, I am necessary to His purposes... I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons.

He has not created me for naught."

"Ofrécelo" ya no es un cliché, sino un recordatorio para dirigir nuestra mente y corazón a Dios en momentos de dificultad.




